2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time - Fr. Leo

Last week Jesus was revealed as the beloved Son of God with whom God is well pleased. Today Jesus' glory is revealed as water is turned into wine. And not just any wine, the best wine! What is also great, is that this revelation takes place at a wedding feast where a community of family and friends are gathered, and in the midst of them, the first revelation is given of Christ's glory.

Witnessing the water made wine, the disciples begin to believe in him. Here, it could sound like they were attracted to him because he was a miracle worker. And I'm sure that did influence the hopes they placed in him. Something Jesus would have to address later in teaching about the suffering servant. I think it is good to remember however, that the disciples had already sacrificed much to follow Jesus, but now their faith could take on a new dimension. Jesus was so in tune with the cosmic Christ, that he could move beyond time and space and have an effect on material things, changing water into wine.

It is precisely this in-tune-with the Spirit that is the real witness of the Son of God. Jesus isn't doing this to show his power, but to show God's power that can also be revealed through us! Thus we read in First Corinthians about the gifts of the Spirit given to all to be manifest in different ways through different gifts. Jesus' level of Spiritual life is what he wants us to have. Jesus even said we would do greater works than he through the power of the Holy Spirit.

In the Gospel Jesus transformed water into wine. Let his act of love be a metaphor for the transformation Christ wants to make in each one of us. Through the Spirit we are to be transformed into vessels of the Spirit, so that through us and the use of our gifts, we too may transform all things into the Kingdom of God.

Lord, send your Spirit upon us that we may be transformed into the fullness of your likeness in mind, body and soul. Place this desire deeply and strongly in our souls we pray. Help us to be light in the darkness. Come Holy Spirit, and enkindle in us the fire of your love. Amen.

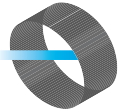
