




But it shall not be so among you. Rather, whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all. For the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many.”

PROFESSION OF FAITH



NIE LĘKAJcie SIĘ!

XXI Dzień Papieski, niedziela, 17 października 2021 roku

Interpretacja hasła



“Nie lękajcie się otworzyć drzwi Chrystusowi!” Ta najbardziej chyba znana na świecie wypowiedź św. Jana Pawła II pochodzi z jego homilii wygłoszonej 22 października 1978 roku podczas Mszy świętej na placu św. Piotra w Rzymie, inaugurującej jego pontyfikat, homilii programowej dla kolejnych 27 lat działalności polskiego papieża.

Odniesienie do wiary św. Piotra i do jego misji pozwala nam zrozumieć, jak na swój rozumujący się pontyfikat

patrzył św. Jan Paweł II. Jedynym celem misji Kościoła i nowego papieża jest wskazywanie na Chrystusa, a poprzez to odpowiadanie na ludzki głód Boga i pytanie o sens życia: „Bracia i Siostry, nie lękajcie się przysiągnąć Chrystusa i przyjąć Jego władzę, pomóżcie Papieżowi i wszystkim tym, którzy pragną służyć Chrystusowi, służyć człowiekowi i całej ludzkości. Nie lękajcie się, otwórzcie na oścież drzwi Chrystusowi. Dla Jego zbawczej władzy otwórzcie granice państw, systemów ekonomicznych i politycznych, szerokie dziedziny kultury, cywilizacji, rozwoju!”.

Celem Kościoła nie jest poszerzanie swojej doczesnej władzy, ale służba człowiekowi; wskazywanie na Chrystusa dla dobra człowieka. Odczytując na nowo papieską homilię po 43 latach należy postawić pytanie, czy Kościół jest wierny tej misji?

Pytanie o służbę stawia jeszcze jedno bardziej podstawowe pytanie: o szacunek dla człowieka, dla każdego człowieka. Na ten fundamentalny warunek życia społecznego, a także powodzenia misji Kościoła w pluralistycznym społeczeństwie Jan Paweł II zwraca uwagę w swojej homilii, kiedy mówi: „Zwracam się do wszystkich ludzi, do każdego człowieka (z jaką czcią apostoł Chrystusa musi wymawiać to słowo *człowiek*)”. Żyjemy w coraz bardziej podzielonym świecie, gdzie głębokie różnice poglądów politycznych i etycznych sprawiają często, że ludzie nie mogą już ze sobą rozmawiać. W tym podzielonym i skłóconym świecie Kościół jest posłany do każdego człowieka i z każdym człowiekiem chce rozmawiać, bo każdego człowieka dosięga miłujące spojrzenie Chrystusa – Zbawiciela.

Jedynie Chrystus, który ma moc przechodzenia mimo drzwi zamkniętych i dotarcia nawet do zamkniętego serca może odpowiedzieć na ludzkie lęki: przed przyszłością, utratą pracy, chorobą, a ostatecznie śmiercią. Dlatego właśnie św. Jan Paweł prosi w swojej inauguracyjnej homilii: „Dzisiaj często człowiek nie wie, co kryje się w jego wnętrzu, w głębokości jego duszy i serca. Tak często niepewny sensu życia na tej ziemi i ogarnięty zwątpieniem, które zamienia się w rozpacz. Pozwólcie więc, proszę was, błagam was z pokorą i zaufaniem! Pozwólcie Chrystusowi mówić do człowieka!”.

PAPAL DAY 2021: "DO NOT BE AFRAID"



"Brothers and sisters, do not be afraid to welcome Christ and accept his power. Help the Pope and all those who wish to serve Christ and with Christ's power to serve the human person and the whole of mankind. Do not be afraid. Open wide the doors for Christ. To his saving power open the boundaries of States, economic and political systems, the vast fields of culture, civilization and development. Do not be afraid. Christ knows *what is in man*. He alone knows it". With

these words, the newly elected Pope St. John Paul II addressed the Church and the world 43 years ago, on October 22, 1978, at St. Peter's Square in Rome, during inauguration of his Pontificate. His appeal "Do not be afraid!" is still so fitting to mankind today and serves as motto of the "Papal Day 2021" in Poland and elsewhere in the world, where the faithful venerate the memory and patrimony of the great Polish Pope.

John Paul II passed away on April 2, 2005, and was canonized on April 27, 2014. His patrimony lives on, however. One of interesting initiatives inspired by the person and teaching of Pope John Paul II is the Papal Day, celebrated this year for the 21st time. It is being organized yearly on a Sunday preceding the anniversary of election of Cardinal Karol Wojtyła as Pope John Paul II, that is October 16. The tradition of the Papal Day started in 2001 in the Catholic Church in Poland; the idea behind it was to express gratitude and closeness to the Holy Father in prayer, promote his teaching and celebrate his pontificate. After his passing, the idea lived on, developed and became popular in many parts of the world, including: Australia, USA, France, Germany, Great Britain and Kazakhstan. Here at Holy Cross Catholic Church in NE Minneapolis, we are celebrating Papal Day for the 17th time.

The date October 16 has been officially established as Pope John Paul II Day by the Polish Parliament in 2005, too. As stated in the official resolution, it is "a tribute to the greatest authority of the twentieth century, a man who reached into the sources of Christianity, taught us solidarity, courage and humility".

There are four dimensions of the Papal Day celebrations:
