





#### Deacon's Corner

#### Seven Foundational Principles of Faith - Chapter I

Over the next seven weeks we will look together at seven principles that guide our faith. The first principle is the very beginning. Creation. "In the beginning, when God created the heavens and the earth". Our belief that God created the world answers the fundamental questions that humans have asked throughout history. "Where do we come from? How did we get here? What is our origin?"

There has been an ongoing debate in modern times between creationists and evolutionists. Scientific evidence seems to point to the earth being 4.5 billion years old and the universe being 14 billion years old. Scientists themselves will say that these are estimates and new discoveries may change this estimates. Strict creationists date the earth being 6000 years old based on biblical interpretation. As Catholics we don't have to take a side in this debate. Regardless of the age of the universe we believe that "It is not only a question of knowing when and how the universe arose physically, or when man appeared, but rather of discovering the meaning of such an origin: is the universe governed by chance, blind fate, anonymous necessity, or by a transcendent, intelligent, and good Being called "God"? (CCC 284). As Catholics we believe in the transcendent, intelligent and good Being called God. And as we take an in depth look at the universe, we can see revealed the "Glory of God". One rough estimate is there are one septillion stars in the observable universe. (1 with 24 zeros after it). And no one knows the size of the universe. We cannot see the end. And if we go the other way and look at our world under a microscope we see more great mystery. Although quarks are the smallest known entity they have not been able to be measured. An electron is 1 with 16 zeros before it or a billionth of a billionth of a centimeter. And God has ordered this universe from the smallest to the largest to reveal his glory. I will always remember a film I watched in the 1980s at the Museum of Science and Industry in Chicago called the "Powers of Ten" which you can now see on YouTube. It is a great testimony to the beauty and magnitude of creation. I encourage you to watch it and let me know what you think. The more we research and study the world around us, the more it is confirmed that "The heavens declare the glory of God"!
