

SECOND READING

It was fitting that we should have such a high priest: holy, innocent, undefiled, separated from sinners, higher than the heavens. He has no need, as did the high priests, to offer sacrifice day after day, first for his own sins and then for those of the people; he did that once for all when he offered himself. For the law appoints men subject to weakness to be high priests, but the word of the oath, which was taken after the law, appoints a son, who has been made perfect forever.

Rene of the scribes came to Jesus and asked him, "Which is the first of all the commandments?" Jesus replied, "The first is this: Hear, O Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. There is no other commandment greater than these." The scribe said to him, "Well said, teacher. You are right in saying, 'He is One and there is no other than he.' And 'to love him with all your heart, with all your understanding, with all your strength, and to love your neighbor as yourself' is worth more than all burnt offerings and sacrifices." And when Jesus saw that he answered with understanding, he said to him, "You are not far from the kingdom of God." And no one dared to ask him any more questions.

HOMILY

PROFESSION OF FAITH

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.



PLENARY INDULGENCE FOR THE DEAD IN PURGATORY

Aby uzyskać odpust za zmarłych związany z uroczystością Wszystkich Świętych i Dniem Zaduszny, należy nawiedzić kościół albo kaplicę publiczną, odmówić Ojciec nasz i Wierzę w Boga oraz wypełnić inne (ogólne) warunki uzyskania odpustu: stan łaski uświęcającej (brak nieodpuszczonego grzechu ciężkiego lub spowiedź sakramentalna), brak jakiegokolwiek przywiązania do grzechu, nawet powszedniego, przyjęcie Komunii św. i modlitwa według intencji Ojca Świętego. Odpust ten można uzyskać od południa dnia Wszystkich Świętych i przez cały Dzień Zaduszny.

Również wierni, którzy pobożnie nawiedzą cmentarz i przynajmniej w myśli pomodlą się za zmarłych, zyskują odpust, który może być ofiarowany za dusze w czyśćcu cierpiące; odpust ten w dniach od 1 do 8 listopada jest zupełny, a w ciągu roku cząstkowy.

AS THE WORLD SPINS, THE CROSS STANDS FIRM

BLESSED PIER GIORGIO FRASSATI, GOOD MONEY, & THE FULLFILLMENT OF ALL DESIRE



This past weekend I saw *Frassati*, an original play on the life of Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati put on by the Twin Cities' very own *Open Window Theatre*. I'll spare you a review of the play, but I do want to encourage you to go see it this weekend (the last days of its run). I also thought I'd share a bit of a reflection on how this portrayal of the great 20th century Blessed, who's become a global patron of young people, shed some light on another topic I've been thinking

a lot about lately: **money**.

As Christian living in a fast-paced, materialistic society, it can be easy for me to separate how I use money from my spiritual life and relationship with God. I've been challenged on this front by listening to a podcast called "Good Money," produced by New Polity (check it out!). One of the virtues associated with the proper use of money is *liberality*. Now, we tend to associate "liberality" with a particular side of the American political spectrum, but the word actually has a much deeper meaning that it'd be good to recover. With regards to money, a liberal man is an open-handed man, who freely gives his wealth, because he is not inordinately attached to it and knows it's all a gift from God, to steward, not to hoard. When we give freely and effusively, we become an icon of God. As I watched *Frassati*, I couldn't help but think: this man embodies liberality.

The young saint (he died of polio at the age of 24), it seems, couldn't help but give. The play opens with Blessed Pier Giorgio at his desk, taking record of his accounts—money given and lent and debts he's taken on to provide for the poor around him. This somewhat monotonous scene is brought into relief at the end of the play when the details of his funeral are recounted. Thousands upon thousands came to pay their gratitude and respects to the man whose giving (of his person and of his money) was for them an icon of the love of God. What Frassati had, he gave away: his money and himself.

What *Frassati* and "Good Money" have reminded me is that in all things, even money, I need to keep an eternal perspective. Frassati gave the way he did because he was convinced that God was his Father and that heaven was his home. His eternal perspective helped him realize the TRUE importance of the present—that it should be lived in loving trust and dependence upon the same God who we'll love for all eternity, imitating the liberality of His own Love. He took wisdom and courage from the saints who lived the Gospel with their whole lives, and he was constantly reminding his friends and family to keep eternity in mind.

About a year ago, I wrote a bulletin article on the importance of spiritual reading. In that article, I recommended a book entitled *The Fulfillment of All Desire* by Ralph Martin. I was reading the book at the time and was convicted about the importance of spiritual reading for maintaining a Biblical worldview and perspective for this present life. I've been in need of this sort of perspective recently and have picked up the book with a couple brothers for a 5:45AM weekly study session. The time has been invaluable.

It's easy to forget about God. It's easy to live a comfortable life and never think that each of us will in fact die one day. It's easy to walk through your day doing good things without any reference to the supernatural. It's easy to get distracted and bogged down in a world that's designed to distract you and fill you with desires for things you don't have. If you're like me and you need some reminders, I'd encourage you to check out "Good Money," go see Frassati (while you still can!), and pick up a copy of *The Fulfillment of All Desire*.
