Deacon's Corner

Seven Foundational Principles of Faith - Chapter III

Over these next weeks we are looking at seven principles that guide our faith. We previously discussed the first two principles. We believe that God created us, loves us and calls us very good. This week we look at the third principle. Separation from God. The original plan was for us to live in paradise. A state of pure justice. Where there is no suffering, no pain, no death, no shame. But when God created us, he also gave us a free will. He gave us the great and profound ability to make decisions about life. He gave us the ability to choose to listen to God and follow his commands or to not follow his commands.


He commanded Adam and Eve to not eat of the tree of knowledge of good and bad. But after being tempted and deceived by the devil they chose to disregard God's command. They chose to separate themselves from God. This is the very nature of sin. With full and free consent, turning away from God. Adam and Eve focused on themselves and their desires. They put their faith in the deceiver, rather than in the words of God.

Sin entered the world through this decision to choose themselves over God and his plan. Through the Fall of Adam and Eve, the world was forever changed. (The ultimate act of humans which has impacted our climate.) Further on in Genesis, after Adam and Eve became aware of their sinful condition, they now were ashamed, and the beauty and harmony of God's creation was broken. The impact of this decision by Adam and Eve we call "Original Sin." This separation from God, deprives us of the holiness and righteousness that were present at creation. The unity of God they experienced, walking with God in the cool of the day would be no more.

How does this original sin impact us in 2022? We did not "commit" original sin. We inherited this state of being. Not through our personal sin or decision. But this separation from God has created a deep wound within all humanity. Sin divides us, it clouds our thinking, and we are inclined to sin, rather than to do good. This is called concupiscence. We only need to read the headlines to see the darkness of humanity. And we only need to look into our own hearts to see where we have turned our backs on a loving God, to follow our own selfish desires.

If you have wondered why there is so much suffering in the world you now have the answer. It is because humanity has chosen to turn away from God, to not follow God and his commands. We have used our free will for our own selfish desires. One example of this is food. God has provided the knowledge and capacity for humanity to provide enough food many times over for all the world. But because of humanity's greed and selfishness, and wars and internal conflicts, over 15,000 people will die of hunger today. This is only one example of many. Violent crimes, sex trafficking, abuse, assaults, abortion, and on and on. These are the results of a fallen humanity. A humanity without God. Yes, we have abandoned God. But fortunately, God has not abandoned us. And we have the opportunity each day to turn to God and choose to follow God again.




Praying with the Pope For true human fraternity
