

Brothers and Sisters,

To understand the present, go back to the beginning. That’s good wisdom for a lot of things. As we begin the first Sunday of Lent, the scriptures bring us back to the beginning in Genesis and the story of Noah’s ark and the flood. Aside from the creation of the world and the garden of Eden, this is probably the next Bible story most of us remember from grade school. We remember the parade of the animals and the big boat, but do we know how the covenant with Noah foreshadows the covenant with Christ? Do we know what happens to Noah and Noah’s sons afterward? Do we know how this can help us live a fruitful Lent for our souls this season?



I’ve gone “back to the beginning” to listen to the whole Bible in a year – including the story of Noah’s ark – and I’ve been amazed at the freshness of these Biblical stories and how applicable they are to my life today. This is thanks to The Bible In A Year podcast by Ascension. Father Mike Schmitz, a priest of Duluth, hosts each episode. It was the most popular podcast in the nation for several weeks when it started in January. It has since dropped to #4 overall but it still #1 in Religion and Spirituality. Each episode narrates a chunk of the Bible, explains its meaning and connection to our lives, and concludes with prayer.

If you’re looking for something to help you with your Lenten journey, I couldn’t recommend this enough.


Catholic Schools Week was a blast!

OUR PEOPLE



Trina Maki and Lori Jorgenson met when each registered their oldest child for kindergarten at Saint Rose School in the summer of 1998. Now, more than 22 years later, those two mothers are about to become first-time grandmothers. Their children—Janie and Graham—began dating in high school, continued through college and were married three years ago at Saint Rose.

Around the end of April the couple is expecting a baby boy.

“They are both super-excited,” says Janie, “and can’t wait to spoil their first grandchild. And to think it all began at a parish and school that has been such an important part of all our lives.”

Even though Janie and Graham now live in Fridley, Saint Rose remains their home parish. “The church has given us so much that we want to give back,” says Janie. She is a co-leader of a parish Girl Scout troop and was involved in starting a young adult group, bringing together 18- to 40-year-olds from Saint Rose, Corpus Christi and Maternity of Mary. Right now the group is hosting a monthly Adoration prayer service in the church. Last year Janie joined the Parish Council.

None of this is surprising given her background. She worked as the service and outreach coordinator for the campus ministry department at St. Mary’s University in Winona; was youth minister and faith formation coordinator at St. Charles Borromeo parish in St. Charles, MN.; and director of Camp Summit, a Catholic summer camp for middle school students near Lanesboro, MN.

Graham and Janie were in the same class their entire time at Saint Rose. “I had a crush on her all through middle school,” says Graham, although from Janie’s perspective, “we were just friends.” They began dating their senior year in high school.

Others things to know about Janie and Graham:

- Janie attended St. Bernard’s High School. She graduated from St. Mary’s with a double major in psychology and marketing. She currently works in development for the North Memorial Health Foundation. In addition she has her own photography company (JANIEMAKIPHOTOGRAPHY.COM). She has been photographing weddings, seniors and families for almost ten years.
- Graham graduated from Roseville Area High School and the University of Minnesota-Duluth where he studied criminology. He has been a civilian employee of the Hennepin County Sheriff’s Department for three years as an analyst. He recently completed a six-year enlistment in the Minnesota National Guard.
- In addition to Janie, Peter and Trina Maki have three boys and two girls, all who have attended the parish school. Graham’s parents—Bob and Lori Jorgenson—have two other boys who also went to Saint Rose School.




CAMPAIGN UPDATE & STEWARDSHIP



As of the end of January 2021, of the **\$1,394,097** pledged, we have collected **\$1,003,985**.

So far we have contributed \$300,000 to our endowments, and allocated \$117,025 toward capital campaign expenses. We have spent \$224,474 on the preschool initiative (landscaping, playground and security system), \$22,822 on new ministries (Catechesis of the Good Shepherd and livestreaming technology), and \$35,997 in capital improvements, primarily related to parking lot improvements. The total spent thus far is **\$700,317**.
