

AS THE WORLD SPINS, THE CROSS STANDS FIRM

HE LEARNED OBEDIENCE FROM WHAT HE SUFFERED



The title of my article today on the Fifth Sunday of Lent, *the beginning of Passiontide*, comes from our second reading which is taken from chapter five of the Letter to the Hebrews. While the passage refers perhaps more directly to the Lord's Agony in the Garden, it also applies to the sufferings of His early life, such as the events surrounding His Nativity in Bethlehem and the Flight into Egypt. These are traditionally numbered among the 'Seven Sorrows'.

Through the setbacks and difficulties endured by the Holy Family in the first weeks and months of Christ's Infancy we can imagine the prayers, supplications and even tears of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. And yet, what an incredible environment in which they each—in their own way and together—learned obedience to the Heavenly Father.

The compelling obedience of St. Joseph and the naturalness of his guardianship over his family is striking in the biblical narrative:

"He rose, took the child and his mother, and went to the land of Israel. But when he heard that Archelaus was ruling over Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go back there. And because he had been warned in a dream, he departed for the region of Galilee. He went and dwelt in a town called Nazareth, so that what had been spoken through the prophets might be fulfilled, 'He shall be called a Nazorean.'"

~Matthew 2:21-23

Even Joseph's altogether human fear and the reassurance he receives from the nighttime visit of the angel shows us his docility to the Divine Call and his singlemindedness in carrying out the most demanding tasks. How beautiful to consider the Holy Family as a 'first *seminary*,' or seedbed wherein the Christ Child's own call to obedience was nourished into a call to become High Priest and Victim. The prayerful obedience of Joseph and the Blessed Virgin Mary were incredibly potent for the young God-man and it can be said literally (even if almost incredibly so) that their witness of obedient faith helped the Lord *in His humanity* to grow into the full stature of manhood that would be required to shoulder the wood of the Cross and carry it to Calvary for our salvation.

As we have celebrated St. Joseph on March 19th with his great annual solemnity, a special festivity in this year dedicated to St. Joseph, we would do well to draw close to Jesus, Mary and Joseph to enroll ourselves in their school of obedient faith. The whole Church is blessed to be endowed with such masterful teachers of prayer and authentic virtue: Mary and Joseph along with Saints Anne and Joachim, the grandparents of Jesus.


After the twelve-year-old Christ was found in the Temple after three days of searching, we are told that "He went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them; and his mother kept all these things in her heart. And Jesus advanced [in] wisdom and age and favor before God and man."

~Luke 2:51-52

What a beautiful witness Jesus gives of humility and trust in the provision of His Heavenly Father to entrust Him to so noble a mother and foster-father. He lived and learned within the life of a family as we ourselves do. May we be open to learning from the best and letting the sufferings, disappointments and difficulties that befall us throughout life to be precisely the occasions in which we learn to pray with Jesus, "*Not my will, but Thy Will be done!*"

As we draw close to Holy Week let us follow where Jesus leads, aware that He humbled Himself to be obedient unto death, even death on a Cross.

W piątek ostatnia Droga Krzyżowa po polsku, prowadzona przez rodziny Domowego Kościoła. Zapraszam wszystkich na godz. 18:00, a o 19:00—na Mszę św. po polsku.

Spowiedź św. wielkopostna w tym tygodniu: w kościele św. Jadwigi (St. Hedwig) we wtorek od 9:00 do 10:00 oraz w piątek od 10:00 do 11:00; w kościele Świętego Krzyża (Holy Cross) w piątek od 12:00 do 15:00.

„Oto idziemy do Jerozolimy...” (Mt 20, 18)
Wielki Post: czas na odnowę wiary, nadziei i miłości

Przeżywanie Wielkiego Postu miłości oznacza opiekę nad tymi, którzy cierpią, są opuszczeni lub udrczeni z powodu pandemii Covid-19. W kontekście wielkiej niepewności jutra, pamiętając o słowie skierowanym przez Boga do swego Sługi: „Nie lękaj się, bo cię wykupiłem” (Iz 43, 1), ofiarujemy wraz z naszym gestem miłości słowo ufności, i sprawmy, by bliźni poczuł się kochany przez Boga jak dziecko.

„Tylko spojrzenie, którego perspektywa została przekształcona miłością, prowadzi do pojęcia godności drugiego człowieka; ubodzy są uznani i docenieni w ich niezmierniej godności, poszanowani w swoim własnym stylu i kulturze, a zatem prawdziwie włączeni w społeczeństwo” (Enc. *Fratelli tutti*, 187).

Drodzy bracia i siostry, każdy etap życia jest czasem wiary, nadziei i miłości. To wezwanie do przeżywania Wielkiego Postu jako drogi nawrócenia, modlitwy i dzielenia się naszymi dobrami, niech nam pomoże powrócić naszą osobistą i wspólnotową pamięcią do tej wiary, która pochodzi od żywego Chrystusa, do nadziei ożywionej tchnieniem Ducha Świętego i do miłości, której niewyczerpanym źródłem jest miłosierne serce Ojca.

MARIAN CONSECRATION ON THURSDAY, MARCH 25

The parish-wide Marian Consecration meetings take place on Tuesdays through March 23. 
