ADVENT

What is Advent and why is it very important to us as Catholics?

Happy New Year! No, it is not January 1! The liturgical year does not match New Year's Day, the beginning of the calendar year, nor July 1, the beginning of the fiscal year for many organizations. The Church year is distinctive. It always begins on the first Sunday of Advent, and with it comes a shift in the cycle of readings. The feast of Christ the King signaled the end of Ordinary Time.

Advent is the four-week liturgical season that precedes Christmas. The term "Advent" is derived from the Latin word *adventus* which means "coming," and it focuses not only on the past coming of Jesus on the first Christmas; but also on the present coming of Jesus in the gospels, the sacraments, other people, prayer, love, truth, and personal experience; and the future coming of Jesus at the Second or Final Coming at the end of the world, the Parousia or the Last Judgment.

Advent is not Lent or a miniature version of Lent. In fact, the two seasons are extremely different. Advent stresses hope and joy, Lent stresses penance and sorrow; Advent emphasizes what we need to add to our lives (e.g., grace, light, joy), while Lent emphasizes what we need to remove (i.e., sin); Advent lasts for four Sundays and 28 days, Lent lasts for six Sundays and forty days; Advent is a liturgical season, Lent is an ascetical season (i.e., fasting, almsgiving, prayer, acts of charity); Advent stresses preparation with festivity, Lent stresses preparation with sackcloth and ashes; Advent features the prophet Isaiah, Lent features the prophet Jeremiah.

The main saint of Advent is John the Baptist. He is "the prophet of the Most High" (Lk 1:76), the immediate forerunner of Jesus, and the link between the Old Testament prophets and Jesus himself. His story is recounted on the Second and Third Sundays of Advent. The Baptist was the voice crying out in the desert, "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths" (Is 40:3; Mt 3:3), which is what we are called to do during this holy season. He also directed peoples' attention from himself to Jesus and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God" (Jn 1:29,36), and made one of the momentous statements in the gospels as he declared, "He [Jesus] must increase; I must decrease" (Jn 3:30). If we hope to have a spiritually profitable Advent, we, like the Baptist, must diminish, while Jesus increases in power and brilliance in our lives.

All: Amen.



The First Week of Advent

One candle is lit.

Leader:

Heavenly Father, as we begin this Advent, give light to our eyes and peace to our hearts. May the Lord find us watching and waiting in joy when He comes. We pray in Jesus' name.

All: Amen.

OUR PEOPLE



In 1973 a young man left northern Illinois to attend Hamline University. A year later a young woman, also from Illinois, took the same journey, heading to St. Catherine University. They met, married, became elementary school teachers, moved to Roseville, raised two children and joined Saint Rose in 1986.

Meet Tim and MaryEllen Mieux, now retired teachers and active members of the Parish community.

MaryEllen is an Eucharistic minister captain and the lead coordinator for funeral luncheons. “As lead coordinator, I enjoy working with a wonderful team of compassionate individuals who provide a caring presence for families and friends dealing with the death of a loved one. What a special ministry offering the gift of time and service.” She has been on the Parish Council, taught religious education and an event volunteer. Tim has been a cross bearer and an on-call money collector at Mass.

When MaryEllen became a Eucharistic minister she was one of the youngest to be asked. “It was such an honor,” she says. “A beautiful, rewarding ministry. Spiritually it has brought me closer to God.”

Over the years MaryEllen has watched families grow and enjoyed seeing children return as adults to the parish on holidays. “Such a wonderful experience to see them back at their community church. This parish and its members will always hold a special place in my heart.”

Other things to know about Tim and MaryEllen:

- Tim was an associate professor in the Education Department and head men’s basketball coach at Hamline for 13 years, earning MIAC Coach of the Year honors in 1985. He played basketball (made 59 consecutive free throws) and baseball at Hamline and was inducted into the school’s athletic hall of fame in 2001 (he is also a charter member of the Antioch (IL) High School hall of fame). He retired five years ago as a physical education teacher in the Anoka-Hennepin School District.
- MaryEllen grew up in the Chicago area. She retired in 2012 after 34 years as an elementary teacher in the White Bear Lake School District (2010 Distinguished Educator Award). MaryEllen was named 2006 Junior Achievement Elementary Teacher of the Year. She is on the district’s educational foundation board of directors. Coincidentally, in 1978 MaryEllen did her student teaching at St. Rose School (kindergarten).
- Daughter Katie, who earned a Doctor of Pharmacy degree from Drake University, is a System Director at North Carolina’s Wake Forest University Baptist Health. Son David, a graduate of St. John’s University, is activities director at Williston (ND) High School. Both participated in the Saint Rose Religious Education program and the Children’s Choir.



CAMPAIGN UPDATE



As of the end of October 2020, of the **\$1,394,097** pledged, we have collected **\$888,522**.

So far we have contributed \$300,000 to our endowments, allocated \$117,025 toward capital campaign expenses, with an additional \$2,610 in postage for a total of **\$692,297**. This total includes \$224,333 spent so far on the school preschool initiative, and \$8,228 on improvements to the Adoration Chapel, and \$42,711 on the parking lot.

Ways to help those in need

As you are all aware we in unprecedented times. The hardships many are facing today is heartbreaking. However, where sadness and hardship abounds charity and love abound all the more. If you are looking for ways to give back to the less fortunate during this Advent season, here are a few options. The first way to consider is by volunteering or donating directly to the multiple non-profit organizations in the local area. To name a few: Keystone Community Services, Catholic Charities, and Salvation Army. Each of these organizations is looking for volunteers and financial contributions to continue their mission of serving those in need.

Two of the many ways you could assist directly at Saint Rose of Lima is through the Community I have the opportunity to meet, listen to, pray with and accompany many in the Parish and local community facing various hardships. I feel so Blessed to have the opportunity and privilege to do so. I have learned so very much from those facing hardships. Their faith, perseverance and hope amidst much adversity is inspiring. However, we need your help to continue to do so! Two tangible ways you could assist: 1. Join me in accompanying those facing hardships through the “Community Outreach and Assistance Ministry” by helping those in need get connected with charitable organizations that can assist them. We would provide you with an extensive list of community resources. 2. Donating to the Parish Caritas Fund – which helps out in multiple ways – rental expenses, moving expenses, application fees, purchasing food for the hungry, etc. Unfortunately, many of those I meet with can’t get assistance through the County for various reasons.

A couple other ways to assist at Saint Rose are:

1. St. Rose of Lima’s “Giving Tree”
2. Volunteering with or donating to the Parish Loaves and Fishes team – which purchases food (reimbursed through the Parish), cooks the food and makes to-go containers (due to COVID) once a month..
3. Meals on Wheels – deliver meals to the homebound.
4. Homebound Ministry – Visit, call and help with misc. tasks for the Homebound Parishioners.
5. Prayer Line - pray for those facing hardships.
6. Prayer Shawl and Quilting Ministries – make hand-made items for those facing hardships.
7. Join/assist the Christian Services Committee.

Thank you for prayerfully considering and for continuing to make Saint Rose of Lima a place that serves those in need.
