

Notes from Father Nick...

As we begin this New Year, let us commit ourselves to making God first and foremost in our lives, to worshipping him on a regular basis, and of fulfilling all of his commandments. Let us especially commit yourselves to seeing the face of Christ Jesus in others, and treating them accordingly. On Tuesday of this past week the first reading for Mass was taken from 1 John 4. In it, John writes: "Beloved, let us love one another, because love is of God; everyone who loves is begotten by God and knows God. Whoever is without love does not know God, for God is love." May 2022 bring us to a deeper awareness of those words.

We are still collecting funds for our parish's involvement in the Annual Diocesan Appeal. If you have not yet made a contribution to this campaign, I encourage you to do so. Remember, all gifts are important, regardless of their amount. All gifts are a sign of your membership in the Church of the Diocese of Davenport.

If you're wanting to attend a retreat this year, you might consider Cursillo, which is defined as a "short course in Christianity." This program was developed in Spain in 1944 and since then has spread to all five continents. It has been officially recognized by the Vatican and St. Paul is considered to be its patron. I attended a Cursillo weekend in January of 2000 and have since served as a chaplain for subsequent weekends. There are several Cursillo retreats coming in the next months and I encourage you to consider attending one. A men's weekend will be held on January 20-23 and a women's weekend will be held on February 17-20. They are held in Quincy, Illinois. Tom and Esther Urban of our parish are Cursillo area representatives and if you would like more information about this opportunity to grow in your faith, please contact them or myself.

Today is the feast of the Baptism of Jesus. Although he was sinless and did not need to be baptized for the forgiveness of original sin, nonetheless he did so to unite himself completely to our humanity. This feast offers us a chance to reflect on our own baptisms and what they mean (and should mean) in our relationship with the Lord. This is also a day for parents to discuss baptism with their children. Perhaps show them pictures of their Baptism? Talk to them about their godparents? Remind them that, by blessing themselves with holy water as they enter the church, they are renewing the vows of their baptisms. I know of one person who has decided to frame his baptismal certificate, so important in his faith was that event.

St. Hilary of Poitiers, Bishop and Doctor of the Church | January 13

Born a pagan, St. Hilary (c.315 - c.367) studied philosophy and the meaning of life, eventually making his way through the bible. He became a convert and was appointed bishop of Poitiers in 353. Sometimes referred to as the Hammer of the Arians, St. Hilary defended the Nicene Creed against a popular heresy, Arianism. He was exiled to Phrygia for opposing Roman emperor Constantius II, who preferred the heresy which denies Christ's divinity. From Phyrgia St. Hilary fought with his pen, zealously writing against the heresy.

Eventually he was allowed to return to Poitiers, but did so by a circuitous route, preaching against Arianism all the way. St. Hilary was likely the first writer of hymns in the West, his writings on the Trinity, Psalms and Gospel of Matthew survive today. St. Hilary was created Doctor of the Church, a title given to those who provided important contributions to theology and doctrine, in 1851 by Pope Pius IX.


