As we enter the secular New Year of the Gregorian calendar, may you walk with our Lord and his Church throughout the Liturgical calendar and keep Jesus and the Saints close to your heart.

The feast of the Baptism of the Lord brings to mind the mystery of Christ's person and mission. At the same time it is an opportunity for us to give thanks to God for the innumerable gifts that he has given us since the day





