The Gift of Our Baptism

Peace and greetings to all in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ on the Feast of

the Baptism of the Lord. Today's Gospel from St. Luke recalls the Baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist in the Jordan river. This is a very significant moment in the life of Christ, and more broadly in the story of salvation history. For the first time in human history, the three persons of the Holy Trinity are revealed together in the voice of the Father, the Baptism of the Son, and the descent of the Holy Spirit. The Baptism of Jesus, and the revelation of the Holy Trinity, is so important that it's one of the few events in the life of Christ recorded in all four Gospels. St. Luke also tells us about John's declaration that "one mightier than I is coming. I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals." (Luke 3:16) John wants to be clear with the crowds coming out to him that he is not the promised Messiah. Instead, John points to Jesus from Nazareth, who has now come to him for Baptism, not because he is a sinner, but out of obedience to his heavenly Father. In this moment. Jesus gives us the gift of Baptism and establishes it as the doorway through which men and women will come to share in the very life of God. Because of this, Baptism is one of the greatest gifts any person can ever receive. Reflecting on the Baptism of Jesus, St. Ambrose taught that "The Lord was Baptized, not to be cleansed Himself, but to cleanse the waters, so that those waters, cleansed by the flesh of Christ which knew no sin, might have the power of Baptism."

Over the years I have been privileged to witness many baptisms. It is a great honor to be present when, in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, another child is born anew into the family of God. Happiness fills the hearts of all who share in this decisive moment in the life of the one being baptized. This sacrament awakens us to the gift of new life and the promise of a hope-filled future. This is as it should be because something truly miraculous happens in the Sacrament of Baptism. The Church teaches that "Baptism not only purifies from all sins, but also makes the neophyte "a new creature," an adopted son of God, who has become a "partaker of the divine nature," member of Christ and co-heir with him, and a temple of the Holy Spirit." (CCC 1265) At Baptism, we pass from spiritual death into new life through the saving actions of the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus.

Being free from the bondage of sin, we begin the lifelong process of becoming a new creation in Christ, with the promise of eternal life for those who love him. If we stopped right there, we could probably all agree that receiving God's free gift of forgiveness, salvation, and new life might be enough. From God's perspective, however, it is not. He isn't simply interested in saving us from the darkness of sin – he has something grander in mind. In Baptism, he desires us so much that he adopts us as his very own. We are no longer orphans but truly sons and daughters of God. This is our real identity as the baptized! St. Paul describes the supernatural realities of our divine adoption in this way: "For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, "Abba Father!" it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ." (Rom. 8:14-17) Today, as we reflect on the Baptism of Jesus, let us rejoice in the gift of our own Baptism.
