

## REFLECT

### First Reading

We hear today part of the speech that Peter delivered in the household of Cornelius, a centurion and Gentile-believer in Christ. Peter bore witness to his experiences with Jesus, including Jesus' resurrection. To whom do you bear witness to your faith in the resurrected Jesus?

### Second Reading

Paul urges the Colossians to remain focused on Jesus' resurrection, ascension, and final return—to “seek what is above.” What do you find appealing in this spiritual exercise?

### Gospel Reading

Mark's account of Jesus' resurrection focuses on the women's discovery of the empty tomb. In fact, Jesus risen from the tomb is the original ending of the Gospel of Mark. Why do you think Mark would end his Gospel with the empty tomb?

## Reflections from Small Catholic Communities

I've always been a talker and I enjoy getting to know others in a variety of situations. During the pandemic, my daily walk has introduced me to neighbors I've only seen driving into their garages, children whose bikes I can now readily recognize, and runners whose short wave encourages me to walk that extra half-mile. I have found these encounters deeply rewarding, even in the minimal time spent connecting. Soon I'll be able to invite these pandemic-pals into my front yard for a glass of lemonade or a look at the garden. I can't wait.

The pandemic has also presented an array of opportunities to engage with parishioners who, just like my neighbors, I have seen and recognized, but never have taken the time to stop to reap the treasure that their particular life story offers. Before ZOOM took over my life, I had been part of many small groups. The transition to online conversations took some patience (not only for me, but for those who kept reminding me *you're on mute!*) but the connection to people I would never have met otherwise was just the same as it has been in person. I don't think I'm alone in finding myself among friends and family who think largely the same way I do. In these small groups I have the chance to build relationships with people outside that circle of predictability, whose life experience and spiritual wisdom surprises and delights. Following a gathering, I find myself thinking back on a conversation, remembering a point made or a story told and say a quick prayer of gratitude to God for having placed this person in my life. All week these little reminders of our connection touch my routine. St. Mary's offers a variety of small group settings, from retreats to justice to learning about our faith tradition. For me, these small groups have opened a door to deepening my own spiritual life. I praise God for that gift.

Today’s great Solemnity of Easter encourages us: we will not let the message be silenced; we will not fail to express our faith in Jesus, for he has risen from the dead and we who have been baptized into his life and death are invited to share in his resurrection. Alleluia!

Our mission as a parish is to know, follow and share Jesus, to witness to his love, to announce the Good News. The parish is blessed by so many who live the mission in their daily lives and by serving others in the community. Unfortunately, a great number of these people have been away from active ministry because of COVID-19. I look forward to their return as vaccinations increase. I am very grateful for those who have been able to serve at the daily and Sunday Masses, funerals, weddings, and other liturgies. Your love for God and neighbor has allowed us to welcome people to the church safely and to broadcast the Mass to those at home. On behalf of all the parishioners, thank you for your efforts.

I also want to publicly thank the staff of St. Mary of the Lake. This past year has caused everyone to reevaluate their particular ministry, find new ways to accomplish their mission, and serve in ways not always included in their job descriptions. We have not always done this perfectly, but it is not from lack of trying. Our goals are to serve God and to serve you, the people of God, and to help all of us fulfill our mission to know Jesus more intimately, follow him more closely and share him more generously. May God continue to bless and guide our work.

Finally, I offer my thanks to all of you, the people of St. Mary of the Lake. Your faith is inspiring. Though this Lent has been better than last year’s, many challenges and disappointments continue. Despite these obstacles, you remain engaged, generous, and grateful. Your words and actions confess your belief that God wins. That God always wins. Thank you.

**Stimulus Payments – An opportunity for extra almsgiving?**  
 President Biden signed into law the American Rescue Plan, aimed at easing the economic impact of the virus. A portion of the legislation includes up to \$1,400-per-person stimulus payments that will be sent to about 90% of American households. Many people need these funds to pay their bills. They have lost their job or had work hours reduced. These funds will be used to make their rent or mortgage payment, buy groceries, and pay medical bills. Other people's economic situation has not been as significantly impacted by the virus and do not need these funds. 

# WELCOME RONNIE!


