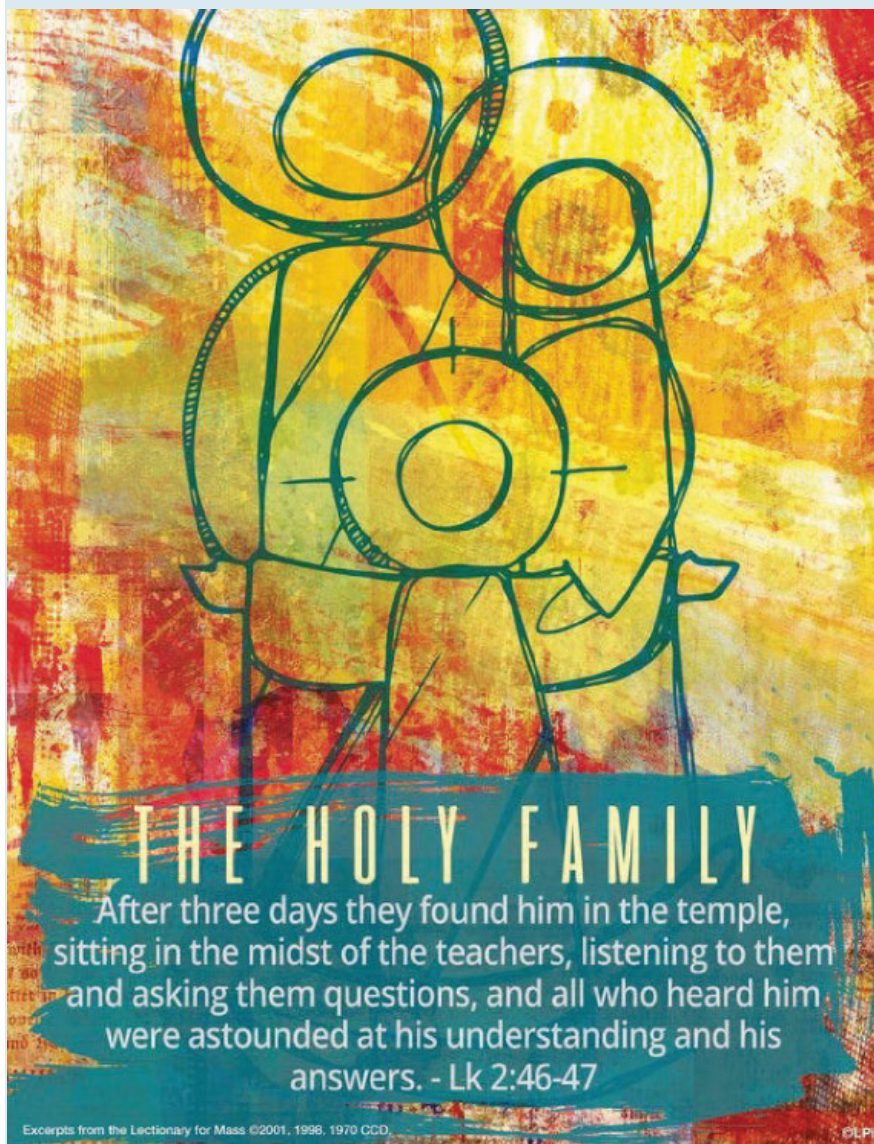

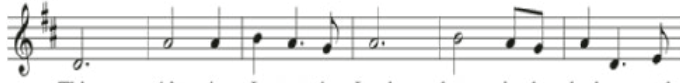

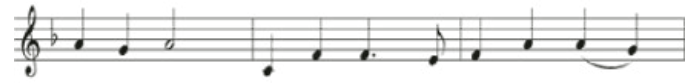

Dear Parishioners

Today's feast of the Holy Family, like Christmas, can be a bittersweet day. On one hand we have the joy of Christ's birth reflected at the stable and in family life. We also know families experience hardships, tensions, estrangement, divorce, the death of a spouse or a child. It is important we remember people don't experience unbridled joy.

When I lived at St. Alphonsus in Chicago there was a young family in the parish and their daughter attended the school. She was lively and enjoyed being playful. She was an altar server and needed a reminder not to chat with her companions during Mass. What I remember best is how she loved being a child of God and her name was Josie.

Josie died tragically after being hit by a car while riding her bike. Her mom and dad suffered so much and mourned the loss of their child. For years, the pain was as real as that horrible day. Her mom signed Josie's name to cards and reminded me that I have a little angel looking after me.

Her parents raised Josie as a good kid, and nurtured good qualities like what St. Paul's writes: mercy, kindness, humility, meekness, patience, love, thankfulness. Josie was learning all those qualities, some she handled better than others, but she was kind and loving.

I think of her and her mom and dad on Holy Family Sunday because these days are bittersweet; they miss Josie, and they experience care and love from friends. Thirty years later I have a friendship with them; they share their struggles and I share mine. They still sign cards with Josie's name.

We are a parish community, and we show care and love for others. Maybe there is a family you know that has experienced trauma and find this season difficult; please give them a call, write a card, or bake cookies and let them know you are standing by to help, to listen and to love them.

La fiesta de la Sagrada Familia de hoy, como la Navidad, puede ser un día agrídulce. Por un lado tenemos la alegría del nacimiento de Cristo reflejada en el establo y en la vida familiar. También sabemos que las familias experimentan dificultades, tensiones, distanciamiento, divorcio, la muerte de un cónyuge o un hijo. Es importante recordar que las personas no experimentan una alegría desenfrenada.

Cuando vivía en St. Alphonsus en Chicago, había una familia joven en la parroquia y su hija asistía a la escuela. Ella estaba llena de vida y disfrutaba siendo juguetona. Ella era monaguilla y necesitaba un recordatorio para no charlar con sus compañeros durante la misa. Lo que mejor recuerdo es cómo le encantaba ser una hija de Dios y su nombre era Josie.

Josie falleció trágicamente después de ser atropellada por un carro mientras andaba en bicicleta. Su mamá y su papá sufrieron mucho y lamentaron mucho la pérdida de su hija. Durante años, el dolor fue tan real como ese día horrible. Su mamá escribió el nombre de Josie en las tarjetas y me recordó que tengo un angelito cuidándome.

Sus papás criaron a Josie como una buena niña y cultivaron buenas cualidades como lo que escribe St. Paul: misericordia, bondad, humildad, mansedumbre, paciencia, amor, agradecimiento. Josie estaba aprendiendo todas esas cualidades, algunas las manejaba mejor que otras, pero era amable y cariñosa.

Pienso en ella, su mamá y su papá el Domingo de la Sagrada Familia porque estos días son agrídulces; extrañan a Josie pero tienen el cariño y el amor de sus amistades. Treinta años después tengo una amistad con ellos; ellos comparten sus luchas y yo las mías. Todavía firman tarjetas con el nombre de Josie.

Somos una comunidad parroquial y demostramos cariño y amor por los demás. Quizás hay una familia que usted conoce que ha pasado por un trauma y encuentra esta temporada difícil; por favor, llámales, escríbeles una tarjeta o hornee galletas y hágales saber que están para ayudarlos, escucharlos y amarlos.

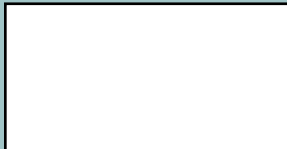
