AS THE WORLD SPINS, THE CROSS STANDS FIRM

PRAY FOR OUR CITY



The civil unrest in our city since this past summer, exacerbated no doubt by anxieties of the COVID-19 situation and lockdown, has shaken us and continues to do shake us. In our attempts as a city to come to grips with everything that is going on, there is a great diversity of readings and interpretations. We are finding that, tragically, the differences in our society are bringing not only acrimony and mutual recrimination, but have spilled over into violence and destruction. This local Catholic Church of the Archdiocese of St. Paul and

Minneapolis is by no means unaffected by what is going on, just as the Church is always “in the world” even as she is not “of the world.” We do not simply remain neutral to the temporal and historical conflicts that surround us, for we are a part of them and they are a part of us. We are citizens of the Twin Cities, of the United States of America, and of the World. Just because we are a people who live in the consciousness of Heaven does not mean that we have no worldly concerns, that we do not share in both the joys and sufferings of the citizens of this world. On the contrary, as the opening of the Vatican II *Pastoral Constitution on the Modern World (Gaudium et Spes)* announces,

The joys and the hopes, the griefs and the anxieties of the men of this age, especially those who are poor or in any way afflicted, these are the joys and hopes, the griefs and anxieties of the followers of Christ. Indeed, nothing genuinely human fails to raise an echo in their hearts. For theirs is a community composed of men. United in Christ, they are led by the Holy Spirit in their journey to the Kingdom of their Father and they have welcomed the news of salvation which is meant for every man. That is why this community realizes that it is truly linked with mankind and its history by the deepest of bonds (Gaudium et Spes, 1).

In a society increasingly defined by secular political theory, and increasingly polarized by the principles and implications of secular politics, it is for the Church to stand not merely “in the middle” as a “moderating force” in the world (although she often does play this role) but rather to stand as a “witness to hope” (the title of the great biography of St. John Paul II by George Weigel) that in the Incarnation, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ, the world is placed in a new relationship with God, a relationship that shines light in the darkness of human conflict, conflicts which seem otherwise irresolvable. The light we shine is not simply the “unapproachable light” of God in his Heaven, but the Light of Christ which has come and is coming into the world, the light which is willing to suffer for the true peace it offers.

As Christians we are a reflection of that light. Let us be that reflection in our world, in our city. We cannot allow ourselves to be defined in speech and action merely by the political poles of the secular conflict. “For our struggle is not against flesh and blood” but against the “spiritual forces of evil in high places” (Ephesians 6:12), which means forces not merely of this world. We know that such forces have been forever conquered by Christ. Let us make solidarity with the power of Christ, who made solidarity with the world (John 3:16) in order to save it.

GREETING BY FR. CYPRIAN CZOP, O.M.I.

Trwa Okres Wielkanocny w liturgii. W dzisiejszym czytaniu z Ewangelii św. Łukasza Jezus zmartwychwstały przychodzi do apostołów, aby umocnić ich słabą wiarę: „Czemu jesteście zmieszani i dlaczego wątpliwości budzą się w waszych sercach? Popatrzcie na moje ręce i nogi: to Ja jestem. Dotknijcie Mnie i przekonajcie się: duch nie ma ciała ani kości, jak widzicie, że Ja mam”. Pozwala im się dotknąć, spożywa też z nimi posiłek, aby się przekonali, że nie jest duchem czy zjawą, ale ma ciało i rzeczywiście zmartwychwstał.

Dzisiaj Jezus chce umocnić także naszą wiarę, co jest potrzebne przede wszystkim nam w tych trudnych czasach – gdy króluje strach, cierpienie, niepewność jutra, związane z przedłużającym się czasem trwania pandemii koronawirusa, a także z innymi zjawiskami jak przemoc czy protesty na naszych ulicach. Co więcej, Jezus chce, abyśmy jak apostołowie kiedyś, tak i my obecnie, byli świadkami Jego śmierci, zmartwychwstania i żywej obecności w świecie: „Tak jest napisane: Mesjasz będzie cierpiał i trzeciego dnia zmartwychwstał; w imię Jego głoszone będzie nawrócenie i odpuszczenie grzechów wszystkim narodom, poczynawszy od Jeruzalem. Wy jesteście świadkami tego”. Czy jestem świadkiem zmartwychwstania Chrystusa wobec ludzi, wśród których żyję?

W tym tygodniu – w piątek – obchodzimy wspomnienie św. Wojciecha (Adalberta), głównego Patrona Polski. W najbliższą niedzielę natomiast ma odwiedzić naszą polską wspólnotę arcybiskup Bernard Hebda. Zachęcam do licznej obecności na Mszy św. o 11:30, aby spotkać się z naszym ordynariuszem.

COMING UP THIS WEEK IN LITURGY

21 kwietnia, środa – wspomnienie św. Anzelma, biskupa i doktora Kościoła

Anzelm urodził się w roku 1033 w Aosta w Piemontcie. Wstąpił do benedyktynów w Le Bec (dzisiejsza Francja), gdzie potem został opatem. Wykładał współbraciom nauki teologiczne, postępując jednocześnie szybko na drodze doskonałości. W roku 1093 wybrano go arcybiskupem Canterbury w Anglii. Mężny bojownik o wolność Kościoła dwa razy skazany był na wygnanie. Wielki uczony, zwany ojcem scholastyki, napisał wiele cennych dzieł ascetycznych, dogmatycznych i homiletycznych. Zmarł w roku 1109.

23 kwietnia, piątek – uroczystość św. Wojciecha, biskupa i męczennika, głównego patrona Polski (w USA wspomnienie dowolne)



Wojciech lub Adalbert z Pragi urodził się około roku 956 w Libicach (Czechy). Pochodził z możnego rodu Sławników. W roku 983 został biskupem Pragi. Z powodu waśni rodowych musiał dwukrotnie opuszczać swoją stolicę. W Rzymie wstąpił do opactwa benedyktyńskiego. Był misjonarzem na Węgrzech i w Polsce. Z Polski wyruszył do Prus, gdzie zginął z ręki pogan 23 kwietnia 997 roku. Jego relikwie spoczywają w katedrze gnieźnieńskiej.

23 kwietnia, piątek – wspomnienie św. Jerzego, męczennika

Jerzy oddał życie za wiarę prawdopodobnie w roku 304 podczas prześladowania Dioklecjana. W Liddzie (Palestyna) już w IV w. zbudowano kościół pod jego wezwaniem. Kult świętego rozszerzył się szybko w Kościele Wschodnim i Zachodnim, a liczne bractwa, stowarzyszenia i zawody przyjęły go za swego patrona.


HOLY CROSS FRONT STAIRWAY REPLACEMENT

We are all rightly proud of the magnificent architecture of Holy Cross Church, which wonderfully portrays a glorious faith heritage, a current community presence, and an enduring future reality. However, an enduring future reality has a pragmatic aspect that includes facility repair and maintenance.

The brickwork of the front stairway of the Church has undergone several partial repairs through the years. Severe masonry failures that now threaten its collapse in various areas led to a professional invasive investigation. This determined the need for a complete brick and mortar replacement, as well as back-up wall repair. The low bid award for this project is \$232,746.

We are blessed to have two major gifts totaling \$50,000 towards this project, \$25,000 of which is a matching gift. This is to ask for your generous support of our need to maintain our beautiful Church for current and future generations. No gift is too small. CELEBRATING THE WORK OF POLISH POET, VICTORIA JANDA

For Nature, Home, God, and Country

Did you know a Holy Cross parishioner was once nominated for a Pulitzer Prize? For more than five decades Victoria Janda was a literary and cultural leader for Polonia. Born in Novy Targ, in 1909 at age 21 she founded a young adult group in Minneapolis for Polish Americans - Sokolice.
