AS THE WORLD SPINS, THE CROSS STANDS FIRM

FORTY DAYS MORE...

*"The men of Nineveh...repented at the preaching of Jonah;
and there is something greater than Jonah here." -Matthew 12:41*



What a timely first reading for the days that we are living! Timely and yet painful to understand the call, reluctance and ultimate follow-through of the Prophet Jonah who was called to preach repentance in the wicked metropolis of Nineveh. His unexpected success in carrying out his divine mission was far from automatic. Yes, the people converted and did penance, but judging by Jonah's 'knee-jerk response' to God's call—*read Jonah chapter 1*—we would not have seen

this coming. One of the great dramatic ironies of the Book of Jonah is that Jonah himself needed conversion prior to preaching conversion to others.

We have our mission as Jonah had his. Ours has its own complexities, opportunities and uncertainties. Will we as believers who live in a technologically sophisticated and morally depraved and culturally decadent society be able to bear witness and call our compatriots to deep conversion back to God? Jonah was able to.

But we have an even greater guide and teacher than Jonah! We are called, as Simon, Andrew, James and John were also called, into the *sequella Christi*, the classic Latin phrase that describes the magnificent adventure of the 'following of Christ!' They too needed to be converted in order to become agents of conversion for others. And so, after living in the school of missionary discipleship, these four Apostles, together with the rest of the Apostolic band and their lay co-collaborators in mission, would preach conversion to the ends of the earth. And although not strictly in their lifetimes, voluntary conversion (not coercion) spread across the whole known world. This is one of the wonders of the early Church, whose history is recounted in the Acts of the Apostles—one of the most miraculous and power-packed books in the bible.

Back to Jonah—As Nineveh had its forty days, so we have ours. Let us think first not of how the world needs to convert but *how you and I need to convert*. We are often experts in the tiny slivers we see in the eyes of others, while being blind to the beams in our own eyes. And so, I invite you to think TODAY about the transformation that could be possible in the forty days of Lent (officially called *Quadragesima*, Latin for 40 Days!) which start on Ash Wednesday, this year February 17th. Think about these weeks as weeks of preparation for Lent. The traditional, pre-Conciliar Liturgy had three weeks building up to Lent, beginning with Septuagesima, almost like a long highway on ramp we can use to build up speed.

This coming week we celebrate *a great liturgical feast*: the Feast of St. Paul's Conversion on January 25th. The feast reminds us that we will only be effective to lead souls to Christ to the extent to which we are following Him sincerely and converted deeply to Him. Paul became one of the truly great agents of conversion, because he, like Jonah, stumbled in sin, but repented humbly and boldly, thus practicing what he preached. Let's not get wrapped up in worldliness or in comfort and complacency. Let us choose today to follow Jesus closely, for as St. Paul knew, "the world in its present form is passing away" (1 Cor 7:31).

I leave you with two quotes to get you excited for Lent:

One from Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.: *"We must use time creatively, in the knowledge that the time is always ripe to do right."*

And one from St. Josemaria Escriva: *"I have decided not to let this Lent go by like rain on stones, leaving no trace. I will let it soak into me, changing me. I will be converted. I will turn again to the Lord and love Him as He wants to be loved."*

It begins today.



CO W TRAWIE PISZCZY...

GREETING BY FR. CYPRIAN CZOP, O.M.I.

Niech będzie pochwalony Jezus Chrystus!

25 stycznia, w święto Nawrócenia św. Pawła, nasze Zgromadzenie Misjonarzy Oblatów Maryi Niepokalanej, obchodzi rocznicę swojego powstania.

Ojciec Eugeniusz de Mazenod, późniejszy biskup Marsylii, a obecnie święty, 25 stycznia 1816 r. rozpoczął życie we wspólnocie misjonarskiej w Aix (Prowansja, południowa Francja). Na początku znalazł on czterech ochotników – innych kapłanów, którzy podzielali jego zapał i chcieli poświęcić się odnowie spustoszonego przez rewolucję francuską Kościoła. Ta wspólnota księży nosiła pierwotnie nazwę Misjonarze Prowansji. Poświęcali się oni przede wszystkim odnowie moralnej ludu francuskiego poprzez głoszenie rekolekcji i misji świętych. Później pojawiły się potrzeby posługi misyjnej za granicą – Zgromadzenie zmieniło nazwę na Misjonarze Oblaci Maryi Niepokalanej i rozszerzyło swoją działalność na krańce świata. Hasłem Zgromadzenia są słowa: „Głosić Ewangelię ubogim posłał mnie Pan” (*Evangelizare Pauperibus Misit Me*).

W 1841 r. oblaci otworzyli misje w Kanadzie, a rok później – w Stanach Zjednoczonych. Polska Prowincja Misjonarzy Oblatów została erygowana w 1920 r. Obecnie oblaci pracują w 74 krajach na wszystkich kontynentach.

W Minnesocie placówki oblackie znajdują się w St. Paul (parafie św. Kazimierza i św. Patryka), w Buffalo (Dom Rekolekcyjny „King’s House”), w Duluth (parafia św. Michała) i w White Earth (rezerwat Indian).



Z tej szczególnej okazji powstania naszego Zgromadzenia, proszę Was, drodzy Bracia i Siostry, o szczególną modlitwę w intencji naszych dzieł, zwłaszcza misyjnych, o potrzebne łaski dla wszystkich misjonarzy, ojców i braci, a także dla tych, którym służymy, oraz o nowe powołania oblackie.

Życzę Wam pięknych styczniowych dni, dobrej pogody w tym zimowym czasie, Bożego błogosławieństwa w pracy i odpoczynku. Szczęść Boże!

COMING UP THIS WEEK IN LITURGY

25 stycznia, poniedziałek – święto Nawrócenia św. Pawła

Nawrócenie św. Pawła jest jednym z najważniejszych wydarzeń w Kościele. Szawel, gorliwy faryzeusz i prześladowca Kościoła, wskutek ukazania się mu Chrystusa Zmartwychwstałego u bram Damaszku, stał się nie tylko Jego uczniem, ale poświęcił całe życie szerzeniu Ewangelii; zaniósł światło Ewangelii do Europy, stając się Apostołem Narodów.

26 stycznia, wtorek – wspomnienie świętych biskupów

Tymoteusza i Tytusa

Tymoteusz i Tytus byli uczniami i pomocnikami Pawła Apostoła, jeden z nich przewodził Kościołowi w Efezie, drugi zaś na Krecie. Do nich skierowane są listy zwane „pasterskimi”. Zawierają one bardzo trafne napomnienia dla pasterzy i wiernych.

28 stycznia, czwartek – wspomnienie św. Tomasza z Akwinu, prezbitera i doktora Kościoła

Tomasz (ok. 1225-1274) oddany na wychowanie benedyktynom na Monte Cassino pobierał nauki w szkole klasztornej, a następnie studiował w Neapolu.
