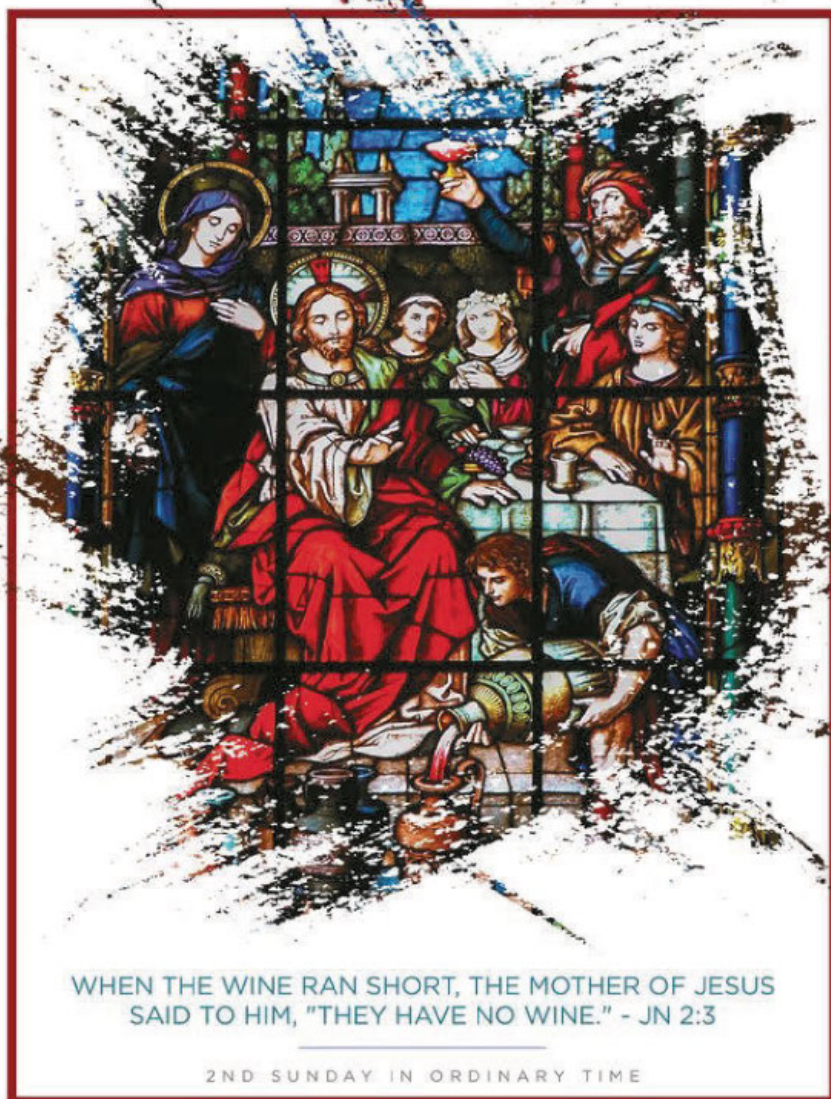

Dear Parishioners,

Throughout the Old Testament, the theme of wedding is used to symbolize the marriage of God and his people as well as the good cheer that occurs when human beings come together in love. So, it is no accident that in the context of John’s Gospel, Jesus’ first public sign takes place at a wedding feast, for Jesus himself is the marriage of divinity and humanity.

In the course of the wedding celebration attended by Jesus, who is the fulfillment of Israelites’ religion and institutions, and his mother, Mary, the new Eve and the greatest woman ever, the wine ran out. In those days and in that culture, a marriage feast will last for seven days. Sadly for this couple, their wine ran out and they were about to face a public humiliation and embarrassment if word came out that there is no more wine. Noticing the difficulty, the Blessed Mother Mary says to Jesus, “They have no wine.” In those words, Mary is ancient Israel speaking to its God, reminding him that the people have run out of joy, purpose, and connection to one another, that they have become dry bones with no life. She is taking up the lament of so many of the Hebrew prophets and sages who cried, “How long, O Lord?”

Friends, is your life dry and dreary? Has your marriage lost its spark? Have you lost the joy of living? Start praying to Jesus through the Blessed Mother and say, “The wine of my life, my marriage, my family etc. is running out. Please, I need a refill.” Pray this prayer regularly and watch as Jesus fills you with the best wine. As today’s Gospel shows us, Jesus does not just restore the lost situation; he makes it better than it ever was.

Estimados feligreses

A lo largo del Antiguo Testamento, el tema de la boda se usa para simbolizar el matrimonio de Dios y su pueblo, así como el buen ánimo que se produce cuando los seres humanos se unen en amor. Entonces, no es casualidad que en el contexto del Evangelio de Juan, la primera señal y prodigio público de Jesús tenga lugar en una fiesta de bodas, porque Jesús mismo es el matrimonio de la divinidad y la humanidad.

En el transcurso de la celebración de la boda a la que asistieron Jesús, quien es el cumplimiento de la religión y las instituciones de los israelitas, y su madre, María, la nueva Eva y la mujer más grande que haya existido, se acabó el vino. En esos días y en esa cultura, una fiesta de matrimonio duraría siete días. Lamentablemente para esta pareja, se les acabó el vino y estaban a punto de enfrentar una humillación pública y vergüenza si se supiera que no hay más vino. Al darse cuenta de la dificultad, la Santísima Madre María le dice a Jesús: "No tienen vino". En esas palabras, María es el antiguo Israel hablándole a su Dios, recordando que la gente se ha quedado sin alegría, propósito y conexión entre sí, que se han convertido en huesos secos sin vida. Ella está retomando el lamento de muchos de los profetas y sabios hebreos que clamaron: "¿Hasta cuándo, oh Señor?"

Amigos, ¿su vida es seca y triste? ¿Tu matrimonio ha perdido su chispa? ¿Has perdido la alegría de vivir? Comienza a orar a Jesús a través de la Santísima Madre y di: "El vino de mi vida, mi matrimonio, mi familia, etc. se está acabando. Por favor, necesito una recarga." Reza esta oración regularmente y observa como Jesús te llena con el mejor vino. Como nos muestra el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús no se limita a restaurar la situación perdida; lo hace mejor que nunca.
