## THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

As the month of May begins, Catholics all over the world turn their hearts and prayers to Mary, Mother of God and of the Church, Queen of Heaven. It is at this time, in May, that in different countries and cultures in the Christian world, various Marian devotions, rites and services are organized, whether in churches and chapels, in schools, homes of the faithful and even outside in fields, gardens or forests. There are traditions of decorating “May altars” with beautiful flowers that bloom in this month. Around such altars, in churches or in private houses, people of all generations, children, even whole families, gather to pray to Our Lady.

There is no firm structure as to the content of a May devotion. It usually includes the singing of Marian hymns, readings from Scriptures, and reflection. In churches, exposition of the Blessed Sacrament can take place to underline the Christocentric character of Marian devotion. Countless images and statues of Mary are venerated by means of devout prayers, anthems, processions, or May Crownings. At Holy Cross Parish, we also had the privilege to follow the tradition of “May Crowning” last Sunday. During this rite, we pray: “Lord, bless us as we crown this image of the Mother of your Son. We confess Christ to be the King of creation and call upon Mary, our Queen. May we walk in their likeness, spending ourselves for the sake of others. Content with our place in this life, may we one day hear your voice inviting us to take our place in heaven and receive the crown of victory”. One of the most popular prayers for May Marian devotions is the Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary, also known as the Litany of Loreto. Loreto is a city in Italy where the usage of the Litany was recorded already in 1558. Recently, that is on June 20, 2020, the Holy See introduced three new invocations to Mary in the Litany of Loreto: “Mother of Mercy”, “Mother of Hope” and “Solace of Migrants”.

The liturgical calendar contains many Marian celebrations this month, too: the Memorial of Our Lady of Fatima (May 13), the Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church (Monday after Pentecost, this year it is May 24), the Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary (May 31). There are also local Marian observances, such as the Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Queen of Poland (May 3) or the Memorial of Our Lady of Sheshan in Shanghai, China (May 24).

Pope St. Paul VI in his short and perhaps little-known encyclical “Mense Maio” (“The Month of May”) (April 29, 1965) describes the meaning of this Marian month, and how much impact the traditions, prayers and devotions practiced in May have for the Christian people: “The month of May is... a month which the piety of the faithful has long dedicated to Mary, the Mother of God. Our heart rejoices at the thought of the moving tribute of faith and love which will soon be paid to the Queen of Heaven in every corner of the earth. For this is the month during which Christians, in their churches and their homes, offer the Virgin Mother more fervent and loving acts of homage and veneration; and it is the month in which a greater abundance of God's merciful gifts comes down to us from our Mother's throne” (MM 1).

The Pope reminds us that when we honor Mary, we come closer to her Son, Jesus: “Since Mary is rightly to be regarded as the way by which we are led to Christ, the person who encounters Mary cannot help but encounter Christ likewise. For what other reason do we continually turn to Mary except to seek the Christ in her arms, to seek our Savior in her, through her, and with her?” (MM 2). The context of the encyclical is very specific - Pope St. Paul VI, encourages us to pray in May, through the intercession of Mary, for urgent needs of the Church and the world: For fruitful completion of the works of the Second Vatican Council (it would be concluded six months later, on December 8, 1965) and its correct implementation in the Church as well as for the world peace.

We have a lot to pray for in our troubled times. May our Marian devotions and prayers in this month of May 2021 help us receive the graces that we, the Church and the world need today: “Throughout this month of May, let us offer our pleas to the Mother of God with greater devotion and confidence, so that we may obtain her favor and her blessings. Even if the grave sins of men provoke God's justice and merit His just punishments, we must not forget the he is “the Father of mercies and the God of all comfort,” that He has appointed Mary most holy as the generous steward of His merciful gifts... May she who experienced the cares and hardships of earthly life, the weariness of daily toil, the hardships and trials of poverty, and the sorrows of Calvary, come to aid the needs of the Church and the human race” (MM 11-12).

