

FROM OUR PASTOR



Brothers and sisters,

This weekend's feast of Corpus Christi – the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ – coincides with Memorial Day weekend. Both commemorations have to do with ultimate sacrifice and with how we who remain are called to live as a consequence of those sacrifices.

Recently I was reading in Maryknoll the story of Father Thomas Goekler. He sacrificed the creature comforts of Connecticut to minister to the people of Barrio Chamelecón, in San Pedro Sula, Honduras. Known as one of the murder capitals of the world, the houses of this area were suddenly filled with three feet of mud when Hurricanes Eta and Iota rampaged across the country in 2020, leaving a soggy and miserable existence in their wake. In Father Thomas' ten years there he helped many men learn trade skills, complete their education in high school and college, and even have their gang tattoos removed – an important step to leaving their former life behind and finding employment.

Adios Tatuajes (“Goodbye Tattoos”) has been operating for 30 years. A nursing assistant named Suyapa Bonilla estimates that they have removed 26,000 tattoos at the clinic. She recounts, “A lot of young people who’ve had their tattoos removed come back and say, ‘Look, I’m working now, thanks to you.’ Those moments are some of our most successful moments – changing the lives of those who belong to the gangs...”

Father Thomas died in 2010, but much of his mission continues to grow. This mission did not just come about from thin air, but was a fruit of living a Eucharistic life. From being saved by the sacrifice of Jesus, who abided with him in the Eucharist, Father Thomas was sent to become a sacrifice for others, abiding with them through his real presence in their midst.

As we celebrate Corpus Christi this year, let's reflect on these questions:

1. Who has made sacrifices in their life for my sake? How did that impact our relationship?
2. What does it mean for my life to become a “holy and pleasing sacrifice” to God?
3. How do I let the Eucharist sustain my dedication to Christ?

4. How is Christ calling me to make my “real presence” for others a missionary sacrifice? Would I let him send me on mission to Honduras? To Mexico? To Minneapolis?

“Stable Housing: The Foundation of Community” is the theme for the next Zoom Forum by the Church of Corpus Christi in Roseville. The forum, co-sponsored by parish’s Social Justice Committee and Building Action Team, will take place at **7:00 p.m. Monday, June 7.**

Featured speaker will be **Alan Arthur**, President and Chief Executive Officer of Aeon, a Twin Cities-based developer and manager of affordable homes. He will be joined by **CJ Simmons-Faye Jones**, an Aeon resident who will speak to the impact of secure housing on her life. The Forum will be moderated by Corpus Christi parishioner **Craig Klausung**, former mayor of Roseville who serves on the boards of Minnesota Housing and the Family Housing Fund.



OUR PEOPLE



Billy Connelly, a member of the 2021 graduating class at Saint Rose School, and his family understand, perhaps more than most other people do, why the school is such a special place. That's because Billy left and went to a local public school for grade 7 and came back this year.

"We left because we were concerned about the declining enrollment," says his mother Maureen, "and we believed the old saying that 'the grass is always greener on the other side.' Turns out, we were wrong."

Saint Rose School had a robust increase in enrollment in the last year—71 percent—and expects even more growth for the 2021-22 school year. Some grades have already reached capacity.

Class size at the public school turned out to be a problem for the Connelly family.

"When I went to parent-teacher conferences at the local public school they had no idea who Billy was," recalls Maureen. "That's understandable because there were 30 or more kids in a class. It would have been good if the teachers knew who your son was."

Maureen says it was very nice to come back to Saint Rose School with smaller class sizes and where Billy was able to receive more individual attention. "The teachers and administration are top-notch at the parish school," she says. "The families we have met and friends we have made will last a lifetime."

"Knowing all my classmates and the teachers very well has made a big difference," says Billy. "That's what I am going to miss most about leaving Saint Rose."

His mother says she is really going to miss the school as well. "It has been a wonderful experience for both our kids," she says. "I will miss everything about Saint Rose School."

Billy was recently named one of the students of the trimester. The middle school teachers called him "a conscientious student whose work in the classroom exhibits care and diligence. Most importantly, he shows unfailing kindness and generosity to everyone around him. In all that he does, Billy shows a humble attitude." He was also on the A Honor Roll.

Other things to know about Billy and his family:

- His parents Maureen and Steve were married in 1997. His older sister Alexis, a student at Mounds View High School, also attended Saint Rose School. The family joined the parish five years ago.
- Maureen has worked in the Church of Corpus Christi office since 2012, doing, among other things, the parish's weekly bulletin.
- During his time at the parish school Billy participated in soccer, track, baseball, hockey and band. His interests include playing hockey, lacrosse, skateboarding, BMX biking and hanging out with his friends. He expects to go to either Roseville Area High School or Mounds View High School in the fall.



As of the end of April 2021, of the **\$1,394,097** pledged, we have collected **\$1,052,314**.

Thank you for your contributions. Please remember checks for the campaign should be made out to Saint Rose of Lima.

So far we have contributed \$300,000 to our endowments, and allocated \$117,025 toward capital campaign expenses. We have spent \$224,474 on the preschool initiative (landscaping, playground and security system), \$26,803 on new ministries (Catechesis of the Good Shepherd and livestreaming technology), \$35,997 in capital improvements, primarily related to parking lot improvements, and \$31,783 on the Chapel renovation. The total spent thus far is **\$736,082**.

Everyday Stewardship—Recognize God in your ordinary moments

We Can Prepare the Upper Room

We all know that person, don't we? Hey, maybe we've even been that person.

"I have a great relationship with God, but I don't go to church regularly. God and I are on good terms. I can talk to Him just fine on my own."

There isn't anything false in these statements. It's important to have an intimate, even conversational prayer relationship with God. But the problem with this attitude is that it implies that churches don't matter. Community worship doesn't matter. Today, we are reminded exactly why that is so untrue. Why we need our parishes, our priests, and each other.

The Body and Blood of Christ — that's what it's all about. If it's not about that, it's not about anything. If we don't have the Eucharist, we're just like the ancient priests, making sacrifices that don't have the power to redeem anybody.

Where do we receive the Body and Blood of Christ? For most of us, it's in our parishes. The altar of sacrifice is also the table we gather in front of, as a family, to become one with Christ in the truest and realest way possible, recreating the scene in the Upper Room over and over again every time Mass is celebrated.

The disciples were commissioned by Christ to prepare the Upper Room for the Last Supper. How can we take up that work ourselves? How can we strengthen the bonds in our spiritual family? How can we serve our parish, always remembering that the table is not meant to be set only for two?
