FROM OUR PASTOR



Brothers and sisters,

Last week about 100,000 adults professed the Catholic faith or were baptized into the Church in the United States. There aren't solid figures from around the globe, but a good estimate is probably in the range of tens of millions. Some of the most rapid growth comes from sub-Saharan Africa, India, and south-east Asia. And this doesn't include the many Catholics who are baptized as children and grow up in Catholic homes.

The Church welcomes these brothers and sisters especially at the time of Easter. We celebrate the world-changing event of Jesus' resurrection and the new life that comes from believing in him, crucified and risen. Those who are baptized are reborn in the Spirit, not just entering a community of believers through a symbolic ritual, but actually transformed by God and given a participation in God's own being.

Many of that 100,000 number were already baptized, already Christian, already followers of Jesus. So what changed? Why become Catholic versus any other denomination or congregation? What changed was the discovery that something richer of God's blessing was waiting for them in the one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church. And that richness wasn't an accident; it was because Christ founded his Church and founded it to be united in belief and in worship.

As one former Lutheran pastor put his experience¹: "It became very easy for me to become Roman Catholic. But the key of course is not convenience, but conviction. I came to believe that the essence, more like fullness, of the Church of Christ is found in churches in communion with the Church of Rome. I reject nothing of being a Lutheran. That is the transition, not the conversion; I am moving, but the Christian faith that has marked my life is coming with me."

At Saint Rose, one of our most important ministries is RCIA, or the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, where people can bring their Christian faith into the fullness of the Catholic Christian faith. 

PASTORAL MINISTRY

What is Divine Mercy Sunday?

Instituted by St. Pope John Paul II in 2000 to celebrate the Mercy of God. How easy it is to forget that "God is love" and "Mercy is the fruit" of love (Diary of St. Faustina 948). Many people today view God as a distant God who sets rules that are difficult to follow and when we fall short the punishment of an all-powerful God will be upon us. This is because the sin of our first parents, Adam and Eve, has distorted the way we see God. The Catechism states: "**Man, tempted by the devil, let his trust in (the goodness of) his Creator die in his heart...All subsequent sin would be disobedience toward God and lack of trust in his goodness (CCC 397).**" "Scripture portrays the tragic consequences of this first disobedience. They become afraid of the God of whom they have conceived a distorted image - that of a God jealous of his prerogatives (CCC 399)."

PASTORAL MINISTRY, CONT.

The message of Divine Mercy is one that helps to correct the distorted view of God we have and bring us back to who God truly is. "After his fall, man was not abandoned by God. On the contrary, God calls him (CCC 410)". Similarly, God calls each of us, when we go astray, back to His merciful love. He does so because "Our Father is a Father who burns for love for us" (Fr. Michael Gaitley) and only wants what is best for us. Jesus explained the merciful love of the Father in the parable of the Prodigal Son who squandered the inheritance his father gave him in wild living: "But while he (his son) was still a long way off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion for him; he ran to his son, threw his arms around him and kissed him. The son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son.' But the father said to his servants, 'Quick! Bring the best robe and put it on him. Put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. Bring the fattened calf and kill it. Let's have a feast and celebrate. For this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found.' So they began to celebrate (Luke 15: 11-32)." Jesus explains to anyone who lacks trust in the mercy of God that "I tell you that there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous ones who do not need to repent (Luke 15:7)." "For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost (Luke 19:10)." We are all sinners and we all have fallen short. However, we must always trust in the unconditional and unending love and mercy of God. We must always come to Him when we go astray and seek, trust and accept His mercy for us. **"God never tires of forgiving us; we are the ones who tire of seeking his mercy (Pope Francis)."**

Jesus speaking about Divine Mercy Sunday: "On this day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My Mercy. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet" (Diary, 699). "Oh, how much I am hurt by a soul's distrust! Such a soul professes that I am Holy and Just, but does not believe that I am Mercy and does not trust in My Goodness. Even the devils glorify My Justice but do not believe in My Goodness. My Heart rejoices in this title of Mercy. Proclaim that mercy is the greatest attribute of God. All the works of My hands are crowned with mercy (Diary 300)."






Parish Stewardship

February Actual:\$73,305.50
February Budget:\$80,736.00

*Thank you for your faithful stewardship!
This information is updated every 3rd Sunday.*

As of the end of February 2021, of the **\$1,394,097** pledged, we have collected **\$1,019,389**.

So far we have contributed \$300,000 to our endowments, and allocated \$117,025 toward capital campaign expenses. We have spent \$224,474 on the preschool initiative (landscaping, playground and security system), \$24,272 on new ministries (Catechesis of the Good Shepherd and livestreaming technology), and \$35,997 in capital improvements, primarily related to parking lot improvements. The total spent thus far is **\$702,222**.

OUR PEOPLE



Eight years ago when Chris and Derek Erlenbusch chose the pre-K program at Saint Rose School for their son two factors stood out in their decision: Familiarity and convenience. Chris graduated from the school. And they live in North St. Paul and both work in Minneapolis.

Today, with their three boys in the school, the parents appreciate the many traits that make a Saint Rose education

the perfect fit for their young family.

“The teachers are so dedicated and caring,” says Chris. “The smaller class size allows for more student-teacher interaction. The teachers are willing to put in extra time with kids if there are areas where they think a little more attention is needed.”

At first the couple wondered if the size of the school would limit the opportunities for their sons. “Not an issue at all,” says Chris. “Joey, our oldest, participates in band, soccer, swimming and scouts, and has been an altar server. He really enjoys being involved—planning and participating in school Masses, youth ministry, service projects and small group discussions. And in the last year, getting together with other students on Zoom to play games on Friday nights.”

Derek is amazed at how kids at each grade level know and interact with each other. “It is so nice that older kids are willing to help the younger ones. Everyone is so comfortable with students at each grade level. The Saint Rose School experience has been wonderful for our family. A very loving and safe place for our kids.”

Other things to know about the Erlenbusch family:

- Chris attended Holy Childhood parish and school. She enrolled at Saint Rose School for grade 8, and then went on to Cretin-Derham Hall High School and St. Norbert College (business and economics major). For the past 19 years she has worked for UCare. Currently she is the employee experience manager.
- Derek is from Aberdeen, SD. He went to Catholic schools from grade 7 through high school. After receiving a degree in business administration from the University South Dakota he moved to the Twin Cities. He has worked at Wells Fargo for 15 years as a technology recruiter. Derek is a co-leader of one of the Cub Scout groups. He headed up the Christmas wreath sales for the scouts the past two years.
- Joey is in grade 6, William is in grade 2, a Cub Scout and is part of this year’s First Communion class. Matthew, age 4, goes to pre-K five days a week.
