Here is an update from Dave Stout, sexton of Sacred Heart Cemetery.

Hello Folks, Not often do we hear of good news coming from a cemetery. However, I am going to share some with you now. Let me get to it.



To begin with, the family plot locator in the kiosk has been updated (pictured at left). This update is current as of September. Along with the locator, there is a map of our cemetery. The map is orientated with the layout of the cemetery. In order to provide you with a reference point, the kiosk is marked on the map. Another reference may be that one is buried with their feet facing to the east. These two points may be helpful in locating the address of the person that you are looking for.

Next, in order to maintain some uniformity, appearance, and safety at our cemetery, "Cemetery Regulation" structures have been erected at the entrance. The signs are lettered in both Spanish and English (pictured below). After some discussion with Fr. Farrar and Lois Symmonds, we thought it best to add these placards so that the regulations are readily viewed. After all, we can't expect someone to follow the rules if they don't know what the rules are. Now, we are all of the same mind. Still, I try to be as lenient as I can about grave decorations but **please no glass**. I walk the cemetery four times a year as well as after storms removing only unsightly or dangerous items (glass, wire, etc.) or decorations that have seen their better days. After each cemetery sweep I average a haul off of about ten (10) 55-gallon barrels of tattered decorations, packed tight. More barrels have been procured, new barrel holders installed, and a fence has been raised and attached to the cemetery shed behind Babyland for the sake of appearance.



I would really like to improve Babyland a bit. I enjoy doing the cemetery work. The peacefulness and tranquility are very real. However, to travel to and fro from the cemetery shed I pass through Babyland. It is here that I pass through disappointment. Not only for the fact that these wee babes must be buried here, but also the sad state of this little parcel of land. It would be my great desire to landscape Babyland into the appearance that it deserves. I would truly enjoy some input on this endeavor. If you have ideas or considerations, please feel free to e-mail me at dstout1927@gmail.com. I will happily discuss all thoughts. I wouldn't think anything lavish or expensive would be necessary--just a simple layout that distinguishes Babyland and hides the cemetery shed. I seriously would really appreciate as much feedback on this as possible. With your suggestions, and after dotting the I's and crossing the T's, I would like to deliver a plan and bid to Fr. Farrar in the near future. With our thoughts, and his inspiration, I am sure that we can make this happen.

I have been in attendance to a fair amount of funerals in our cemetery. Some are peaceful and some not so much, due to the noise of the dryer blowers at Hill's Pet Nutrition. After a discussion with the powers that be at Hill's, they most graciously offered to shut the dryers down for our funerals. I simply call a number at Hill's advising them of the time and date. I have added contacting Hill's to my pre-funeral protocol. They do the rest. There is also discussion of planting noise barrier foliage on the berm separating the cemetery and Hill's. I was both impressed and pleased at the level of ease that I met in the discussion on this matter. Thank you to our neighbors at Hill's Pet Nutrition.

Thank you for taking the time to read my little article. I absolutely look forward to thoughts from any and all parishioners on matters of the cemetery. **May every step you take be a step in the right direction.**

Broccoli Cheese Soup

| 2 Tbsp. oleo | 2 (6 oz.) pkg. |
| 3/4 c. chopped onion | frozen chopped |
| 6 c. water | broccoli florets |
| 6 chicken | 1/8 tsp. garlic |
| bouillon cubes | powder |
| 12 oz. pkg. | 6 c. milk |
| fine or medium | 1 lb. Velveeta |
| egg noodles | cheese |
| 1 tsp. salt | Pepper to taste |

Heat oleo in large pot. Add onions & sauté over medium heat for 3 minutes. Add water and bouillon cubes. Heat to boiling. Add noodles and salt so bouillon mixture continues to boil, uncovered, for 3 minutes. Stir in broccoli and garlic powder and cook 4 minutes more, stirring occasionally. Add milk, cheese, and pepper. Cook until cheese melts. Can be frozen.

Reheat in double boiler if frozen.

Lasagna Soup

- 1 lb. ground beef
- 1/4 tsp. each: garlic powder, onion powder, Italian seasoning
- 1 14 oz. can diced tomatoes
- 1 14 oz. can beef broth
- 1 1/2 cups uncooked corkscrew macaroni
- 1/4 c. parmesan cheese

Brown ground beef & drain off excess grease. Add seasonings, tomatoes and broth. Simmer. Add pasta & cook per package directions. Ladle in bowls and sprinkle with cheese on top. I like to serve this with crusty garlic bread.

Q: What's the difference between priests and brothers, friars, etc.?

A: The distinctions titles and categories used for priests and the male members of religious communities can be confusing, especially since the categories can sometimes be intertwined as a man can be both a priest and a monk, or a brother and a friar. So, to help to piece the puzzle together, it's important to begin by noting some basic distinctions: The distinction between priests (who are ordained for sacramental ministry) and brothers (who are non-ordained members of religious communities and who are committed to lives of prayer and service).

Priests: A priest is a man who has been ordained for sacramental ministry and these fall into two categories: A) Diocesan (or Secular) Priests can either be attached to a diocese and who serve under a bishop. Their ministry is usually oriented toward pastoral service. B) Religious Priests are members of religious communities (like the Franciscans, Jesuits, Salvatorians, or Carmelites) and their lives are guided by the special mission and charism of their community. While both kinds of priest practice sacramental ministry, their spirituality and how they live out their priesthood can be very different.

Brothers: Brothers are non-ordained members of religious communities (such as those mentioned above) who live lives committed to prayer and service. Religious priests and brothers serve together in their communities and their ministries include much more than the care of parishes.

Monks, Friars, and Canons: These are broad categories that include religious priests and brothers, and each of these is connected to specific ways of life and spiritualities. ©LPI








