Friendship is Important for Children

As our kids have been back in the classrooms, some have had a connection with their friends, and some are having feelings of rejection. The pandemic has offered some new challenges for maintaining friendships.

Friendship is important as it can lead us toward growth, connection, and personal improvement. On the other hand, however, it can lead us toward emotional pain, and distractions if we are not careful with those we choose to be our friends. Friends influence our children within three core needs:

- A Sense of Belonging
 Ask, "Do you feel like you belong, or that you have to find ways to fit in with your friends?' In other words, "Are you stressed about what they think of you? Or are you at peace when you're hanging out with them?"
- 2. A Sense of Worth– You can ask, "Do your friends make you feel like you're a valuable person to them? Or are you constantly guessing whether they really care about you and your friendship."
- 3. A Sense of Competence- You can ask, "Do your friends build you up and encourage you, or do they constantly put you down?"

These three areas help a child discover their identity and will form a foundation for their identity and character. Ask your child what they like about this friend or these friends. Every relationship has some "give and take." One of the reasons why friendship is important is that, as friends, our kids can contribute to the growth and encouragement of their friends as well. If children do not form healthy friendships in their formative years, the odds of having relationship issues later in life significantly increase. Focus on the Family