Trwa miesiąc maj, szczególnie poświęcony w naszej katolickiej tradycji czci Matki Bożej. Nabożeństwa majowe połączone ze śpiewem Litanii Loretańskiej odprawiane są w naszym kościele w niedziele po Eucharystii o 11:30 i w piątki w czasie adoracji Najświętszego Sakramentu pół godziny przed Mszą – o 18:30. Gorąco wszystkich zapraszam do udziału w tradycyjnych „majówkach”.

Obchodząc niedawno uroczystości głównych patronów Polski: św. Wojciecha oraz Matki Bożej Królowej Polski, nie zapomnijmy o jeszcze jednym patronie naszej Ojczyzny – św. Stanisławie, biskupie i męczenniku. Jego liturgiczna uroczystość przypadała wczoraj, 8 maja. Stanisław urodził się w Szczepanowie, na terenie dzisiejszej diecezji tarnowskiej, około roku 1030. Po studiach w Paryżu otrzymał święcenia kapłańskie, a w roku 1072 został biskupem krakowskim. Jako gorliwy pasterz zabiegał o dobro wiernych, wspomagał ubogich i co roku odwiedzał kapłanów swojej diecezji. W roku 1079 zginął śmiercią męczeńską, zabity na rozkaz króla Bolesława Śmiałego, któremu wypominał jego nadużycia.



W najbliższą niedzielę na Mszy o godz. 11:30 ośmioro dzieci z polskich rodzin naszej wspólnoty przystąpi do Pierwszej Komunii Świętej. W piątek o godz. 18:00 odbędzie się nabożeństwo pierwszej spowiedzi św. dla tych dzieci i ich rodzin. Otoczmy ich swoją modlitwą w tym czasie i wspólnie radujmy się z łask, które otrzymują zarówno dzieci, jak ich najbliżsi.

COMING UP THIS WEEK IN LITURGY

**13 maja, czwartek – wspomnienie Najświętszej Maryi Panny Fatimskiej**

13 maja 1917 roku w Fatimie, w Portugalii, Najświętsza Dziewica ukazała się trojgu dzieciom: Łucji, Hiacyncie i Franciszkowi. Poleciała im modlitwę, zwłaszcza różańcową, i pokutę za grzeszników, a dla uproszenia pokoju w świecie – nabożeństwo do Niepokalanego Serca Maryi. W czasie ostatniego objawienia 13 października 1917 roku Pani powiedziała, że jest Matką Bożą Różańcową, przybywającą wzywać ludzi, by już dłużej nie obrażali Boga grzechami i by codziennie odmawiali różaniec.

**14 maja, piątek – święto św. Macieja apostoła**

Święty Maciej został wybrany na Apostoła na miejsce Judasza. Według tradycji miał głosić Ewangelię w Judei, a potem w Etiopii, gdzie poniósł śmierć męczeńską około 50 roku.

**15 maja, sobota – świętej Zofii, wdowy i męczennicy**

Św. Zofia Rzymska – (Zofia w jęz. greckim znaczy „Mądrość”) była pobożną wdową, tak też wychowywała swoje córki, noszące imiona trzech cnót chrześcijańskich: Pistis, Elpis i Agape (Wiara, Nadzieja i Miłość). Gdy odmówiła złożenia ofiary bogini Dianie, jej nieletnie córki poddano mękom na jej oczach. Nie zalamano to matki, która zachęcała je do wytrwania. Po śmierci córek św. Zofia, pozostawiona przy życiu (bądź ze względu na swoje męstwo, bądź dlatego, by cierpiała po stracie dzieci) zmarła z rozpaczy na ich grobie. Inne źródła podają, że wraz z córkami poniosła śmierć męczeńską. Jako miejsce tych zdarzeń podawany jest Rzym lub Mediolan. Zofia to święta Kościoła katolickiego, prawosławnego, ormiańskiego, koptyjskiego i syryjskiego.


### HOLY CROSS FRONT STAIRWAY REPLACEMENT

The brickwork of the front stairway of the Church has undergone several partial repairs through the years. Severe masonry failures that now threaten its collapse in various areas led to a professional invasive investigation. This determined the need for a complete brick and mortar replacement, as well as back-up wall repair. The low bid award for this project is \$232,746.

We are blessed to have two major gifts totaling \$50,000 towards this project, \$25,000 of which is a matching gift. 
