FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Merry and Blessed Christmas, everyone! The joy of the news that Christ is born into the world echoes in our ears and our hearts. God has fulfilled His promise that He would send a Savior into the world to redeem us from our sins and make us His children. Jesus is born from the Virgin Mary and God the Father. This great mystery is the Incarnation, where divine nature is united with human nature in the one person of Jesus. This same Jesus is alive today and with us in faith. But perhaps before we enter too much into the doctrines and theology of who Jesus is as both God and human, we should just take time to admire God's simple plan to send His only-begotten Son into the world as an innocent and helpless baby. Jesus is completely dependent upon His mother, Mary, and earthly father, Joseph. We can imagine that He grew throughout His childhood as a good boy who assimilated easily and well the teachings of God through the Jewish faith and the virtuous life of an excellent human being. Thus, the Gospel reading for today, which tells of an event of Jesus' life when He was 12 years old, reveals that Jesus knows something of His relationship to God the Father. But this event also relates to us that Jesus needed to still grow in maturity and grace. Jesus was obedient to Joseph and Mary in their simple home in Nazareth. And Mary pondered all these things in her heart.

This first Sunday after Christmas is the Feast of the Holy Family. This celebration recognizes the goodness of family life when lived out in God's love and according to His law of love. St. Joseph, St. Mary, and Jesus formed the Holy Family and give an example of family life. A husband and wife live in mutual love and children are the fruit of that love. Our Catholic Christian doctrine tells us that Joseph and Mary were legally and ritually married in the Jewish faith, but they did not share the intimate love which is normally proper between a husband and wife. So God provided Mary with a husband to take care of her and the divine child she would bring into the world. So we look at the holiness of their life and the unity of their hearts to show us an example of what is God's Will for all families. And if God's plan is that families would live in a way so that each member grow in holiness, then the enemy, who is the Devil, will want to destroy the family. And he has influenced the culture and the media so that many families are suffering from division and hatred. We must remember that with God, all things are possible. So, if a family is united in faith, hope, and love, then they should live so as to grow in these virtues. If a family is divided, then there should be an attempt at reconciliation and establishing peace anew. If this is not possible with everyone, at least strive for this with a few members of the family who still have faith in Jesus and His Church. May God give us wisdom and strength for the journey. Amen.

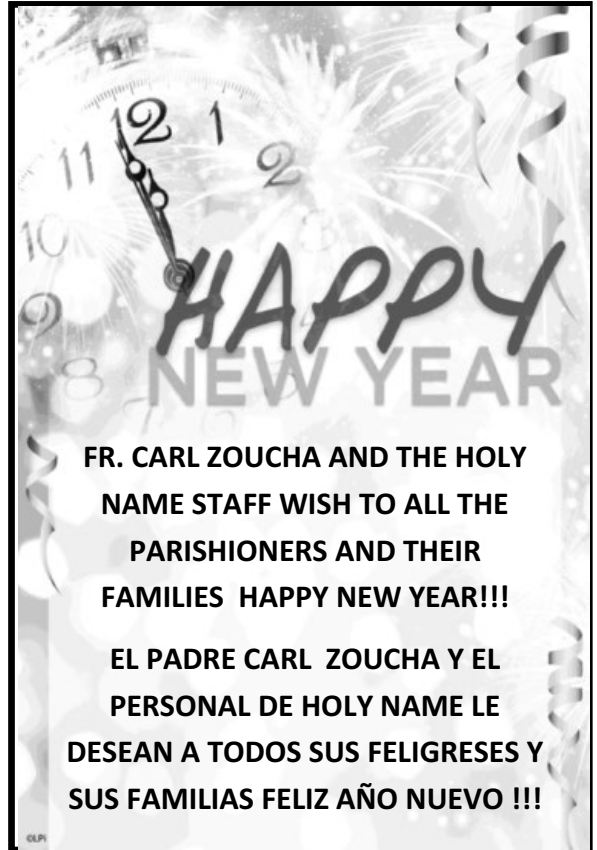


FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

May we deepen our faith, shine forth our hope, and practice our godly love.

I am so very grateful to God for sending me to Holy Name to serve you as your pastor. I am so edified by your lives of faith, hope, and love. DESDE EL ESCRITORIO DEL PASTOR



¡Feliz y bendita Navidad a todos! El gozo de la noticia del nacimiento de Cristo en el mundo resuena en nuestros oídos y en nuestro corazón. Dios ha cumplido Su promesa de que enviaría un Salvador al mundo para redimirnos de nuestros pecados y convertirnos en Sus hijos. Jesús nace de la Virgen María y Dios Padre. Este gran misterio es la Encarnación, donde la naturaleza divina se une a la naturaleza humana en la única persona de Jesús. Este mismo Jesús está vivo hoy y con nosotros en la fe. Pero quizás antes de entrar demasiado en las doctrinas y la teología de quién es Jesús como Dios y como humano, deberíamos tomarnos un tiempo para admirar el simple plan de Dios de enviar a su Hijo unigénito al mundo como un bebé inocente e indefenso. Jesús depende completamente de Su madre, María, y de su padre terrenal, José. Podemos imaginar que creció a lo largo de Su infancia como un buen niño que asimiló fácil y bien las enseñanzas de Dios a través de la fe judía y la vida virtuosa de un excelente ser humano. Así, la lectura del Evangelio de hoy, que narra un acontecimiento de la vida de Jesús cuando tenía 12 años, revela que Jesús sabe algo de su relación con Dios Padre. Pero este evento también nos relata que Jesús necesitaba crecer todavía en madurez y gracia. Jesús fue obediente a José y María en su sencillo hogar en Nazaret. Y María meditaba todas estas cosas en su corazón.

Este primer domingo después de Navidad es la Fiesta de la Sagrada Familia. Esta celebración reconoce la bondad de la vida familiar cuando se vive en el amor de Dios y de acuerdo con su ley de amor. San José, Santa María y Jesús formaron la Sagrada Familia y dan ejemplo de vida familiar. Un esposo y una esposa viven en amor mutuo y los hijos son el fruto de ese amor. Nuestra doctrina cristiana católica nos dice que José y María estaban casados legal y ritualmente en la fe judía, pero no compartían el amor íntimo que normalmente es apropiado entre un esposo y una esposa. Entonces Dios le dio a María un esposo para que la cuidara y al niño divino que ella traería al mundo. Entonces miramos la santidad de su vida y la unidad de sus corazones para mostrarnos un ejemplo de lo que es la Voluntad de Dios para todas las familias. Y si el plan de Dios es que las familias vivan de manera que cada miembro crezca en santidad, entonces el enemigo, que es el Diablo, querrá destruir a la familia. Y ha influido en la cultura y los medios de comunicación para que muchas familias estén sufriendo división y odio. Debemos recordar que con Dios, todo es posible. Entonces, si una familia está unida en la fe, la esperanza y el amor, entonces debe vivir para crecer en estas virtudes. Si una familia está dividida, entonces debe intentarse la reconciliación y restablecer la paz. Si esto no es posible con todos, al menos esfuércese por lograrlo con algunos miembros de la familia que todavía tienen fe en Jesús y Su Iglesia. Que Dios nos dé sabiduría y fuerza para el camino. Amén.
