In the gospel reading for the Easter Vigil the holy women have the first encounter with the possibility of the resurrection. The women find the stone rolled away, the body of Jesus gone, the tomb empty. What is the first thing they do? "They returned from the tomb and announced all these things to the eleven and to all the others." They encountered something amazing at the tomb and they are so excited they go to tell others, "you gotta see this!"

Have you ever had the experience where you haven't seen or experienced something, a movie or place or sporting event, and someone around you freaks out and says, "what!? You haven't seen Star Wars!" or "You've never been to a game in Jack Trice Stadium!" or "You've never played disk golf!?" "You gotta see this!" Or, "you gotta experience this!" This reaction kind of grinds my gears even though I am sometimes guilty of it myself. But here is my big question. Why don't we get this excited about Christ? Why don't we get this excited about the resurrection? Why don't we react this way to our faith?

There are people we encounter everyday who may not know of the healing power for Christ, who may not know how loved they are, who may not know they are a beloved daughter or son of God. Do reach out with excitement saying, "you gotta experience this!" I remember my first time experiencing Hilton Magic. It was with priest friends who actually bought me a ticket and accompanied me to experience the awesomeness. I remember when my now sister-in-law was dating my brother and she had never seen any of the Star Wars. He sat down with her and watched each of the movies so she could experience the magic of a long time ago in a galaxy far, far away.

When we have experienced something incredible, we want to tell everyone about it and we want them to experience. Is this true with our faith. We do not have to look far to find people suffering, starving and struggling without Christ. Are we willing to reach out to them and say, "Hey, come with me, you gotta experience this!"



The Paschal Candle

The flame of the Easter candle symbolizes Christ's light, and his presence in the midst of his people. The Easter candle is referred to as the Paschal candle. The term "paschal" comes from the word *pesach*, which in Hebrew means Passover.

This tall white candle will display several symbols: The cross is always a central symbol, most clearly identifying it as the paschal candle; The Greek letters alpha and omega signify that God is the beginning and the end; The current

year represents God's presence here and now in the midst of the gathered worshipers; Five grains of incense are embedded in the candle during the Easter Vigil to represent the five wounds of Jesus.

At the start of the Easter Vigil, a "New Fire" is lit and blessed. The Easter candle is the first candle to be lit with a flame from this sacred fire, representing the light of Christ coming into the world. This represents the risen Christ, as a symbol of light (life) dispelling darkness (death). The Easter candle that leads the procession into the church at the Easter Vigil becomes a dominant symbol for the season. So big is this message of resurrection and redemption that it takes fifty days to celebrate it. The Easter candle burns in our churches during those seven weeks, proclaiming the Risen Christ, the Light of the world.

The Easter candle appears in our liturgy on two other very significant occasions: baptisms and funerals.

Whenever infants are baptized, we light the Easter candle. Baptism incorporates us into the body of Christ and gives us a share in his resurrection. Whenever the baptismal waters are poured, the Easter candle burns bright. Parents and godparents light a baptismal candle from the Easter candle. They accept the responsibility of keeping the flame of faith alive in the heart of the newly baptized.

We also light the Easter candle at funerals. Several images of baptism reappear at the funeral: the sprinkling with holy water, the placing of a white pall (like a white garment) over the casket and the lighting of the Easter candle. Christ rose from the dead so that we too might pass from death to life. Every death reminds us of Easter. And every Easter gives us hope that death is not the end, but the passage from darkness to eternal light.


