

Embolden us to be a source of hope and light.



Bobby LeBlanc 26 years at STA

When I first came to STA I lived in Cardinal House, an apartment building south of the church. There are many stories from that experience! All three priests lived on the first floor, the pastor, associate, and Fr. Supple. When I walked over to the church or to my car I had to walk past Fr. Supple's apartment



windows. If I saw him sitting in his living room I might stop and visit if he didn't look busy. On one of my first such stops I saw he was watching college football one Saturday afternoon. I knocked on his door and he invited me in. He offered a chair to watch the Notre Dame football game and a drink of Scotch. I told James that I was not a fan of Notre Dame! He gave me a devilish smile and said, "Bobby you are still welcome to watch the game, but now you can't drink my Scotch!" (he later found out that I didn't like Scotch either, but his Irish whiskey was pretty good!) We were friends from that time on. I fondly remember the many trips to Aunt Maude's where we would go for lunch and I would treat him to his favorite menu item there: French Onion Soup and he would treat me to interesting conversation and great laughs!

Social Justice Grants


Applications Due April 1, 2022




