Twenty Second Sunday in Ordinary Time *August 29, 2021*

We are also transitioning back to a more normal schedule at St. Peter's. Events that were put on hold during the





CATECHISM CORNER BY DAVID DUNST



Catechism Corner

Prayer is always in the context of love and communion with the Most Holy Trinity. Therefore, some level of understanding of that greatest of mysteries is necessary. I have written in the past, both in this column and in my page 1 articles, about my understanding of the Blessed Trinity, but I know that I don't know fully, or totally "get it." The trouble is there are only so many ways to attempt to make sense of it, and many ways of being wrong about it, in some aspect. Theological precision is always a goal in catechesis, but the limitations of human language and understanding doom us to falling short—though especially when faced with a mystery that has eluded the greatest minds the human race has ever produced.

In short, the Holy Trinity is, at its core, unknowable. Yet we have glimpses of facets of its truth, and so we can speak on those bases, but not with utter definitude.


As the hymn says, "we own the mystery," but in the sense that we accept it as truth, though we don't have all the answers—this is one of the great, lost meanings in Catholic faith: what is mystery itself and what does it mean in the context of faith.

With all that said, let us attempt to parse what prayer is and means in light of the Most Holy (and Mysterious) Trinity.

We have said many times over that Christ is personally the model of prayer. That is, in his person, Jesus is the mystical communion of the human with the divine. So all prayer must be, at its core, "through him, with him, and in him" in order to access God the Father. It is by virtue of his sacred humanity that Jesus is the avenue by which we teach God, through the tutelage of the Holy Spirit (CCC 2664).

To add yet another woefully incomplete analogy to the heap, I'll put it this way, based on the way the Catechism reads, throughout this section on prayer: Jesus is the train station and the train, the Father is the destination, and the Holy Spirit is the engine and the rails. The sacred humanity of Christ is the vehicle, through which we can access God the Father. The Holy Spirit is the medium, by which our prayer is translated so as to reach the Father. The Father is the ultimate destination of our whole being, and by prayer we learn to invest ourselves in that All-holy presence of God.
