


Hope for the Journey Home Welcomes Back Volunteers

Volunteers are needed to assist with the evening meal preparation and serving dinner and serving as overnight hosts. We are excited to see our previous volunteers and new ones too. We will continue to seek meal donations until we replace our cook in the early fall. All of our weeks are currently open to all volunteers. - **Prepare:** Be prepared for the weekly lessons. Arrive on time and welcome members.
- **(Facilitators) Encourage:** Encourage and joyfully support the members as you guide the discussion. Let them know you care about them and value their input. Be a good listener.
- **(Scribes) Document:** Be attentive to the discussion and document the group's feedback on the focus areas, as directed by the Synod small group materials.

♦♦ A MESSAGE FROM FATHER TALBOT ♦♦

Fourth of July - Independence Day - Unalienable Rights

"We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness."

These powerful words from the Declaration of Independence make clear that God and not the state is the source of our Rights and that these rights are "unalienable", meaning that no one and no state has the right to take those rights away from the human person without due process of law. Exercising our rights has limits, otherwise there would be anarchy. However, we must hold fast to the fundamental truth of our nation and our Church that the human person is created to be free and to pursue the good, including the highest good, which is God.

Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul – Apostles of Freedom

On June 29, the Church celebrated the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. In his homily for this great feast, Pope Francis referred to Peter and Paul as "apostles and ministers of freedom for others" who were able to assume that role only because they had been set free by Jesus. Through his unconditional love, the Lord had freed Peter "from his sense of inadequacy and his bitter experience of failure" and gave him the keys to free others from whatever chained them. The Lord freed Paul from slavery to self and hardness of heart by helping him to recognize strength in weakness. The Holy Father called the baptized to set free the power of the Gospel, by allowing ourselves to be freed over and over again through our encounter with the Risen Lord.

Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati - Feast Day is July 4

Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati is the patron of our school. He died on July 4, 1925 at the age of 24. Blessed Giorgio was chosen as the patron of our school because he exercised his God-given freedom so well and in so many life-giving ways. He loved God and his family and friends, worked hard at his studies, helped the sick and the poor, enjoyed sports and the outdoors, and possessed a playful and mischievous sense of humor. He is a wonderful role model for all of us, especially our young people, demonstrating that holiness and happiness are intimately connected and that the proper use of our freedom leads to a life lived well.


