- Oranges, Cuties, or individual fruit cups (PLEASE, NO BANANAS)



Archbishop Hebda is asking for each parish to make their voice heard as we prepare for the Synod on Pentecost 2022. The next step, parish small groups, is a very important one, and we are hoping for robust participation from our St. Peter's community. This will only be possible if



many of you are willing to help as facilitators for the groups. Training will be provided, and the amount of time outside of the small group sessions themselves is very minimal.

St. Peter's is offering small groups Monday evenings, from 6 to 7:30 p.m., September 20 to October 25; and on Thursday mornings, from 10 to 11:30 a.m., September 23 to October 28. At least 12 to 15 facilitators are needed at each session.

## JOIN A SYNOD SMALL GROUP AT YOUR PARISH

In August of 2020, based on the information already gathered in the Prayer and Listening Events, as well as the information gathered for the Ad Limina visit with Pope Francis in January, and the results of the Disciple Marker Index, Archbishop Hebda has discerned the initial set of focus areas for the Archdiocesan Synod. Those areas will set the parameters for discussions at the deanery and parish levels:

- Forming parishes that are in the service of evangelization
- Forming missionary disciples who know Jesus's love and respond to his call
- Forming youth and young adults in and for a Church that is always young

This fall, your prayer, conversation, and feedback on priorities, within these focus areas will inform the topics selected for the Synod Assembly in June 2022.

How? Through Synod small groups, which will meet at parishes across the archdiocese this fall. Make plans now to join in this momentous process at your parish!

St. Peter's is offering small groups Monday evenings from 6 to 7:30 p.m., September 20 to October 25; and on Thursday mornings from 10 to 11:30 a.m., September 23 to October 28. There is no need to register; simply choose your preferred time of day and plan to join us.

#### **CATECHISM CORNER** BY DAVID DUNST



Corner

The Catechism makes clear that we do and should pray to Jesus the Lord. Though prayer is ultimately directed to the Father, every liturgical form and tradition addresses prayers to Christ. If we have any wonder of this, the Psalms and the New Testament—so central and integral to the worship of the Church—are full of invocations of Christ, calling him: Son of God, Word of God, Lord, Savior, Lamb of God, King, Beloved Son, Good Shepherd,

and many more (CCC 2665).

One name sums up all the other titles we bestow upon him: Jesus. Though we do not, out of deepest respect and love, speak the divine name, the Incarnation brings to us the name of God that we may invoke it. "Jesus" means "YHWH saves," and so praying "Jesus" brings forward all the fullness of the story of salvation and contains the very presence it signifies. Thus whoever invokes the name of Jesus welcomes God the Son (CCC 2666).

Recall what we have heard about keeping holy (meaning "reserved or set apart for sacred or religious purpose") the Lord's name!

Praying the holy name is the simplest means to pray always, because invoking the name of Jesus strips away every other consideration and removes the need for composing further phrases. By his Name, we call truly on him and bring his presence into our midst, occupied only with loving God, unconcerned about forming beautiful words to frame our prayer. In this simple way, every action can be transfigured in Christ Jesus (CCC 2668).

Another devotion the Catechism singles out specifically is that of the Heart of Jesus, because it is so central to his Passion and death, and is therefore central to our salvation. I would be interested to see a rationale as to why this in particular is highlighted is the Church's continual devotion and worship of Jesus (CCC 2669), but that reason is not given explicitly in the Catechism, though there are manifold titles and devotions to Our Lord that have grown very great in the life of the Church.
