We remember the many people around the world who continue to suffer from the COVID virus. Please also remember the many members of our parish who are in nursing homes, assisted living, or homebound.




Refugee Cash Collection

Deacon's Corner

Seven Foundational Principles of Faith - Chapter II

Over these next weeks we are looking at seven principles that guide our faith. We discussed the first principle last week. We believe that God created all people and all things. This week we look at the second principle. This awesome God, who created all things, loves us and calls us good. "God looked at everything he had made, and he found it very good." (Gen 1: 31) God created each individual person that ever existed out of love, with love, for love, in love, to love.

We have recently celebrated Christmas and hopefully you have had time to reflect on the image of the newborn Christ child lying in a manger. One word that was in many of our scriptures recently is the word "behold". The angel cried out to the shepherds to "behold" the child lying in the manger. This simple image, of a newborn child, is both glorious and mysterious. And we can hardly fathom what it means that almighty God humbled himself to share in our humanity so we could partake of his divinity.

One of the spiritual exercises of St. Ignatius is to take some time to reflect on God's love for us. And one particular encouragement is to "Behold God, beholding you". Simply think of God, beholding you as a new parent beholds their newborn child. "Behold God, beholding you" and hear God speaking to you, that you are good, and beloved.

St. Augustine said, "The source of man's love for God can only be found in the fact that God loved him first". Your experience, and awareness, and belief in the incredible awesome love of God, for you personally, is the wellspring out of which your love flows. The more you know God's love the more you will be able to love others. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life". (John 3:16)




Emergency's During Fr. Tony's Vacation:
