He was amazed at their lack of faith.

### PROFESSION OF FAITH

COMING UP THIS WEEK IN LITURGY

**6 lipca, wtorek – wspomnienie św. Marii Goretti, dziewicy i męczennicy**

Maria urodziła się w roku 1890 w ubogiej rodzinie wieśniaczej w Corinaldo we Włoszech. Była trzecim z siedmiorga dzieci. Po śmierci ojca Maria pomagała matce w obowiązkach domowych i opiekowała się rodzeństwem. Często oddawała się modlitwie. W roku 1902, jako 11-letnia dziewczynka, zginęła broniąc się przed próbą zgwałcenia jej przez 20-letniego sąsiada, któremu przebaczyła na łożu śmierci. Na jej ciele znaleziono 14 ran. Kanonizowana w Rzymie w 1950 r. przez papieża Piusa XII.

**6 lipca, wtorek – wspomnienie św. Marii Teresy Ledóchowskiej, dziewicy (w Polsce)**

Maria Teresa urodziła się 29 kwietnia 1863 r. w Austrii. Otrzymała głęboko religijne wychowanie. Mając lat 27 zrezygnowała ze stanowiska damy dworu i wszystkie swoje talenty literackie i organizacyjne poświęciła dziełu misji afrykańskich. W 1895 r. złożyła śluby zakonne jako pierwsza sodaliska założonego przez siebie stowarzyszenia misyjnego, zwanego Sodalicją św. Piotra Klawera - przekształconego później na zgromadzenie Sióstr Misjonek św. Piotra Klawera (klawerianki). Zmarła 6 lipca 1922 r. w Rzymie i tam spoczywa. Jest patronką dzieł misyjnych w Polsce. Beatyfikował ją papież św. Paweł VI w 1975 r.

## AS THE WORLD SPINS, THE CROSS STANDS FIRM

### E PLURIBUS UNUM



The meaning of these Latin words are perhaps familiar enough to Americans: “out of many, one”. Of course everything is more profound when expressed in Latin! They are emblazoned on the Great Seal of the United States of America, fluttering on a ribbon held in the beak of a golden eagle. Do they evoke a promise, a hope, a prayer? Perhaps something of all three.

As the American experience (and experiment) continues to run its course through time, we see the challenges of realizing unity in diversity. We understand the beauty of a federal system with its insistence upon subsidiarity, localism, and state’s rights. We also understand the strength of the synergy that makes us more than the mere parts that make us up.

This Fourth of July weekend as we pray for our nation at this critical time, I thought that these words of our traditional motto were fitting to remember: **E PLURIBUS UNUM**. A variant of this phrase was present in St. Augustine’s Confessions, but perhaps more famously in Cicero’s echo of the Greek philosopher Pythagoras’ sentiment: “When each person loves the other as much as himself, it makes one out of many (unum fiat ex pluribus)”. Amazingly, it is only a self-transcending love that unites us with others in friendship.

Isn’t this what Christ Himself said as He prayed for His disciples—and thereby for us—the night before He died to set us free? “May they all be one, as you Father and I are one”—**UT OMNES UNUM SINT**. Perhaps that prayer for unity among believers and neighbors can be made more efficacious as we strive to live that unity at Holy Cross as one parish comprised of distinct campuses, histories and traditions. Unity in diversity is not automatic or easy, but when obtained, it is incredibly powerful to reveal the very love of God to the world.

I wish to offer a few practical notes on some of the transitions we are currently living in our parish:

This past weekend we were able to send off Fr. Hagan and Fr. Evans as they become co-pastors at St. Mary’s in St. Paul’s Lowertown neighborhood. Fr. Hagan will also serve as a hospital chaplain at Regions Hospital and Fr. Evans will continue as chaplain for the University of St. Thomas’ Catholic Studies program.
