WHAT HAVE WE BEEN GIVEN AND WHAT WE ARE CALLED TO GIVE

"What do you possess that you have not received?" -1 Corinthians 4:7



St. Paul crystalized a simple and sublime truth in his first letter to the Corinthians: *all is gift*. Everything that we possess, we possess not on our own merits, but by gift, as stewards. A gift that is given always entails a task, a responsibility, something to be invested and shared. In our second reading today, St. Paul speaks of the "stewardship of God's grace that was given" to him (Eph. 3:2). He, like each of us, received a call from the Lord. This is true no matter what particular calling that we have received, no matter how

seemingly humble or significant it might be.

Today's Feast of Epiphany recalls the offering of gold, frankincense and myrrh by the mysterious magi from the East. We should likewise ask the question of what gift we are called to render to the Lord? How can I give Him the gift of my own heart and a precious sacrifice of what is most dear to me? As we ask what we must give, we can also ponder what we have been given, what we have received.

Certainly we might ponder what we have been given in the form of Christmas gifts. As the time of preparation for Christmas is focused on getting gifts to give to others, so the time after Christmas should entail the expressing of thanks and appreciation for what has been given. As we express our gratitude and write our *Thank Yons* we do something fundamentally human. Our appreciation for gifts can then point us in the direction of appreciation for the supreme gift of Supernatural Life and Faith. As Christ Himself is the great gift of this season, we ought to learn to express the deepest kind of thanks there is. As the words of the Psalm run, "How can I repay the LORD for all the great good done for me?" (Psalm 116:12). Our repeated and wholehearted presence at Mass Sunday after Sunday is the only full expression of appreciation for the gift of Christmas. In Christ's Birth as Savior and Redeemer we have received the Gift of gifts, which is also a great responsibility and shared mission.

As I look back on the recent Christmas Festivities I am deeply appreciative for each of you: for our parishioners, guests, friends and neighbors. I am grateful for all who helped to prepare for such splendid Christmas liturgies. I think of those who worked extremely hard to decorate our churches so beautifully and for those who clean and maintain our churches and grounds. I express my thanks as well to our musicians and choir members under the direction of Sam Backman, Arlys Krauter and Chris Brand, and to all of our lectors, ushers, greeters and servers and to those who worked behind the scenes. I am grateful to the parish staff and all for all of our volunteers. I am also very grateful for my brother priests and Deacon Evander with whom I am called to serve. Truly God has blessed our parish through the beautiful celebration of Christmas we have just experienced. And we still have another week of the Christmas season!

As 2022 gets underway, let us take stock of our abundant gifts and render our hearts to God in gratitude. For all those who have shared Christmas greetings, cards or gifts, with me and the staff, I want to express my deep appreciation for your presence and your spirit of involvement and service in our parish.

LIST RADY DS. RODZINY KONFERENCJI EPISKOPATU POLSKI NA NIEDZIELĘ ŚWIĘTEJ RODZINY (CZ. 2)

RODZINA BOGIEM SILNA

Umiłowani w Chrystusie siostry i bracia!

Św. Jan Paweł II określił rodzinę jako pierwszą i podstawową droge Kościola (*LdR* 2). Rodzina jest w wymiarze ogólnospołecznym i religijnym najstarszą powszechną i naturalną wspólnotą, która funkcjonuje we wszystkich kulturach. Można stwierdzić, że jest ona najcenniejszym dobrem ludzkości (FC 1). Rodzina stanowi egzystencjalny horyzont człowieka i w niej rodzą się życiowe powołania. Pełne oddania życie w rodzinie zgodnie z zamysłem Boga jest drogą prowadzącą do zbawienia. Pomimo kryzysu życia rodzinnego pragnienie trwałej miłości małżeńskiej i bezpiecznej rodziny jest wciąż zapisane glęboko w sercu człowieka.

Bł. kard. Stefan Wyszyński wielokrotnie wzywał rodziny, aby były silne Bogiem, gdyż tylko wówczas będą zdolne pokonać trudności i przetrwać nawet największe zyciowe burze. Znaczenie rodziny staje się w pełni zrozumiałe dopiero w powiązaniu z Bożym Narodzeniem i osobą Jezusa Chrystusa. W Chrystusie zawiera się pełna prawda o człowieku, widzianym perspektywie tajemnicy Stworzenia, jak zarówno i Odkupienia. Ten, który jest obrazem Boga niewidzialnego (Kol 1, 15), jest zarazem doskonałym człowiekiem. Chrystus objawia w pełni człowieka samemu człowiekowi. Wzrastał w Nazarecie w zaciszu środowiska domowego, wśród codziennych zajęć, modlitwy i kontaktów z sąsiadami. Jego rodzina przyjęła strzegła Go z miłością, wprowadzała w posłuszeństwie wobec tradycji religijnej i towarzyszyła Mu aż do osiągnięcia dojrzałości i rozpoczęcia publicznej działalności. W rodzinie Jezus czynił postępy w mądrości, w latach i łasce u Boga i u ludzi (Łk 2,52).

Wkroczenie Boga w historię świata pozostaje w ścisłym związku z ludzką rodziną. Nie już bardziej doniosłego i świętego nie może wydarzyć się w rodzinie. Od momentu Wcielenia rodzina jest swoistym sanktuarium, w którym zamieszkał Bóg.

Szczególnym wyróżnieniem dla rodziny jest podniesienie małżeństwa do godności sakramentu, a więc widzialnego skutecznego znaku łaski Bożej. O znaczeniu rodziny przekonuje również fakt, że bywa ona nazywana Kościołem domowym, a Kościół, próbując opisać swoją istotę, sięga wiele razy do obrazów z życia rodzinnego. Kościół określa siebie rodziną Bożą, Oblubienicą Chrystusa lub Matką, a Boga nazywa Ojcem. Wewnętrzna jedność rodziny, jej nakierowanie

na życie w kontekście relacji ofiarnej miłości, sprawiają, że jest

ona obrazem Kościoła.

PICK UP BLESSED CHALK THIS WEEKEND

On the Feast of the Epiphany, it is customary to mark the entrance with one's home with chalk each year, and to say a blessing with the following text:

"On the Feast of the Epiphany, the family gathers to ask God's blessing on their home and on those who live in or visit the home. It is an invitation for Jesus to be a daily guest in our home, our comings and goings, our conversations, our work and play, our joys and sorrows. A traditional way of doing this is to use chalk to write an inscription above the home's entrance. It can also be written somewhere inside the home, but especially over the lintel of exterior doors.

20 + C + M + B + 22

The letters C, M, B have two meanings: They are the initials of the traditional names of the three magi: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. The "+" signs represent the Cross of Christ and 2022 is the year.

RITE OF BLESSING:

All make the Sign of the Cross.

Leader: Peace be to this house and to all who dwell here, in the name of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God.

+A Scripture Reading from Matthew 2:1-12 is read. +Using chalk, write the inscription on the outside of your house or inside above the front main entrance.

All: Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who live here and all who visit. May we be blessed with health, kindness of heart, gentleness and the keeping of your law. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our love for each other may extend to all. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen."
