

FROM OUR PASTOR



Brothers and sisters,
Happy Independence Day! I regret that I won't be celebrating in person with you this weekend, as I am celebrating a close friend's wedding in Pennsylvania. The upside is that our community gets to welcome Father Fitz back again to Saint Rose!

You've probably been reading about a number of 'church and state' headlines that have surfaced recently. One narrative that is overblown is the decision of the United States Catholic bishops to draft a document on the Eucharist. The vote to move forward passed 168-55. That's a strong showing, but not the usual landslide that happens in these meetings. Clear teaching about the Eucharist is needed for many reasons, not least of which is that 30% of Mass-going Catholics don't believe or don't know that the Eucharist is not ordinary bread but the sacramental Body and Blood of Christ. The bishops weren't arguing about that. What they were debating was a small section of the document outline about Eucharistic consistency – for example, at what level does a believer's actions first require repentance and change of behavior before approaching the Lord's table for Holy Communion? We are all sinners, but at what point is it *inconsistent*, and even spiritually *dangerous*, for someone to receive the Eucharist while continuing to live and work in opposition to Christ? Here's where the overblown part comes. Don't count on the document denying Communion to the President or any other Catholic politicians for their stances on human rights issues like abortion. That would only be done by the individual bishops in areas where President Biden lives or worships, none of whom have shown any interest in such a proposition.

What is a big deal is the Supreme Court's *unanimous* decision that the City of Philadelphia violated the First Amendment when it demanded that Catholic Social Services (CSS) place foster children with same-sex couples. Luke Goodrich of the legal group Becket stated, "This sends a powerful message that religious Americans are free to serve. They don't have to change their basic beliefs about marriage and family in order to join hands across faith lines and serve the neediest in society." Pope Francis, often portrayed by the media as attempting to soften Church teaching, nonetheless wrote clearly in The Joy Of Love that "there are absolutely no grounds for considering homosexual unions to be in any way similar or even remotely analogous to God's plan for marriage and family." Those may be stark words for some to hear, but mercy and charity in fact are always joined to the truth of Christ.

In our nation, one of our greatest rights – and greatest responsibilities – is to speak the truth about the family. May we always carry out that responsibility, even if the courts should someday obstruct that right.




As of the end of May 2021, of the **\$1,394,097** pledged, we have collected **\$1,062,092**.

Thank you for your contributions. Please remember checks for the campaign should be made out to Saint Rose of Lima.

So far we have contributed \$300,000 to our endowments, and allocated \$117,025 toward capital campaign expenses. We have spent \$224,474 on the preschool initiative (landscaping, playground and security system), \$34,312 on new ministries (Catechesis of the Good Shepherd and livestreaming technology), \$35,997 in capital improvements, primarily related to parking lot improvements, and \$31,283 on the Chapel renovation. The total spent thus far is **\$743,090**.

YOUTH MINISTRY



God, creation, and children – Youth Ministry at Como Zoo!

This past week Youth Ministry visited Como Zoo. After we had surveyed impish orangutans, muscular gorillas, and vibrant flamingos, I asked the students what they had learned about God. “He’s amazing!” gasped a 7th grade boy.

The work of an artist tells us about that particular artist. As God’s handiwork, creation tells us about God. He is beautiful, majestic, fierce, and even wild!

There’s more! By observing God’s creation, I can discover, at least in part, the way that God intends the world to be. The author of Genesis observes that God creates human beings as male and female (Gen 1:27). God says, “Be fruitful and multiply” (Gen 1:28). Then, God pronounces his completed work, “very good” (Gen. 1:31). According to Genesis, God wants human beings to be *male and female*; and, as men and women, God wants them to have children.

Back at the Zoo, I asked the students where a baby monkey comes from. “It’s mother!” someone said. “Who else?” I asked. In fact, a baby monkey comes from its mother and its father. This is no fluke. No flaw in the system. When God made the world, he willed that monkeys, tigers, bears – and yes, especially human beings - have *both* a mother *and* a father.

The author of Genesis agrees. The natural world agrees. Every child has a mother and a father. That is why, at least in part, the Catholic Church teaches that marriage can only be a union between one man *and* one woman.

Seeing Christ in Others

Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B)

Jesus said to them, “A prophet is not without honor except in his native place and among his own kin and in his own house.” So he was not able to perform any mighty deed there, apart from curing a few sick people by laying his hands on them. He was amazed at their lack of faith. Mark 6:4–6

Jesus’ encounter with His own kin in His own town was disappointing. They were amazed at His wisdom and the mighty deeds He performed. But despite this amazement at Him, they “took offense at Him.” They took offense because they didn’t understand how someone whom they knew well, one of their own kin, could be someone special. They allowed their closeness and familiarity with Jesus to cloud their ability to have faith in Him and to rejoice in His greatness.

We do not have this same struggle in a direct way. None of us are from Jesus’ own town or members of His extended family by blood relations. But we can still fall into the trap of turning Jesus away as He is present in those closest to us, within our own family and among our close friends.

This struggle that Jesus encountered reveals our tendency to look at those closest to us without the eyes of faith. Though Jesus was falsely judged, we can, at times, enter into judgment of those close to us on

account of their sins or even our false perception of their good actions. Are you able to see others in the light of truth? Are you also able to look beyond the weakness and sins of others and see the presence and grace of God alive in their lives? Are you able to see their goodness and allow God to speak to you through those closest to you? This can be more of a struggle than we may realize.

If it happened to Jesus, it will happen in our families too. The lesson we should learn from this is to identify the temptation to see only the negative in the lives of those closest to us. If we can overcome that temptation, we will be able to focus in on the presence of God alive in their lives. This should be the first and primary thing we seek to discover each and every day. Reflect, today, upon how well you do see God present in those closest to you. If you find you struggle with that, see it as a temptation you are called to overcome. Discovering the presence of God alive in those around you will help you to grow in love of them and love of God.

Lord, help me to see You in the lives of those closest to me. Help me to rejoice in Your presence and to grow in love of others and in love of You as I see You at work in their lives. Jesus, I trust in You.


JOHN PAUL II IN AMERICA: UNITING A CONTINENT


