

FROM OUR PASTOR



Brothers and sisters,

In our second reading this weekend, we hear a snippet from St. Paul's fundraising collection for the church of Jerusalem. His profound sentence about God's riches and poverty echoes into our day:

"For you know the gracious act of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, for your sake he became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich." (2 Corinthians 8:9)

Paul raised money from various Christian communities in Achaia in order to help the Christians in Jerusalem – the first ever Catholic parish. Paul knew the Jerusalemites were materially poor. Paul also knew that a certain spiritual debt was owed by the churches of Corinth, Galatia, and Thessalonika. Their faith came from the Jerusalem disciples who had suffered much already for the sake of Jesus' name. Most of all, when Paul asked for funds for the collection, he was not only persuading the Corinthians to do "a good work," but to allow themselves to become more united to Jesus Christ – he who was rich, but became poor to enrich others.

As we are called to *Glorify God*, we should take some time this summer to ponder how we glorify God through giving:

Am I generous? Am I a cheerful giver? Do I count every gift in my life as a blessing from God? When I give, what is my motivation? Is it to do a good work? Is it intentional or sporadic? Is it to do what others like me tend to do? Is it to be seen? Is it kept hidden? Is it to honor another's dignity? Is it to glorify God – who became poor for my sake? Does my giving unite me to Christ? Do I see my own generosity as Christ's generosity in me? Do I rejoice in the generosity of others?

Funeral Luncheon Volunteers Return



As of the end of May 2021, of the **\$1,394,097** pledged, we have collected **\$1,062,092**.

Thank you for your contributions. Please remember checks for the campaign should be made out to Saint Rose of Lima.

So far we have contributed \$300,000 to our endowments, and allocated \$117,025 toward capital campaign expenses. We have spent \$224,474 on the preschool initiative (landscaping, playground and security system), \$34,312 on new ministries (Catechesis of the Good Shepherd and livestreaming technology), \$35,997 in capital improvements, primarily related to parking lot improvements, and \$31,283 on the Chapel renovation. The total spent thus far is **\$743,090**.

In our thoughts and Prayers

OUR PEOPLE



The roses around Saint Rose are ready to bloom, which means the legacy of Victor Hermes carries on. The long-time parishioner and owner of Hermes Floral, who died in 2005, planted all the rose bushes surrounding the church. The roses are still a part of Saint Rose and so is Victor's granddaughter, Jennifer Love.

“Even though our family lives in Lake Elmo I joined Saint Rose 13 years ago because that’s where I felt more at home,” she says. “When I go to Mass it’s like visiting my grandparents. I try to sit in the same place they used to sit for decades. It helps me stay connected to them.”

Victor planted and took care of the rose bushes and other flowers around the campus. Virginia, his wife of 60 years, was a very active parish volunteer. Jennifer as a young mother with a full-time job (dental hygienist) cannot dedicate a lot of time to the church. However, she has been a Eucharistic minister since 2008. “It’s something I can do to stay involved in the parish without taking up too much extra time,” she says. “That’s my way of giving back. I’m already at Mass, what can I do to help?”

That question was answered when she spoke with Debbie Gohl, her aunt and Godmother. Debbie is coordinator of Eucharistic ministers and was very pleased to bring Jennifer on-board and to train her.

Other things to know about Jennifer:

- Jennifer initially lived in Roseville; the family moved to the Lake Elmo area when she was in grade 4. They were members of the Church of St. Charles in Bayport. Jennifer graduated from Stillwater High School and Argosy University in Eagan, with a degree in dental hygiene.
- Husband Mark also graduated from Stillwater High School. They did not know each other in school, but met when Jennifer trained him when they both worked at a pharmacy. Mark is a glazer, installing and repairing windows in commercial buildings.
- Jennifer and Mark, who were married in 2010, have two sons: Victor, a first grader, and Eddie, who is in pre-school. Both attend the Saint Rose Sunday morning Religious Education program. In one way the pandemic was a blessing for the family, says Jennifer. “The boys spent a lot of time together and their relationship really grew, and our family was able to take several camping trips.”

Pillars of the Church

Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, June 29

“And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my Church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys to the Kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven.” Matthew 16:17–19

Saints Peter and Paul are often referred to as two of the great “Pillars of the Church.” They each played an incredibly essential role in the establishment of the early Church. And though each of their roles were essential and foundational, their roles were as different as they were different as persons.

Peter was a family man, a local fisherman, uneducated and quite ordinary. From what we know about him prior to being called by Jesus, there was nothing that made him uniquely qualified to become one of the pillars of the new Church to be established by the Son of God. Jesus simply called him, and he responded. Jesus got into Peter’s boat, ordered him to lower the nets, and produced a huge catch of fish. When Peter saw this miracle, he fell down at Jesus’ feet and acknowledged that he was “a sinful man” who was unworthy of being in Jesus’ presence (See Luke 5:8). But Jesus informed Peter that he would from now on be catching men. Peter immediately left everything behind and followed Jesus.

Paul describes himself as “a Jew, born at Tarsus in Cili’cia, but brought up in this city at the feet of Gama’li-el, educated according to the strict manner of the law of our fathers, being zealous for God as you all are this day” (Acts 22:3). Paul was well educated in the strictest interpretation of the Jewish law, understood philosophy and was quite zealous as a young man. Recall, also, that prior to becoming a convert to Christianity, he “persecuted the church of God violently and tried to destroy it” (Galatians 1:13). In many ways, Paul would have been seen as the most unlikely person to be chosen to be a pillar of the Church, because he so vigorously opposed it at first. He even supported the killing of Saint Stephen, the first Christian martyr.

Though each of these men would have been considered by many as very unlikely founders of the Christian Church, this is exactly what they became. Paul, after his conversion, traveled far and wide to preach the Gospel, founding several new Churches

throughout Asia Minor and Europe. Eventually he was arrested in Jerusalem, brought to Rome for trial and was beheaded. Over half of the New Testament books are attributed to Paul and half of the Acts of the Apostles detail Paul’s missionary journeys. Paul is especially known for his missionary activity to the gentiles, those who were not Jews.

Peter’s role was truly a unique one. His name was changed from “Simon” to “Peter” by Jesus. Recall Jesus saying, “And I tell you, you are Peter (Petros), and on this rock (petra) I will build my church... (Matthew 16:18). “Peter” in Greek is Petros, meaning a single stone that is movable. However, the Greek word petra means a rock as a solid formation that is fixed, immovable, and enduring. Therefore, Jesus chose to make Peter, this single stone, into a solid foundation of immovable rock on which the Church was to be built.

You, too, have been called by our Lord to a unique mission within the Church that has not been entrusted to another. In your own way, God wants to use you to reach certain people with the Gospel as He did with Saint Paul. And like Saint Peter, God wants to continue to establish His Church upon you and your faith.

Reflect, today, upon these two holy and unique pillars of our Church. As you do, ponder how God may want to use you to continue their mission in this world. Though Saints Peter and Paul are among the greatest and most consequential Christians within our world, their mission must continue, and you are among the instruments that God wants to use. Commit yourself to this mission so that the preaching of the Gospel and the rock foundation of our Church will remain strong within our day and age just as it was of old.

Saint Peter, you were uniquely chosen to be a rock foundation of faith upon which the Church was established. Saint Paul, you went forth to preach this faith far and wide, establishing many new communities of faith. Please use me, dear Lord, to continue the mission of Your Church so that the faith may be firmly planted in the minds and hearts of all Your people throughout the world. Jesus, I trust in You.


THE BIBLE COLLECTION - PAUL THE APOSTLE




