



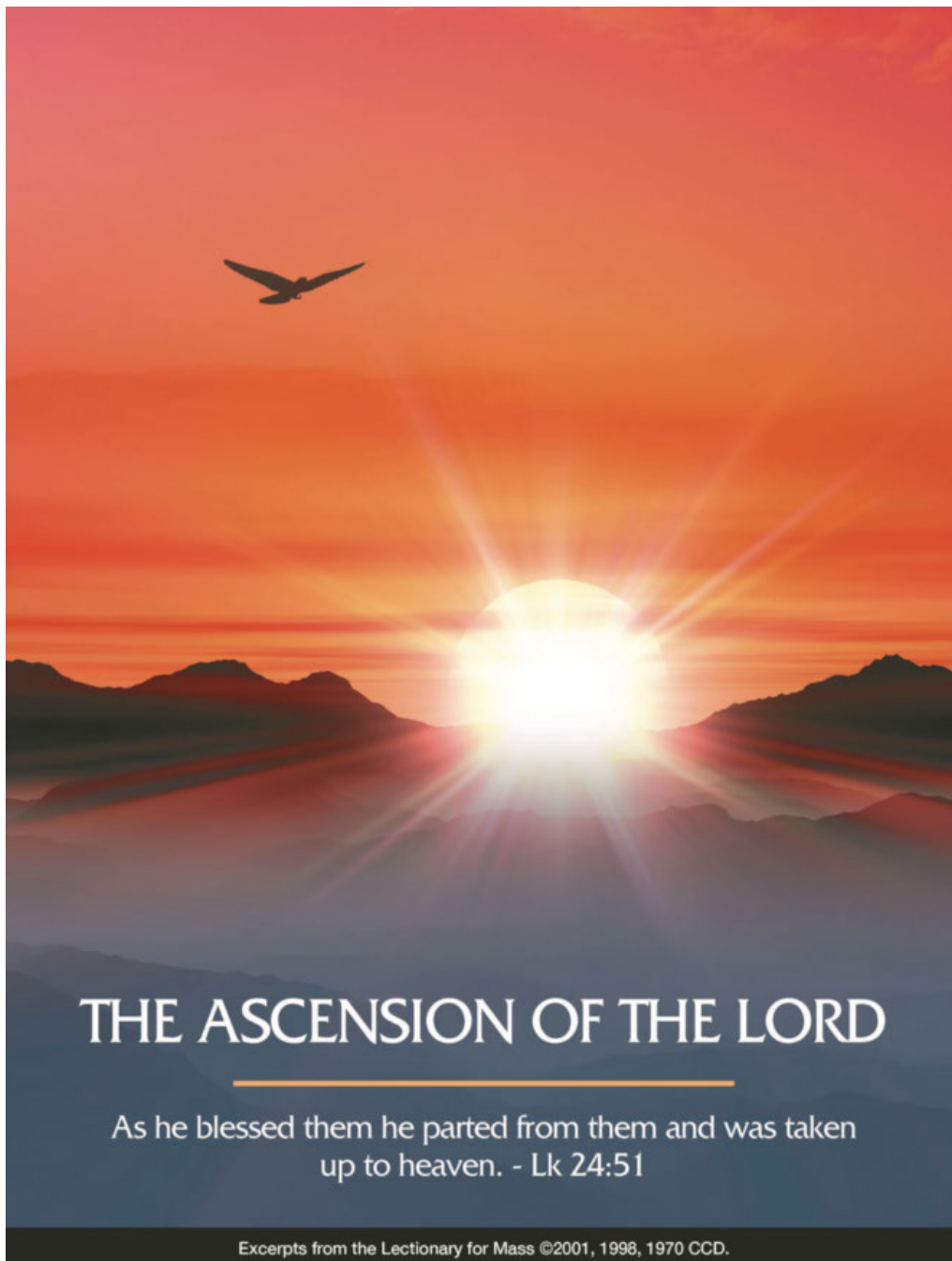

FROM THE PASTOR

Last weekend I announced that we would be celebrating the Extended Vigil of Pentecost on **Saturday, June 4th beginning at 6:00pm**. Particularly as our local Church seeks guidance from the Holy Spirit as we conclude the Synod Process, and recognizing our own need to continually pray for a deeper outpouring of the Paraclete here at our parish, it seems fitting to highlight the feast of Pentecost in this way. What will it look like, you may be wondering? What makes it an “extended vigil”? Here is a brief outline of what you will experience when you come next Saturday evening.


Following the opening procession, the two psalms and canticle from Evening Prayer for Pentecost will be sung. This is probably the part that will look the most “different” from our typical Sunday Mass, as this section of the Vigil comes from the Liturgy of the Hours of the Church. If you have participated in the Mass during the Night for Christmas, it will look something like how that Mass began.

At the conclusion of this section, we will enter into the Liturgy of the Word. Similar to the multiple readings and psalms for the Easter Vigil, we will hear four readings from the Old Testament highlighting the moments where God promises to pour out the spirit. This will conclude with the singing of the gloria, the reading from Paul’s Epistle and the Gospel. The rest of Mass will look like our normal Sunday Mass with one exception: the Magnificat, Mary’s hymn of praise from Luke 1:46-55 will be sung following distribution of Holy Communion.

Ultimately, the Extended Vigil is the normal Sunday Mass with a few additional readings and psalms. Nonetheless, it is a way for us to highlight liturgically the importance of the feast, and it will serve as a wonderful opportunity to pray that the Holy Spirit will be poured out upon us, will set our hearts on fire, and will move us to proclaim the Gospel throughout our community.

I hope you will attend our first celebration of this Extended Vigil!

