HEAR HIS VOICE: PREPARE!

A voice cries out: Prepare the way of the LORD! (Is. 40:3)



Our lives are full of voices – voices of the world, of politics, of professional circles, peer groups. Sometimes it is too much, just a jumble of varying opinions, demands and expectations, that we no longer know which voice is trustworthy, or whom we should follow. Or worse: Our lives are so filled with noises of the world that we are no longer attentive to hear God's voice. *"Prepare the way of the LORD! Make straight his paths..."*

The season of Advent is the Church's way of offering us a time to draw back from the noise that envelops us, and once again re-attune our hearts to God. He is inviting us to prepare the way for Jesus to be born once again, not just in our Churches, but in our own hearts, in our families and society. What does this Advent season mean for us practically, specifically now amidst all the various challenges of 2020? How can we, how can **I** prepare the way of the Lord...

- ♦ In the midst of a COVID pandemic, when sickness, fear and distance prevent us from engaging with each other or fostering healthy, human family bonds and relationships?
- ♦ During our nation's political turmoil, when platforms and policies more often divide than unite us?
- ♦ When I am so burnt-out from the stresses of my profession or personal circumstances and barely keep up my day-to-day duties, much less grow in my spiritual life...
- ♦ When THIS is the world in which we live!?!?

God's voice then breaks through the chaos: "Comfort, give comfort to my people..." These words in today's first reading are not random; our Heavenly Father wants to encourage us to not give up hope. He does have a plan, and he knows how to write straight on crooked lines – through us, through me and YOU. No one of us will solve all the world's problems, or adequately prepare the way of the Lord. Yet, when each does their little part, the divine plan becomes manifest little by little. Mother Theresa was known to say (I paraphrase): "You can't feed all the world's poor, but you can feed ONE person." So, we might not be able to eradicate COVID, or calm the political field, or even overcome our own personal downfalls; yet we can "prepare the way of the LORD" in little ways... Maybe it's a lonely family member who just needs to talk, or giving time to someone who maybe is not my "cup-of-tea." Maybe I'll choose to swap some social media time for a spiritual podcast or Advent reflection, or allocate "digital free zones" in our schedule or home to spend more personal time with my spouse or children. The options are endless and as unique as the individual. So...

Prepare the way of the LORD! This week we will be celebrating the feast of Mary's Immaculate Conception. Mary, better than anyone, knows how to prepare for the coming of the Lord. She was prepared by the Lord to receive Christ into her womb; and she lovingly prepared for his birth with Joseph, even in the midst of extremely challenging circumstances. Let us call upon Mary and Joseph's intercession, that they may help us know in what little ways we personally can prepare our hearts and souls for the coming of the Christ Child. May this second week of Advent be filled with graces and blessings for you –




GREETING BY FR. CYPRIAN CZOP, O.M.I.

Niech będzie pochwalony Jezus Chrystus!

Przeżywamy drugą niedzielę Adwentu, w którą słyszymy nawoływanie do pokuty i przygotowania dróg Panu, jakie na pustyni kieruje do nas Jan Chrzciciel. Jednocześnie prorok Izajasz pociesza nas, mówiąc o bliskości Boga, który nadchodzi i wkrótce udzieli nam swojej zapłaty:

„**Pocieszajcie, pocieszajcie mój lud!**» – mówi wasz Bóg. «Przemawiajcie do serca Jeruzalem i wołajcie do niego, że czas jego służby się skończył, że nieprawość jego odpokutowana»... Oto wasz Bóg! Oto Pan Bóg przychodzi z mocą i ramię Jego dźmierzy władzę. Oto Jego nagroda z Nim idzie i przed Nim Jego zapłata" (Iz 40, 1nn).

Dzisiaj w kalendarzu liturgicznym także wspomnienie **św. Mikołaja** – biskupa Miry w Licji (obecnie na obszarze Turcji), który żył w III/IV wieku. Niech jego wstawiennictwo wyprasza nam wiele Bożych darów, a przykład jego dobroci niech inspiruje nas do obdarowywania innych radością i dobrocią.



Nadchodzący tydzień obfituje w uroczystości i wspomnienia Matki Bożej, co podkreśla także **maryjny charakter oczekiwania adwentowego**: 8 grudnia przypada uroczystość **Niepokalanego Poczęcia Najświętszej Maryi Panny**, 10 grudnia – wspomnienie NMP z Loreto, a 12 grudnia – święto NMP z Guadalupe. Zachęcam także do uczestnictwa w **roratach, w piątki o godz. 19:00**, by wspólnie z Maryją przeżywać dni i tygodnie adwentowego oczekiwania na przyjście

Zbawiciela. Na roraty dobrze jest przynieść lampiony lub świece.

Są jeszcze **polsko-angielskie mszaliki** na nowy rok liturgiczny. Ponieważ obecnie nie można zostawiać mszalików w ławkach, proszę, aby każda rodzina wzięła po egzemplarzu, podpisała i przynosiła na liturgię. Mszaliki są bezpłatne; można złożyć ofiarę (sugerowana kwota to 10 dol.). Również można zaopatrzyć się w **opłatki** – u mnie lub w sekretariacie parafii.

Zyczę wszystkim radosnego trwania na drodze adwentowego przygotowania.

COMING UP THIS WEEK IN LITURGY

7 grudnia, poniedziałek – wspomnienie św. Ambrożego

Św. Ambroży (340-397) pochodził z chrześcijańskiej rodziny rzymskiej. Był gubernatorem rzymskiej prowincji Liguria-Emilia z siedzibą w Mediolanie. W 374 r. został nieoczekiwanie obwołany przez wiernych biskupem tego miasta, choć był wówczas tylko katechumenem, i – po uprzednim przyjęciu chrztu – 7 grudnia otrzymał sakrę biskupią. Jako biskup okazał się prawdziwym pasterzem i nauczycielem wiernych, zwalczał arianizm, był autorem hymnów kościelnych. Jest jednym z ojców Kościoła zachodniego i doktorem Kościoła.

Jest to główna uroczystość patronalna Zgromadzenia Misjonarzy Oblatów Maryi Niepokalanej. „Patronką Zgromadzenia jest Maryja Niepokalana. Otwarta na Ducha Świętego, jako pokorna służebnica całkowicie poświęciła samą siebie osobie i dziełu Zbawiciela. W Dziewicy zatroskanej o przyjęcie Chrystusa, aby dać Go światu, dla którego jest On nadzieją, oblaci widzą wzór wiary Kościoła i własnej” (Konstytucje i Reguły OMI, K. 10).


