As the World Spins, the Cross Stands Firm

THE FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY



The year of St. Joseph has just ended. He is a selfless father who protects us from evils, both seen and unseen, just as he did for Mary and Jesus when fleeing the murderous threats of Herod. This has been the role of St. Joseph: to protect the Church.

This was a unique year that has just passed, and some modern-day seers say that St. Joseph had a special role

to play. This is based on 2 Thessalonians 2:5-10. "Do not be deceived; for that day will not come, unless the rebellion comes first, and the man of lawlessness is revealed. Do you not remember that when I was still with you I told you this? And you know what is restraining him now so that he may be revealed in his time. For the mystery of lawlessness is already at work; only he who now restrains it will do so until he is out of the way. And then the lawless one will be revealed, and the Lord Jesus will slay him with the breath of his mouth and destroy him by his appearing and his coming. The coming of the lawless one by the activity of Satan will be with all power and with pretended signs and wonders, and with all wicked deception for those who are to perish, because they refused to love the truth and so be saved."

St. Joseph is believed to be the "restrainer" whose intercession helped defend the faith of the Church Militant and held back the "lawless" one. Here is what one of those seers, Fr. Michel Rodrique, via a message from St. Michael, has said the next phase will be. "When Saint Joseph retires, the Immaculate Heart of Mary will initiate the beginnings of the Triumph of her Immaculate Heart for her children and for the Church. The Church will go through the pains of a purification through which the Virgin Mary will accompany her as Mother of Sorrows. Some of her children will be martyrs; they will wear the palm of the Victory of Christ on the day of the Triumph of the Immaculate Heart of Mary."


On the day after December 8th, we celebrated Blessed Juan Diego, and on the 12th it was the feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. This recalls Mary's intervention through her immaculate heart to turn various tribes (including the Aztecs) away from human sacrifice and toward her Son's sacred heart. How appropriate this is, especially considering the practice of cutting out human hearts in Aztec practices.

Now it is Mary's time. How fitting it would be for Mary to return to the Americas in order to turn us from our human sacrifices performed in Planned Parenthood clinics across the land. This is indeed possilbe, as the Supreme Court is considering cases that could overturn Roe vs Wade. Of course, the powers of the Lawless One will lash out, and the purification will begin. However, there will be shelters prepared by the pure heart of St. Joseph and the holy hearts of Mary and Jesus.

Here are the last words from St. Michael: "Small herd, do not be afraid. Look with the eyes of faith, hope, and love. The shelters are under the special protection of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. This is how her Immaculate Heart wanted it. Can you not now see the work of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph? Everything you need to know has been said. Live in confidence to accomplish the Divine Will, and repeat this prayer often: Jesus, I trust in you!"

LIST RADY DS. RODZINY KONFERENCJI EPISKOPATU POLSKI NA NIEDZIELE ŚWIETEJ RODZINY

RODZINA DROGO DO OWIO TOOCI

Umiłowani w Chrystusie siostry i bracia!

Liturgia dzisiejszej niedzieli zachęca nas do ufnego zawierzenia naszych rodzin Świętej Rodzinie oraz do odnowienia przyrzeczeń małżeńskich. Perykopa ewangeliczna o odnalezieniu Jezusa przez rodziców w świątyni opowiada o relacjach, które łączyły Maryję, Józefa i Jezusa. Rodzice odnaleźli bezpieczeństwo, radość szczęśliwej rodziny i pokój serca, gdy budowali wzajemne więzi na Bogu. Święta Rodzina uczy nas czułej, odpowiedzialnej i ofiarnej miłości, umiejętności słuchania, gotowości do pomocy i nieustannego poszukiwania Bożej woli w codziennym życiu.

Małżeństwo chrześcijańskie nie opiera się wyłącznie na uczuciach i wzajemnej umowie. Miłość jest wzniosła i piękna, ale też bywa zmienna i ulotna. Kobieta i mężczyzna w sakramencie malżeństwa otrzymują pomoc od Boga: to co ludzkie i kruche zostaje potwierdzone i wzmocnione Bożą łaską. Jakże budujący jest óbraz pełnych szacunku dla siebie małżonków, otwartych na życie i troszczących się o dzieci, którzy traktują rodzinę jak skarb dar od Boga. Godne uznania są również rodziny wielopokoleniowe. Jednak byłoby naiwnością nie dostrzegać kryzysu malżeństwa i rodziny. Zasmucają rozpadające się malżeństwa, przeróżne uzależnienia, ucieczka przed odpowiedzialnością, materializm i konsumpcjonizm. Podważane są fundamenty rodziny, co uderza w samą istotę małżeństwa jako związku kobiety i mężczyzny oraz lekceważona jest wartość życia od poczęcia do naturalnej śmierci. Rodzina jest święta i kluczowa dla właściwego rozwoju człowieka, dlatego nie należy jej poddawać eksperymentom społecznym lub wpływom współczesnych utopii. Warto więc przypomnieć pewne podstawowe elementy nauczania Kościoła na temat malżeństwa i rodziny. (cdn.)
