God created humanity for greatness and calls each of us to continually grow



my family. These encounters enabled me to consider the idea of becoming a priest. Around the same time, my grandfather who was educated by the missionaries that came to India, would share lots of stories about number of priests that were doing God's holy work. These stories nurtured my desire to become a priest. I was at the ordination of uncles, who were ordained priests when I was only 4-yearold. My mom reminds me that I told her on that day, that someday I would become a priest like them. As I grew up, I witnessed other people in my family and extended family who made their profession as religious nuns and priests. This further strengthened my desire to become a priest after the model of Jesus Christ. As I grew older, I understood the magnitude of the work done by the missionaries that came

to India, which inspired me to become a missionary to go to other countries where there is a need for priests. I spent a number of years pursuing this desire to be a missionary. It was during my final year of college that I received a call from the Archdiocese of Kansas City in Kansas. I was invited to the Archdiocese for a visit which helped me to see and know more about its people.

During my visit, I felt at home and at peace. I applied and was accepted as a seminarian for the Archdiocese of Kansas City in Kansas in 2015. I began my seminary studies at Kenrick Glennon Seminary. I entered the Pre-Theology program and graduated with Bachelor's in philosophy on 13th May 2017. I entered the theology program in August 2017, and I was ordained a deacon on 22nd May 2021. I am looking forward to being ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Kansas City in Kansas on 28th May 2022. It is a blessing to be called by God and the Archbishop to serve here in the Archdiocese. I am excited to serve the people of the Archdiocese who have accepted me as their own. This diocese is my home, and I am blessed to call it home. In response to many requests about my likes, I'd like to list a few here. I love playing table-tennis (ping-pong), I enjoy fishing and spending time near water. I love cooking. Although I am very good at preparing Indian food, I have been expanding my cooking skills in other cuisines as well. I have been told that I can be funny! I love learning new things and meeting new people.

In closing, I'd like to request you to continue your prayers for me as I approach a huge mile stone and as I begin this new chapter as a priest. That I may dedicate myself completely and freely to the service of Christ and his Church here in the Archdiocese. Please know that my prayers are with you. May God's graces be with you, may our Blessed Mother guide you and may St. Joseph guard and protect you.

Saint of the Week, St. Joan of Arc Feast Day is May 30



St. Joan of Arc (1412 – 1431) has had her story told throughout history through many books, movies and plays. She was born in the village of Domrémy, near the province of Lorraine, to a French peasant family. At a young age, she began to experience visions and voices, which were later identified to be of St. Michael, St. Catherine of Alexandria, and St. Margaret of Antioch. At the age of 13, all three saints told her that she was to drive the English from French territory, and that she must bring the Dauphin to Reims for his coronation. Trusting in God, she did as she was

told. During the Hundred Years War, St. Joan of Arc led French troops against the English and recaptured the cities of Orléans and Troyes. Captured near Compiegne the following year, she was sold to the English and placed on trial for heresy and witchcraft, eventually being found guilty and burned at the stake in Rouen.

St. Joan of Arc was canonized by Pope Benedict XV on May 16, 1920, and is the patron saint of military members.

Waiting to receive a blessing from a new priest is a longstanding ordination day tradition. After Mass, the church members stand in line and receive a first blessing. It is always a very prayerful and joyful experience to receive a First Blessing from a newly or-



dained priest. It is an opportunity for the faithful to gain a plenary indulgence and very special graces!

2nd Tuesday of the Month


Every second Tuesday of the month, Sacred Heart helps feed the hungry through the **St. Mary's Food Kitchen**.
