


We will depart on January 19, after

Sacred Heart of Jesus staff brings you this collaborated *Notes from the desk of* ~ Our funniest or most fun Christmas.

**Darby:** I have many wonderful Christmas memories, but my favorite is easily the year I got a horse. Now, I grew up in the city with a yard that took 20 minutes to mow, so my desire for a horse was always misplaced. However, my brother and sister grew up in western Colorado and had horses and goats and many other animals that made me jealous. So, for Christmas when I was 6, all I wanted was a horse. It was the only thing I was missing to be a real cowboy, since I already had the hat and boots. So, on Christmas day, I rushed down the stairs to find a beautiful saddle sitting on... a sawhorse. It only took me a few moments to get over my disappointment that I wasn't getting a real horse. I quickly named my new 'horse' Bingo and went about sitting on that sawhorse nonstop proclaiming myself a full blown cowboy!

**Joan:** One December, Dan ordered a new set of hubcaps for our van as we had just lost a second one. When the shipment arrived, each hubcap was in its own box, so one of us had the idea to wrap them like gifts. We decided to hide the "presents" until Epiphany and then give them as gifts from the wise men to our then 4 children. When Epiphany rolled around, the kids were really excited by the presents Dan pulled out, as we had never given them gifts on this day before. You should have seen the look on their faces as they began to open them... realizing they all received the same thing and that they were for the van, not really for them. It was funny and cute.

**Lois:** One of our funniest Christmas stories was when Rod & I were novices at cattle ranching. We had a few cows but because we had so few, we would just winter a neighbor's bull and hope for the best. We hadn't had a bull with our cows for about a year.

It was the coldest Christmas Eve night in recent history with a strong north wind and heavy snow. Rod went out early the next morning to check the cows and to see if the water had frozen up overnight. Low and behold, there was a cow with her newborn calf! God created births to amaze us, but we were totally blown away by a cow that could have given birth and cleaned the calf quickly enough so it didn't freeze on that frigid night. But we were most amazed at how that could have happened (on Christmas Eve) without a bull around! Our son-in-law, Clint, summed it up best when he said "Holy Cow!" We learned later that bulls can get through fences any time they want.

**Marcie:** Just like everyone, I have many fond Christmas memories. A fun Christmas memory in recent memory is when my brother and his family were home for Christmas and we set-up a Christmas photo booth. We had lots of Christmas props and the kids had so much fun dressing up and being silly! We played minute-to-win-it games and laughed so hard at each other's inability to carry cotton balls on a plastic spoon or bounce ping-pong balls into a cup. Who knew stacking Solo cups could be such a competitive sport, too?!

**Michael:** My most fun Christmas memory was when my aunt from Michigan came all the way down to Florida and surprised me and my siblings on Christmas Day. We had no earthly idea she was going to be there and then boom, there she was. That was fun. My mother would always wake us up on Christmas morning walking around the house with reindeer bells and singing a Christmas morning song. It was something she never failed to do all growing up and it was such a special thing to wake up to that as a child. I can remember it so vividly.

**Monica:** The funniest Christmas I can remember was the time my husband smoked a turkey for our Barnett Christmas Eve about 25 years ago. 


**Q:** Why do we give gifts at Christmas?

**A:** Great events in and of themselves are not tangible. They occur in life but leave no mark behind, nothing that someone could come across and know that something significant occurred. So we mark the event with monuments, holidays, gold watches or plaques, making a meaningful event tangible and memorable.

Gifts at Christmas do the same thing. They mark the occasion of the birth of Jesus, communicating a bit of the joy of the day by allowing us to be both giver and receiver. Gift-giving sets aside the day as special and different. The special foods, customs, decorations, and gifts all help focus our attention on the importance and meaning of the day and at the same time allow us to share personally in its joy and happiness.

In giving gifts, though, we can share in the meaning of Christmas in a significant way. We imitate God in sharing with others. We give a bit of ourselves to others in the gifts we give, just as God gives us the gift of his Son. No wonder we often say that the best gifts are those that come from the heart. "He so loved us that for our sake He was made man in time, through Whom all times were made; was in the world less in years than His servants, though older than the world itself in His eternity; was made man, Who made man; was created of a mother, whom He created; was carried by hands which He formed; nursed at the breasts which He had filled; cried in the manger in wordless infancy, He the Word without Whom all human eloquence is mute (St. Augustine, Sermon 188)." The miracle of what happens at Christmas is truly an awesome mystery. Revealed in the silent ordinariness of life is God's intimate love for humanity and all that he made. The Word, existing for all time, comes and dwells among us. God kisses us. We can seek and soar with playful delight as a joy never known before fills our heart.

Joy is best expressed through dance. There is just something truly wonderful about the self-abandon a beautiful melodic dance reveals. If we are able to let go and really be free, it celebrates life in a way few other experiences really can. With the birth of Jesus Christ, God takes the Divine Dance to a deeper and more tangible level. We can now not only see what we believe but believe what we see! This most perfect dance is a call to beauty, innocence, truth, purpose, hope, faith, and love. Today we know, beyond doubt, that we are a necessary part of God's beautifully choreographed masterpiece of life and not just a random happening without real intent or purpose. We are loved, treasured, and blessed.

Accepting the truth of God's birth in time we also accept an invitation to dance with God. We can let go of what tethers us to anxious concerns and superficial securities. Throw caution to the wind and go with God. We have been blessed with talents, gifts, and life eternal. Follow the rhythm of the dance with joy and listen to what the Word who became flesh tells us about what the next steps can be.
