

FROM OUR PASTOR



(This column is Part 4 of a series on Sacred Music)

Brothers and sisters,

Over the last few weeks I have written about sacred music. This week I want to focus on the specific qualities of sacred music. What follows is a long citation from Sing to the Lord, the 2007 document by the U.S. bishops about sacred music:

“Sacred music is to be considered the more holy the more closely connected it is with the liturgical action, whether making prayer more pleasing, promoting unity of minds, or conferring greater solemnity upon the sacred rites.” This holiness involves ritual and spiritual dimensions, both of which must be considered within cultural context.

The ritual dimension of sacred music refers to those ways in which it is “connected with the liturgical action” so that it accords with the structure of the Liturgy and expresses the shape of the rite. The musical setting must allow the rite to unfold with the proper participation of the assembly and its ministers, without overshadowing the words and actions of the Liturgy.

The spiritual dimension of sacred music refers to its inner qualities that enable it to add greater depth to prayer, unity to the assembly, or dignity to the ritual. Sacred music is holy when it mediates the holiness of God and forms the Holy People of God more fully into communion with him and with each other in Christ.

The cultural context refers to the setting in which the ritual and spiritual dimensions come into play. Factors such as the age, spiritual heritage, and cultural and ethnic background of a given liturgical assembly must be considered. The choice of individual compositions for congregational participation will often depend on those ways in which a particular group finds it best to join their hearts and minds to the liturgical action.

With gratitude to the Creator for giving humanity such a rich diversity of musical styles, the Church seeks to employ only that which, in a given style, meets the ritual-spiritual demands of the Liturgy. In discerning the sacred quality of liturgical music, liturgical musicians will find guidance in music from the Church’s treasury of sacred music, which is of inestimable value and which past generations have found suitable for worship. They also should strive to promote a fruitful dialogue between the Church and the modern world.’



Thank you for your faithful stewardship!
This information is updated every 3rd Sunday.

As of the end of September 2021, of the **\$1,394,097** pledged, we have collected **\$1,138,679**. Thank you for your contributions. Please remember checks for the campaign should be made out to Saint Rose of Lima.

So far we have contributed \$300,000 to our endowments, and allocated \$117,025 toward capital campaign expenses. We have spent \$224,474 on the preschool initiative (landscaping, playground and security system), \$34,462 on new ministries (Catechesis of the Good Shepherd and livestreaming technology), \$35,997 in capital improvements, primarily related to parking lot improvements, and \$36,346 on the Chapel renovation. The total spent thus far is **\$748,878**.

OUR PEOPLE



Carol and Pete Bernaciak began attending Mass at Saint Rose in 1984, a year before they married. Ten years ago Carol was looking for a way to become more engaged in the parish. Since she had a full-time job daytime volunteering was not an option. Thus the idea of starting an evening quilting group came to mind. "I was a beginner quilter and enjoyed it very much," says Carol.

"After securing space in the parish center we started meeting monthly. But the members were so enthusiastic we switched to twice a month (second and fourth Thursdays).

"We consistently have six to 10 people at each session and are looking for more participants. I know it's not easy to join an organization, but we are a very friendly group. It's a nice way to socialize with others. Our group has a wide range of skills—from those who have done little or no quilting to those who have done a lot—and we are happy to help each other.

"We pick projects that can be done by multiple people," says Carol. "You can participate in any way. Some just like to iron and that's perfectly fine. We have three sewing machines available for anyone to use and 20-30 boxes of fabric. Three or four times a year we have craft weekends where attendees work on their own projects, including quilting, knitting and scrapbooking. If you would like to join us contact the parish center for information."

An important part of this Saint Rose ministry is the final product—baby blankets, larger blankets, table runners—all are donated to charitable organizations. They also work with Saint Rose Girl Scouts on projects.

Other things to know about Carol and Pete:

- Both grew up in Catholic families; she in Eau Claire, Wis.; he in Ivanhoe, Minnesota. They met at St. Cloud State University. Pete works in finance and Carol as an IT consultant. They enjoy cruises and cooking, especially baking. Carol has been a Eucharistic minister for many years.
- Daughter Erin is in marketing and son Robert is an electrical engineer. Both graduated from Saint Rose School. Robert and his wife are the parents of Kira, Carol and Pete's first grandchild.
