### First Reading


Isaiah was called to be a prophet to bring justice and freedom to those suffering, to be a “light for the nations.” How do you see yourself serving others in need in your life?

**Baptism of the Lord**

As the Church celebrates the Baptism of the Lord, we are reminded of our own baptism and our vocation to holiness. We live our baptism and grow in holiness by fulfilling the parish mission statement – being centered in the Eucharist while seeking to know Jesus better, follow him more closely, and share him more generously.

On January 4, the Church celebrated the feast day of Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton, the first native born American to be canonized a saint. Mother Seton offered encouraging words on the vocation of holiness to the Sisters in her community. She wrote:

“I will tell you what is my own great help. I once read or heard that an interior life means but the continuation of our Savior’s life in us; that the great object of all his mysteries is to merit for us the grace of his interior life and communicate it to us, it being the end of his mission to lead us into the sweet land of promise, a life of constant union with himself. And what was the first rule of our dear Savior’s life? You know it was to do his Father’s will. Well, then, the first end I propose in our daily work is to do the will of God; secondly, to do it in the manner he wills; and thirdly, to do it because it is his will.”

The keys to holiness proposed by this great saint are as applicable to us today as they were to the Sisters 200 years ago.

I offer a special encouragement to parents, who, at the baptism of your children, promised to be the first and best teachers of your children in the ways of faith. I invite you to sit down with your children, show them the pictures of their baptism, and remind them of the promises you made to God. May God bless you with the grace to fulfill those promises.

The Baptism of the Lord concludes the Christmas season. I offer my thanks to all who shared your time and talent to make our Christmas celebrations prayerful and joyful. I am also grateful to all who shared your financial resources with the parish. Generous and joyful stewardship of time, talent and treasure is central to Christian discipleship and a concrete response to our baptism.



### 2020-2021 PREPARATION FOR EUCHARIST AND RECONCILIATION



### SACRAMENTS FOR SENIORS

Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) recognizes that residents of long-term care have spiritual and emotional needs, not just physical. Even if there is a case of COVID-19 in the facility, clergy and pastoral caregivers may be admitted under the title of "healthcare worker" or "compassionate care," provided that they have not been recently exposed to COVID-19 and abide by stringent safety requirements.

The patient or the patient's advocate, however, must request the visit. If a facility will not allow such access, you may wish to contact the Minnesota ombudsman's office, (651) 431-2553. It has doubled its staff and is available to help advocate.
