


ADORATION of the BLESSED SACRAMENT

Q: What is holy water and how do I explain the reason that it is placed at the entrances of churches to my non-Catholic friends?

A: Holy water is a sacramental, a reminder of the life of the Church expressed and celebrated through the sacraments. God's grace is mediated through word and gesture (the outward signs). This comes to us through Jesus (instituted by Christ) as he entrusts to the Church his saving mission (to give grace). In turn the Church, through the sacraments, shares that grace and mission with us.

On Ash Wednesday, we receive ashes on our foreheads to remind us of our origins, humbly created from the dust. But by blessing ourselves with holy water, we are reminded of our destiny! We are baptized sons and daughters of God. This is also a call to conversion, to live more fully our baptismal call to live as disciples of Jesus. We see holy water whenever we renew our baptismal promises. This will occur during the Easter liturgy as well, reminding us that we are indeed on a journey of faith and renewed in Christ. Blessing ourselves with holy water reminds us that we are baptized into a community faith, and always in need of turning from sin and toward God. Holy water is a visible sign of our baptism! ©LPI

LIVE THE LITURGY ~ INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK ~

Shout for joy! When was the last time you ever felt like doing that? Fear, uncertainty, pressure, negativity, disappointment, and myriad other human experiences can rob us of joy. We can never predict what life will bring. As unsettling as that can often seem, life's unpredictability is also the very thing that allows it to be exciting and adventuresome! We know that life can be difficult, and it is unrealistic to expect it to be otherwise. God never promised an easy road. But, when a person truly falls in love with God and discovers the peacefulness and assurance of God's presence, then a depth of understanding will be brought to everything they do and experience. Nothing will be able to rob them of joy! When we realize that God, the King of Israel, is in our midst and with us, there is no further misfortune to fear. We celebrate the beauty and wonder of God's gift of joy today as we ready ourselves, even more excitedly, for the coming of our Savior. Do not fear and do not be discouraged. There is a power and presence within us, our God, who has made us, who loves us and who will keep us. What more do we need? Rejoice! ©LPI



The depiction of Jesus' birth in the nativity is a joyful proclamation of the incarnation. Drawn by God, the Nativity can help us set out on a spiritual journey. God's love was so great that he became one of us so that we in turn might become one with him. I encourage you to reflect on the Nativity during advent and specifically, right before you open gifts at Christmas. Let's remember, Jesus is the reason for the season! Share the story of the Nativity and grow in your faith this Christmas season.

To Jesus through Mary

- As Catholics, we have a devotion to Mary. We don't worship her, but we do hold her in high regard. After all, in the year 431 she was given the title Theotokos, the "God bearer", the "Mother of God". It was at this time, the Church formally proclaimed Jesus is True God and True Man, thus **Mary is the mother of God, the Theotokos.**
- Scripture also informs us why we should have such regard to Mary. Every Catholic should be ready to explain our devotion to Mary. First, take note of the Gospel of Luke where the angel of God "came to her and said, **Hail, full of Grace, the Lord is with you**" (Lk 1:28 rsv). Mary was troubled at this greeting, and the Angel said, "Do not be afraid Mary, for you have found **favor with God**. And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus." (Lk. 1:30-31).
- Mary gives us our first lesson of understanding that nothing is impossible with God. **She says yes to God** when she states, "**Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord; let it be to me according to your Word (LK 1:37-38)**. **Mary says yes to God!** So should we! How can we say yes to Jesus today?
- The next reason from Scripture to hold great regard to Mary is twofold. When Elizabeth hears the greeting of Mary, **the baby in Elizabeth's womb leaps for joy**. My favorite scripture reference indicating we should give great devotion to Mary is, "**Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit and she exclaimed with a loud cry, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb"**" (Lk 1:41-43) This is fascinating! Elizabeth was **filled with the spirit of God and says** Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. The part I'm fascinated about is not so much the first part of the Hail Mary prayer. Yes, that is important! I'm fascinated by the fact that she was filled with the Holy Spirit and then made that proclamation about Mary and Jesus. Please keep this in mind every time you pray a Hail Mary or pray the Rosary. May we be filled with God's Spirit as we reflect on the Nativity this Advent and Christmas season.
- The last reason to show devotion to Mary occurs at the wedding of Cana. Mary was invited to the wedding and Jesus and His Disciples tagged along. The wine failed. Jesus and Mary had a brief conversation. **Mary in her obedience to faith, told the servants to "Do whatever he tells you"** (Jn 2:1-6) What an example from Mary. She calls us to do whatever Jesus calls us to do! Keep this example at the forefront of your minds as we go forward in our journey to Christmas. Prepare for Him by doing whatever He tells you. Increase your time of prayer with Jesus and Follow Him!

Joseph: There is so much to reflect on Joseph. For now, know that he was a righteous man that had great faith and said yes to God. He named Jesus because he saves his people from their sins. (Mt 2:21)

Bethlehem: Hebrew word for "house of bread". It is mentioned several times in the bible, but its major importance is the birthplace of Jesus. In the **Gospel of John, chapter 6**, Jesus proclaims many times that **He is the bread sent down from heaven**. Jesus is truly present to us in the Eucharist! He is present to us Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. This is a doctrine of our faith. The Eucharist is the source and the summit of the Catholic Faith. How fitting the birthplace of our savior, Bethlehem means house of bread.

Stable: Tradition indicates Jesus was born in a cave. Pay attention to those Christmas cards indicating the Nativity as a cave. When we think of the cave, draw your heart and mind forward to Christ's burial place in the Gospel of Luke. We know Joseph of Arimathea prepared Jesus' body and placed it in a tomb/cave. (LK 23:50-56). Jesus died, was buried, and rose from the dead so that we may have New Life in Him.

Away in the Manger: A manger is actually a feeding trough for cattle (LK 2:7). Jesus Christ is the True Food sent from Heaven (John 6). After His birth, Jesus was picked up off the ground and placed in a feeding trough, a manager. A reminder to us that He is our spiritual nourishment, our Bread of Life sent from Heaven and we are called to eat of His flesh in the Eucharist often as we journey to a life of holiness.

Swaddling Clothes: Mary wrapped Jesus "in swaddling clothes and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn" (LK 2:7). Mary's wrapping Jesus in swaddling clothes, his first clothes, foreshadows his death robe when he was wrapped what is now believed to be the Shroud of Turin. When I present to the RCIA, I remind the inquirers, this was likely Mary's death garment and that she did not need it because she was assumed into Heaven.

The Ox and the Ass: These nativity pieces are some of my favorites. Isaiah 1:3, "An ox knows its owner, and an ass, its master's manger". The ox and the ass knows its master. Typically these pieces are kneeling at our Lord's head in the manger, their breath keeping him warm. On Christmas, around the nativity, before opening presents, share the nativity with those present, the kiddos seem to like the ox and the ass keeping Jesus warm with their breath. Additional Scripture Reflections: Matthew 21:1-1, Zechariah 9:9, and Genesis 22:3. May we always know that Jesus is true man and our True God.

Rooster: One of my prized Christmas cards given to me has a rooster in the Nativity. The rooster represents Peter's threefold denial of Christ. I like how our first pope expressed his Love for Jesus three times as well. See Matthew 26:33-35, 69-75; Mark 14:29-31, 66-72; Luke 22:31-34, 54-62; John 13:36-38, 18:25-27, 21:15-19. May we also proclaim the Word of God like a rooster crows in the morning hours. At Christmas our Savior is born! At Easter, He has Risen!

Lamb: foreshadows Christ's innocence and sacrifice to save mankind. Reflect on the typology- prefiguration -foreshadowing of Christ's Passion in Genesis 22:1-14.


Angels and shepherds: draw our attention to their worship. We should worship our God in a similar manner. We should acknowledge the shepherds obedience of faith regarding the angels message and their instruction to worship him by there example, when they praised God saying, "Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests" (LK 2:9-20) During this advent and Christmas season may we strive to glorify God as the angels did that Holy night. Give additional reflection to the shepherds. How appropriate they search out the true Lamb of God! The shepherds of the nativity watched over the flock. Jesus is the true shepherd, today, our shepherds are the Bishops, our Father Carter assisting, who watch over and guide us as we live our lives as lay faithful members of the Body of Christ.

The North star/our guiding light: Even the cosmos know he is God. "For we have seen his star in the east, and come to worship him." (Mt 2:2)

Magi: Typically, there is one old, one middle aged, and one young magi. Each, recognize him! Throughout the stages of our lives, may we too recognize our God who presents himself to us! "They saw the young child with his mother.. they presented unto him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. (Mt.2:11). Gold is for Christ's royalty, frankincense for His godliness and myrrh is for the sacrifice He will make for mankind.

Jesus is the highest joy and the sweetest gift the heart can know. God the Father sent his Spirit of his son to be with us and into our hearts. (Galatians 4:6) See Jesus in your nativity. In many, he has his arms stretched out. Does this symbolize his salvation for all of us on the cross? Perhaps the baby Jesus wants us to hold him close to our hearts. See Jesus lying in the Manger and know that He is present, Body, Blood, Soul, And Divinity in the Eucharist. This Advent and Christmas season go to Adoration and worship Him in the Blessed Sacrament.
