A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

We are now in the month of February, and with February being so short, we will soon be in the month of March. With the beginning of March, we will begin the season of Lent this year. March 2 is Ash Wednesday. This time is a very blessed time for a lot of us as we anticipate Holy Week and Easter.

As many of us have realized, Covid has made planning difficult. Sometimes we have planned events and programs and ultimately, they get cancelled or postponed. Though this is the case, I am still trying! I am trying to coordinate a 40-hour weekend during the season of Lent. Some of you may be familiar with this experience. When I was in seminary and in Brainerd, I had the opportunity to be a part of a 40-hour weekends. The weekend serves as a retreat. It allows participants the opportunity to encounter the Lord in a deeper way by setting aside a solid block of time for the Lord. So often we only give Him a few minutes here and there. If you do a simple google search, you will find that 40 is a very significant number in the Bible. Jesus of course fasted and prayed for 40 days and nights. Even if people can only come for a part of the weekend, it should be a good opportunity to make the most of Lent.

I am hoping to have this 40-hour weekend March 18-20. I am planning to bring someone in from outside our parishes. I am excited about the possibility. I am asking you to block off this weekend if it is still open for you and your family. I will inform you about more details later. The hope is to have Eucharistic adoration, confession, a few different talks, and other prayerful opportunities to encounter the Lord throughout the course of the weekend. The 40-hour retreat will be held at St. Joe's.

I also ask you to block off the evening of Thursday, March 3. I plan to give a talk to help us to firm up our individual plans as we enter the season of Lent. The talk will correspond with the usual Eucharistic adoration time at St. Augustine's. The evening will begin at 6:30pm. I am extending the adoration time to 8:00pm that evening.

In this bulletin article, I also desire to update you in relation to a project, which is a tangent from everything else I have mentioned thus far. Back in November I mentioned to the congregations about putting together a booklet to help an individual plan for the funeral liturgy. Progress has been made in this regard. However, with the holidays, and people being in and out of the office, and our hope to develop the booklet more than I was originally thinking, the project will take more time. In the meantime, as I mentioned when I preached about this project, the best thing you can do is express in writing your desire for a funeral Mass and burial. With this note in a person's significant documents file, a person's family will clearly realize the person's intention. Once again, it saddens me and many clergy when devout Catholics do not have a funeral Mass and burial due to their family members being away from the Church, for whatever reasons. If you have questions about details that come with this planning, I am happy to talk.

May the peace of the Lord be with you always.

It's time to start thinking about if you qualify for a chartable distribution from your IRA during 2022.

What is a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)?

- Satisfied the Required Minimum Distribution (RMD)* from your IRA.
- May give up to \$100,000 tax free each year directly from your IRA to your charity of choice.
- Is for those over age 70 ½
- Distribution is not reported as income for tax purposes.
- Transfer is directly from your IRA administrator to your charity.

*Individuals born before 1949 Required Minimum Distribution is age 70 ½. Individuals born after 1949, RMD is age 72.

St. Joseph's Church, School and our Endowment Funds are all charities that can accept a Qualified Charitable Distribution from an IRA. Additionally, if you are over the age of 72, you can opt into a QCD anytime. FAITH FORMATION NEWS!

Each year the diocese requires all Faith Formation programs to conduct Circle of Grace training and report back to the office of Safe Environment. It is a challenge to offer this training in such a way as to convey important safety information while neither scandalizing nor boring kids to death. Despite my best efforts, there have been a few close calls with death by boredom. Thankfully all were able to be revived and no casualties have been reported.

This year instead of preparing a long presentation for the 6-10th grade where adults talk at the kids for an hour, we did something different. Each of our groups were assigned a topic that contributes to having a safe environment. We talked about a variety of subjects from gossip to situational awareness/trafficking prevention, and lots in between. Classes were directed to spend time discussing their topic and answering 4 questions about it then we gathered back together and each group shared their answers with the large group . Here's a few things I learned.

- 1. Physical violence often starts as cyber bullying.
- 2. Use of alcohol/drugs/vapes is more common than we think and it often happens at home.
- 3. Middle school girls know how to use social media and avoid all the things we tell them to watch out for.
- 4. High school boys understand that sexual violence is not a just a girls' problem.

My two favorite quotes from the night were "Welcome to my TED talk," and "The best way to create change is to lead by example." Kids know more than they get credit for. The things I learned mostly came as answers to the question "What is one thing you wish adults knew about this topic?" If you have a child or grandchild in Faith Formation, this is a great opportunity to find out what they think and to discover situations they encounter that never quite make it to the dinner table conversation. You might even be able to slide in a reminder that we all have a guardian angel ;) -God bless, Lisa
