

FROM OUR PASTOR



(This column is Part 5 of a series on Sacred Music)

Brothers and sisters,

Last week, I quoted the U.S. bishops, writing about the spiritual, ritual, and cultural dimensions of music in the liturgy.

This week, I want to touch on something not strictly musical, but which often touches the topic of sacred music. I want to speak on language in the liturgy, in other words, “Latin” in contrast to the “vernacular.”

Now, even putting my toe in this water, I’m well aware that there are not a few people who, upon hearing even a whiff of Latin sung during the Mass, pinch their nose and complain about the Church “going backwards.” I’m also well aware of quite another group who is convinced that if we simply did everything in Latin and just like it all used to be, all the Church’s problems would evaporate overnight.

But what I’d rather do is place us into the wisdom of the Second Vatican Council, which is both illuminative and authoritative. What did the Council say on this matter?

First of all, the Council said, “the use of the Latin language is to be preserved in the Latin rites,” meaning there’s something important about the “Latin-ness” of the “Latin Rite.” In no way did the Council reject Latin entirely. At the same time, it said that the use of the “vernacular” or “common language” could be extended, for the advantage of the faithful, “in the first place to the readings and directives, and to some of the prayers and chants, according to the regulations on this matter to be laid down,” especially “to those parts that pertain to the people.” Strong emphasis is laid on local adaptability. The Council went on to teach that, “Nevertheless, steps should be taken so that the faithful may also be able to say or to sing together in Latin those parts of the Ordinary of the Mass which pertain to them.” The Ordinary of the Mass includes those parts that are always the same: the Gloria; the Holy, Holy, Holy; the Lamb of God; and so on. Even someone linguistically-challenged can easily learn that singing “Agnus Dei,” means, in English, singing to the “Lamb of God” before Communion at every Mass.

These quotes all come from the document Sacrosanctum Concilium, which can be found online, in 13 languages – including Latin! There are no grand plans for adjusting our worship at Saint Rose, except for perhaps giving the Agnus Dei a spin during Lent. Most importantly, it is important for all of us to hear the wisdom of the Second Vatican Council.



As of the end of September 2021, of the **\$1,394,097** pledged, we have collected **\$1,138,679**. Thank you for your contributions. Please remember checks for the campaign should be made out to Saint Rose of Lima.

So far we have contributed \$300,000 to our endowments, and allocated \$117,025 toward capital campaign expenses. We have spent \$224,474 on the preschool initiative (landscaping, playground and security system), \$34,462 on new ministries (Catechesis of the Good Shepherd and livestreaming technology), \$35,997 in capital improvements, primarily related to parking lot improvements, and \$36,346 on the Chapel renovation. The total spent thus far is **\$748,878**.

Time to Order Wreaths



OUR YOUNG PEOPLE



An annual trip to a northern Wisconsin Boy Scout camp this summer turned into an unexpected adventure for three Saint Rose School students, and clearly demonstrated their understanding of responsibility that they have learned in the classroom and at home.

Seventh-graders Joey Erlenbusch, Noah Michel, and Michael Halberg, along with others members of Troop 266, spent a week in August at Tomahawk Scout Reservation near Birchwood, a 2.5 hour drive north of the Twin Cities. The camp has been used for years by Boy Scouts from Minnesota and Wisconsin.

Right after lunch on the Tuesday of that week the boys were hiking by themselves when they came upon a building with smoke coming out of the roof. "There's a lotta smoke," Michael recalls saying. Although somewhat startled, they checked the cabin and there was indeed a fire.

The boys started calling around for some counselors, but they were all at lunch. Eventually they ran a quarter mile to get the beach counselor. The Birchwood Fire Department and Washburn County Sheriff were called and the fire was extinguished quickly. The local authorities were very appreciative of how the boys responded.

"At school we have been taught to always look for ways to help," says Joey. "There was no hesitation on our part as what was the right thing to do." Adds Noah: "We knew we had to get help because we all realized how dangerous a building on fire could be." Michael says they were just being responsible members of the community. "We all need to do our part to keep the community functioning."

The fire turned out to be arson. The boys were unaware that the day before there had been a fire in the boathouse. Fire department investigators reported that the Saint Rose students were especially helpful in providing details about the fire.

"We are proud of our young Scouts," says Doug Seebeck, Scoutmaster of the troop. "Their quick thinking and alerting others enabled the staff to deal with the situation before it got out of control."

Noah is the son of Matt and Amy Michel; Joey the son of Derek and Chris Erlenbusch, and Michael the son of Matt and Liz Halberg. All three fathers are actively involved in the Saint Rose scouting program: Matt Michel was Cubmaster and is now assistant Scoutmaster. Derek Erlenbusch is a den leader for Cubs and a committee member for the Boy Scouts. Matt Halberg helps plan the annual BWCA trip and is going to be a merit badge counselor.

"The thing about kids at Saint Rose School," says Noah's mother Amy, "is that they are very responsible, mature and just really good people. That hasn't changed in the nine years we have had a student at the school. This is just another example of why we send our kids to Saint Rose School."
