A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Some of us may not be too familiar with a name of God that God Himself shares with us through the Sacred Scriptures. We obviously know the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We know the name of Jesus. But are you familiar with God revealing Himself as the Word? During the Christmas season we are exposed to God as the Word. Here are a few excerpts from the prologue of St. John's Gospel:

1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. 2 He was in the beginning with God; 3 all things were made through him, and without him was not anything made that was made. 4 In him was life, and the life was the light of men. 5 The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

9 The true light that enlightens every man was coming into the world. 10 He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world knew him not. 11 He came to his own home, and his own people received him not. 12 But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God; 13 who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God.

14 And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, full of grace and truth; we have beheld his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father.

The Word is Christ. Christ is God. The Word came among us to communicate with us so that we could know God, love Him, and serve Him. He became flesh and was born among us, in a manger. Through the Word communicating with us, we realize that we have the opportunity to be reconciled with God, to know union with Him, and to follow Him into eternal life. The world offers us so many different messages. Through the world's numerous means of communication – through the media, social media, political agendas, we receive a lot of promises. The world does not ultimately satisfy. Our hearts long to know salvation and Christ is the Savior. He is the Word that is true. He is the light amidst the darkness of the world. As we conclude the Christmas season, I hope and pray you are amongst the ones who receive Him. He reveals the most awesome and beautiful message. It is truly Good News! If we take time to meditate upon the Word and receive the Word, through the Scriptures and through the Word becoming flesh at Mass, we will be blessed. This experience should then inspire us to cooperate in making the Word known to the world.

In concluding my reflection, I express a word of gratitude. During the holiday season, I heard from a lot of you. I appreciate your support and charity. You spoke a kind word after Mass. You sent a very nice card. You messaged me. You, acting like Jesus, blessed me through your words. I see Jesus in you. You help me to realize that we have hope in God amidst the craziness of our world.

Thank you! I also think of the many other people you probably blessed in a similar way. This realization brings me joy. The light does shine amidst the darkness. The Word is most powerful, and our words can reflect His.

May the peace of the Lord be with you always.

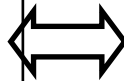

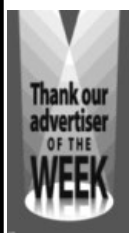
Happy New Year, Is updating your Beneficiaries one of your financial goals?

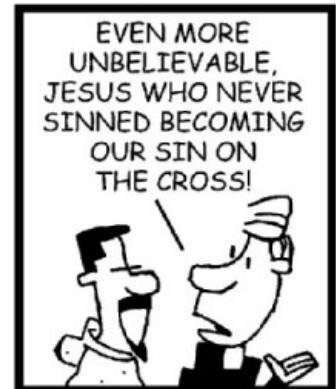
