


Saint of the Week

St. John Paul II was born Karol Wojtyla in the small Polish town of Wadowice. During World War II, when the Nazis invaded Poland, Karol secretly studied for the priesthood in an underground seminary. He was ordained to the priesthood in 1946, appointed Archbishop of Krakow in 1964 and three years later he was made a cardinal. In 1978, he was elected the 264th pope where he took the name John Paul II.

St. John Paul II made evangelization a key part of his papacy and made pastoral visits to all parts of the world. In 1981, he was shot twice in an assassination attempt. Following Jesus' example of compassion, he later met with his would-be assassin in his prison cell, where he forgave him for what he had done.

St. John Paul II was well-known to be an active sportsman throughout his life, hiking and skiing well into his 60s. In 1992, his health began to decline and it was later discovered that he suffered from Parkinson's Disease, a degenerative disorder of the central nervous system.

Near the end of his papacy, it became difficult for him to speak and his poor health and physical suffering made public appearances difficult. Still, he continued his pastoral work. He died April 2, 2005 and he was declared blessed on May 1, 2011. He was canonized on April 27, 2014.



Respect Life Month – COVID-19

In last weekend’s homily, I asked everyone to pray for wisdom as we, as individuals and as a parish, deal with COVID-19 and the issues that come with it. Respect for life calls us to continue following the protocols that help protect against the spread of the virus, as well as cold and flu. Those who attend Mass but would like additional distance may sit in the St. Joseph Room. Mass will be projected on the screen and Holy Communion will be brought to you.

- Get vaccinated, as able.
- Masks are highly recommended at Mass, but not required.
- Masks are required when you visit the Parish Life Center
- Wash hands frequently
- Maintain social distance
- Stay away from poorly ventilated areas
- Monitor your health daily
- Catch your cough or sneeze in a tissue not your hand
- Stay home if you do not feel well and keep your children home from school and activities if they have symptoms.
- Please get tested if you have any symptoms. People with symptoms have gone to work and weddings and other public events thinking they only have a cold. They discover after the fact that they have COVID and have exposed many others to the virus.
- At Mass during the Our Father, please do not hold hands with those outside your household. At the Sign of Peace, we will continue to acknowledge one another with words or a simple sign rather than shaking hands.

World Mission Sunday (October 23-24)

Haiti Earthquake Relief and Ongoing Support of the Cecelia Duffy School

Your generous response to the recent second collection for earthquake relief for Haiti allowed us to send a check in the amount of \$25,000 to Sr. Evelynne via Reiser Relief. Fortunately, the well-constructed school and care center in Marfranc sustained very little damage in the earthquake and subsequent tropical storm. However, two older buildings on the campus were damaged, as well as many homes in the Marfranc area. Your financial support allows Sr. Evelynne to make repairs to the campus and to help families get their homes and lives back in order.

The earthquake relief funds are separate from and in addition to the ongoing support we provide for the children attending the Cecelia Duffy School. Sr. Evelynne recently reported the very good news that the number of students attending the school continues to grow. For the 2021-2022 school year, we will send a check for \$30,000 to cover the expenses of books, tuition and a hot meal each day for every student. We will take a special collection to support World Mission Sunday & Haiti on the weekend of October 23-24. You can make a gift to support these efforts with a check made payable to St. Mary of the Lake, with the notation of “Mission” or “Haiti” in the memo line. Those with envelopes should use your World Mission envelope.

WEEKEND MASSES

New data suggests that an emerging variant, the Delta variant, is different than past versions of the virus and spreads about twice as easily from one person to another. With the Delta variant, fully vaccinated people may be able to pass the disease to others. However, the vaccines still work. Fully vaccinated people are less likely to get infected, and if a vaccinated person gets infected, the illness will likely be mild. The vaccine also greatly reduces the chance of hospitalization and death.

Because the Delta variant of COVID-19 is shown to spread more easily, **the MDH and CDC recommend everyone, both fully vaccinated and unvaccinated, wear a mask in public, indoor settings in areas with substantial or high transmission.** Since Ramsey County is an area of substantial and increasing transmission, wearing a mask at Mass is recommended. If you want to attend Mass and you are not ready to be in a crowd, please see an usher and we will find a place for you to sit.