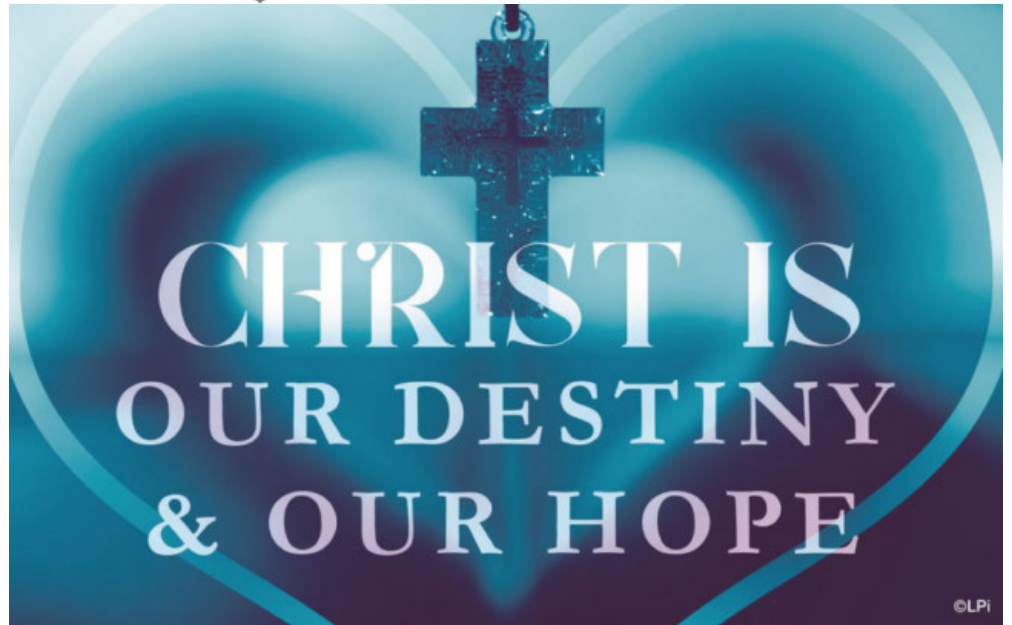


FIRST FRIDAY ADORATION

GOSPEL MEDITATION

We have the ability to walk with joyful hope! Jesus, during his earthly ministry, pointed the way to God's kingdom. What is finally understood about God's kingdom is that it is filled with the glory of Christ! We are all in the process of being emptied into and becoming one with Christ. We are new creations, clothed in Christ, made in God's very image and likeness, and on this incredible journey of glory. The Ascension allows us to see this truth about ourselves and it enlightens our hearts. Christ who was most perfectly, vividly, and brilliantly transfigured before the very eyes of the disciples will be our destiny. Seeing only imperfectly now, we will see perfectly then. We will bask in the brilliance of understanding and truth. Christ is our destiny and our hope. Alleluia!

Believing this with our whole heart allows us to walk proudly through life's darkness. There is so much that can upset us and weigh us down. Sometimes, life's news can not only be challenging but downright discouraging. Our own lives can easily become unsettled and empty. We rely too much on the things of this world to please us and wonder how we lost our excitement, enthusiasm, wonder, and joy. Getting so caught up in superficialities and unnecessary dependencies, we lose our axis, anchor, and center. Today, we can claim it back

