MISSION STATEMENT

"We, the community of St. Gregory Barbarigo, are called forth in Baptism to follow the mission of Jesus to teach, to love, and to serve."

Beginning on the 17th of December, the Magnificat Antiphon at Vespers presents a different title for Christ each day until Christmas Eve. These titles correspond to the verses of the song, "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel," translated from the Latin, "Veni, Veni Emmanuel." The titles are: Dec. 17: O Wisdom; 18: O Sacred Lord; 19: O Flower of Jesse's Stem; 20: O Key of David; 21: O Radiant Dawn; 22: O King of All Nations; 23: O Emmanuel. These antiphons are sung with solemnity at Conception Abbey at Vespers on each of the days. It is a way liturgically to heighten expectation of the arrival of Christ at Christmas.

On the lighter side, the following was sent to me by a friend upon hearing about how I fell and broke my ankle. It is part of the content of a course taught at the U. of Oklahoma on Myth and Folklore entitled, "Aesop's Fable 40. Thales and the Old Woman." I thought you might be able to appreciate the humor.

Thales was the first Greek philosopher, and he is counted as one of the "Seven Sages" of ancient Greece. He was also famous as a mathematician and as an astronomer. He spent a lot of time watching the sun and the moon and the stars, trying to understand the laws that governed their movements. He often left the city around sunset in order to get the best possible view of the sky at night.

One evening as Thales was walking along and gazing intently up at the sky, he did not see a big rock in the road just in front of him. He stumbled over the rock and hit the ground hard. As he slowly and painfully got back up, he heard the sound of someone laughing. He looked around and saw an old woman who had also been walking along the road behind him. "O great sage," she shouted, "while you are looking up at the sky, you should also keep an eye on the ground in front of you!"

The moral of the story is that you need to be aware of your surroundings at all times. If Thales lived in the modern world, we might also have to remind him not to text while driving!

By the way, last Monday I went to see if my fracture had healed well enough to take off the boot, or if the boot has to stay on a while longer. You will know how things went by whether I am wearing my boot or not. Just one of the things for which I am longing and waiting in this Advent!

May we open our hearts to God's grace this Advent!

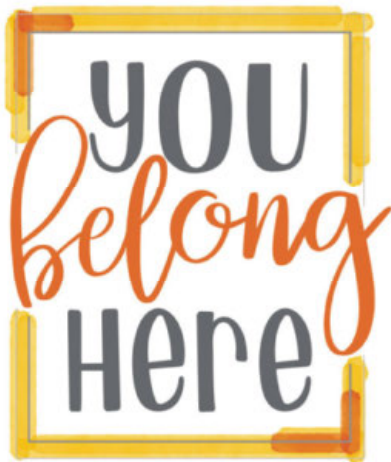

Weekend Mass Attendance: 531

I just finished watching a great series on Formed, "Evangelization with Chris Stefanick". If you are concerned about the state of the Catholic Church and how to carry out its mission, I highly recommend watching this series. One of the topics Chris covers is why people leave the church. Being a cradle Catholic who left for many years, this topic struck a chord with me.

While we all have unique circumstances, I believe the fundamental reason that many of us left is because we didn't understand the real reason we were here in the first place. So many of us were born into the Catholic faith but weren't sufficiently catechized to understand the beauty and purpose of the faith. Growing up I did not feel I had a personal relationship with God, I didn't understand the real presence of Jesus on the Altar, or of the Holy Spirit in the sacraments. What I did understand was that I was expected to follow the rules.

In a homily at the beginning of Advent, Father Albert mentioned the term legalism, which is "boiling down our relationship with God to how we act, a set of rules. But this is not the Gospel". As a young adult that is what I thought the church was about, rules. As soon as I could make my own choices, I stopped practicing my faith. When I left I felt I was being a rebel, a free thinker, and countercultural. What I have discovered since is that I was actually part of a rapidly growing statistic of young people leaving the church. I was going with the flow of our increasingly secular society.



Coming back to the church is actually counter-cultural these days...hey, I'm finally a rebel. Winning people back is a popular topic and there are many resources available. Chris Stefanick talks about this too, how to evangelize effectively. Some of what he said is spot on for what worked for me. What started me on my path back was encountering people that love this church and practice their faith with joy. That is how I knew I had missed something, a lot, and that I should take another look. Through Catechesis of the Good Shepherd formation and many other resources, I started filling in the gaps in my catechism and cultivated my personal relationship with God.

Putting relationship and connection first changed my perspective of the rules, the rules did not change. Instead of following rules in order to get to heaven, now I see loving and being loved fuels my desire to live an integrated life. So, based on what I have learned from research and experienced for myself, if you want to help people back to faith, my advice is to first examine your own. Your message needs to be about how much they are loved, worthy of redemption, and belong here. You cannot authentically deliver that message until you believe it for yourself.

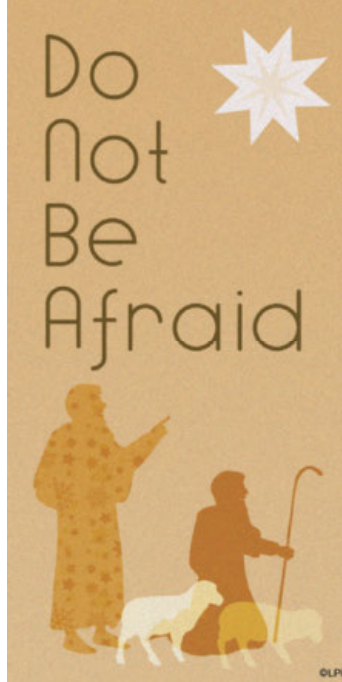
