




THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING

Genesis 2:18-24

The Lord God said: "It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a suitable partner for him." So the Lord God formed out of the ground various wild animals and various birds of the air, and he brought them to the man to see what he would call them; whatever the man called each of them would be its name. The man gave names to all the cattle, all the birds of the air, and all wild animals; but none proved to be the suitable partner for the man. So the Lord God cast a deep sleep on the man, and while he was asleep, he took out one of his ribs and closed up its place with flesh. The Lord God then built up into a woman the rib that he had taken from the man. When he brought her to the man, the man said: "This one, at last, is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; this one shall be called 'woman,' for out of 'her man' this one has been taken." That is why a man leaves his father and mother and clings to his wife, and the two of them become one flesh.

SECOND READING

Hebrews 2:9-11

Brothers and sisters: He “for a little while” was made “lower than the angels,” that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone. For it was fitting that he, for whom and through whom all things exist, in bringing many children to glory, should make the leader to their salvation perfect through suffering. He who consecrates and those who are being consecrated all have one origin. Therefore, he is not ashamed to call them “brothers.”

GOSPEL

Mark 10:2-16

The Pharisees approached Jesus and asked, “Is it lawful for a husband to divorce his wife?” They were testing him. He said to them in reply, “What did Moses command you?”

They replied, “Moses permitted a husband to write a bill of divorce and dismiss her.” But Jesus told them, “Because of the hardness of your hearts he wrote you this commandment. But from the beginning of creation, God made them male and female. For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh. So they are no longer two but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, no human being must separate.” In the house the disciples again questioned Jesus about this. He said to them, “Whoever divorces his wife and marries another commits adultery against her; and if she divorces her husband and marries another, she commits adultery.” And people were bringing children to him that he might touch them, but the disciples rebuked them. When Jesus saw this he became indignant and said to them, “Let the children come to me; do not prevent them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Amen, I say to you, whoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a child will not enter it.” Then he embraced them and blessed them, placing his hands on them.

TWO HEARTY WELCOMES TO HOLY CROSS PARISH STAFF



Hello, and thank you for the warm welcome here at Holy Cross. Introductions can be difficult at times, especially when starting a new job with a responsibility to so many people. How about some personal history? I was born in Albany, Minnesota. My family has roots in Winona and Stearns County going back to the 1880s. My family was a military family and we moved shortly after I was born and I have lived in Iowa, Arkansas, Ohio, Ukraine and South Dakota before returning to Minnesota. I lived for many years in Cincinnati and it was there I earned my Associates, Bachelors and Masters Degrees. These degrees were earned at Cincinnati State, Wilmington College and Xavier University.

I was also introduced to the unique position of working for Church there. I worked for a region of three combined churches on the eastside of Cincinnati: St. Cecilia, St. Anthony and St. Margaret – St. John. During this time I was offered the opportunity to serve in the Peace Corps in Ukraine as a Community Economic Development volunteer. In August of 2019 I began a journey of learning the Ukrainian culture and language. I lived in two cities during my time in Ukraine: Berdychiv and Lutsk. After training in Berdychiv I was assigned to a small village outside of Lutsk. Part of the Peace Corps' mission in Ukraine is to assist non-governmental organizations with improving the efficiency of their operations. I did this for a community called Boratyn. Work had just started when Covid required the Peace Corps to evacuate all volunteers worldwide. I returned back to Cincinnati after about eight months of service.

Since my time in the Peace Corps I worked as a staff accountant in Cincinnati and then as a senior accountant in Sioux Falls, South Dakota. Looking back on the past few years spent using my professional abilities in non-profit service I realized that I missed many of the aspects of parish life. After interviewing at a few other churches and non-profits, I discovered Holy Cross. After my second meeting with Fr. Howe and Carita, I knew it was a good fit. I am excited to be back in this role and I am very thankful for the warm greetings I have received. I am looking forward to meeting many more of you in the days to come.