again! We are reminded that it is not here that we find fulfillment but in the world of Christ yet to come. Jesus sent this promise of his Father upon his disciples, and he sends it to us as well.

Faith in God really has power to change things. In essence, all we have to do is believe in what God promises. God is ever close to us. He can even use what we see as the "useless scraps of life" to create "God moments" of inspiration and invitation. Then, even what is perceived as unpleasant, distasteful, or even hurtful can be transformed into an experience of joy. The Ascension of Christ becomes our reference point for self-knowledge. This firm anchor allows us to work through whatever comes our way and never be robbed of joy!

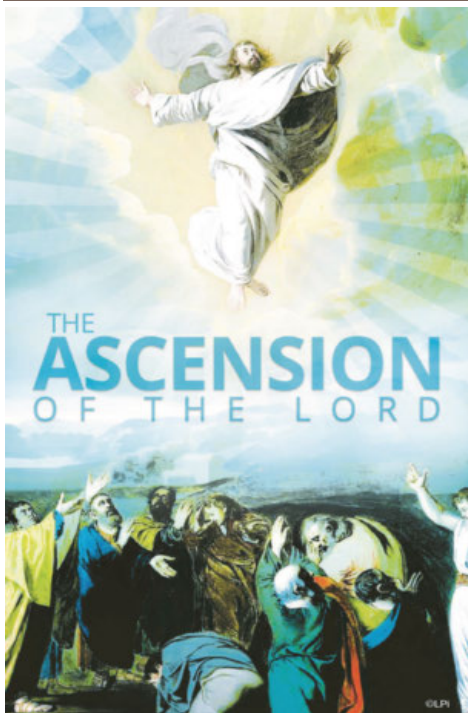

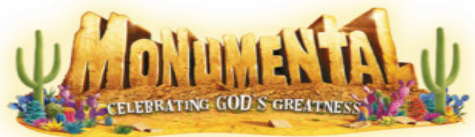

Gospel: (Lk 24:46–53)

The ascension of Jesus is repeated as both the final episode in the Gospel of Luke and the opening scene in the Acts of the Apostles. Why do you think Jesus' ascension was so important to Luke, who authored Acts? ©LPi

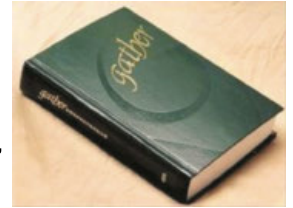

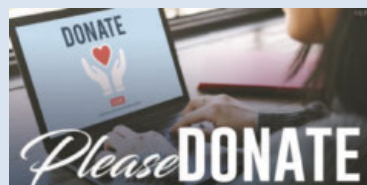
