Second Reading



Maintenance Projects (Part I of II)

In last weekend’s homily, I announced that repairs are needed at the Parish Life Center and the church. My bulletin article for this week offers details, context and cost for the repairs at the Parish Life Center. Next week’s article will describe the work at the church. I will mail a letter with this information to every registered family, along with an invitation for you to invest in these projects.

The Parish Life Center (PLC) is the result of several building projects over the years, including the original school (1914), an addition to the school (1951), the original parish offices (1968), and the renovation/expansion of the Parish Life Center (2004). **The PLC has 14 different sections of roof.** This summer, we will be replacing three of those sections and doing preventative maintenance on several other sections. The cost of this summer’s roof work is \$102,000. (The other roofs are scheduled for replacement over the next 3-5 years).

Several sections of the PLC have air conditioning. (Other areas of the building had the duct work for air conditioning installed in 2004, but we could not afford the air conditioning units). We will be replacing three air conditioning units at a cost of \$157,000 plus the electrical upgrade necessary for the new units.

Finally, we will complete some work in Kohler Hall and around the grounds of the PLC. We also have joint projects with Frassati Catholic Academy, including the expansion of the playground.

The total cost for this year’s projects at the Parish Life Center are \$350,000. Next week, I will detail the repairs and improvements at the church, which are estimated to be \$250,000. Therefore, the total cost for this summer’s work is \$600,000. I encourage those who are able to make a gift to the projects, in addition to your regular financial stewardship that funds the ministries of the parish.

Estate Gift

Last summer, I announced that the parish would be receiving an estate gift of \$20,000. That gift arrived last week and has been designated for this summer’s repair projects. I am grateful to the donor, who was not a member of the parish, but witnessed how the parish played an important role in the life of relatives who were members of St. Mary of the Lake. I encourage everyone to have an estate plan and to include St. Mary of the Lake in that plan, allowing you to impact future generations of parishioners.


1. What can we do to make parishes more welcoming and accessible?
