

♦♦ A MESSAGE FROM FATHER TALBOT ♦♦

Two weeks ago, I announced that we would be making repairs at the Parish Life Center and the church this summer. In last week's bulletin, I described the planned repairs at the PLC, which include replacement of three air conditioning units, three sections of roof, and improvements in Kohler Hall. The PLC repairs will cost \$350,000. This week, I outline some of the repairs at the church, which will cost \$250,000.

Repairs to interior of church: The walls in the main church, the Notre Dame chapel and the Blessed Sacrament chapel have several large cracks, the result of settling. They also have water damage in several spots. The cracks and the water damage will be patched and sanded.

Painting: Once the walls have been repaired, the painting will begin. We will be using off-white colors to the walls in the church, bringing additional warmth to the space. The front wall directly behind the sanctuary will have a different color and design to draw our attention to the altar.

Pews: The painting in the church requires scaffolding, which requires that we remove the pews. Since we are removing the pews, we will take this opportunity to strip, repair, sand, and re-stain the pews, which are original to the 1988 renovation. We will be using a slightly darker stain than the current shade.

Kneelers: The kneelers are more than 30 years old. Some of them are broken and beyond repair. We also have several pews in which kneelers were never installed. We will be replacing all the kneelers with a padded aluminum kneeler. The front pews in each section will not have kneelers, as is our current setup.

Tile: The gray tile around the baptismal font and in the sanctuary was installed during the 1988 renovation. Those areas will be redone in a warmer color and style that complements the color of the walls and the pews.

Acoustical Tiles: We will be replacing the acoustical tiles attached to the walls around the main body of the church. These tiles were installed in the 1988 renovation and are detaching from the wall. The technology of acoustical tiles has improved over the past 30 years, which should improve the sound and the aesthetics in the church.

Tabernacle in the sanctuary: As I mentioned in my homily last weekend, Archbishop Hebda has given us permission to add a tabernacle to the sanctuary. The design details of the tabernacle and the altar on which the tabernacle will sit are still being decided, though both will be simple and not overshadow the altar, which should always be the focus of the church.

The total cost of repairs for this summer at the PLC and the church are approximately \$600,000. We hope to raise more than that amount, so that we can create a reserve fund for future repairs.

Every registered family will soon receive a letter from me, outlining the repairs and encouraging your support. Please return your gift in the envelope enclosed with the letter or visit the parish website to make an online gift. Please contact Mary Scherping in the parish office should you want to make your gift by donating stock.

I am grateful for your generous stewardship to this important initiative. I will keep you advised as we move along.


