From The Desk of The Pastor

Dear Parishioners:

This weekend, we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. This feast signals the end of the Christmas Season and the start of Ordinary Time.

This feast celebrates that the Lord was baptized in the Jordan River by John the Baptist. The Lord did not need to be baptized. That is why John the Baptist was taken aback when the Lord asked for baptism. The Lord sought baptism to show the importance of baptism and to designate ordinary water for religious purposes.

The Lord taught that Baptism is necessary for salvation. "Amen, amen, I say to you, no one can enter the Kingdom of God without being born of water and spirit." *John 3:5*. There are three very important reasons why a person should be baptized:

1. To be given the promise of eternal life.
2. To be freed from original sin.
3. To begin initiation into the Church and membership in the Church.

St. Paul speaks of the importance of the promise of eternal life when he says: "Are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death? We were indeed buried with Him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life." *Romans 6:3-4*

With regards to being freed from original sin, the Catechism of the Catholic Church says this in paragraph 1263: "By baptism all sins are forgiven, original sin and all personal sins, as well as all punishment for sin. In those who have been reborn nothing remains that would impede their entry into the Kingdom of God, neither Adam's sin nor personal sin, nor the consequences of sin, the gravest of which is separation from God."

And as regards to initiation into the Church, the Catechism of the Catholic Church says this in paragraph 1267: "Baptism makes us members of the Body of Christ: "Therefore ... we are members of one another." *Ephesians 4:25*. Baptism incorporates us into the Church."

As we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, it causes us to reflect upon the importance of our baptism for our life with God and with our relationship with His Church! May we always appreciate our baptism and live our baptismal promises.

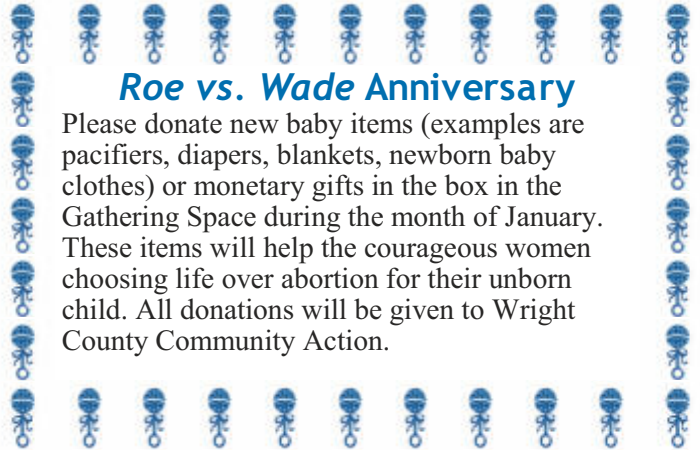

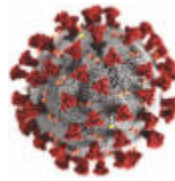

COVID-19 Exposure



If you had close contact with a person with COVID-19 (an exposure), you need to stay home and away from others (quarantine). COVID-19 can take up to 14 days to make you sick, and some people with COVID-19 never feel sick, so you need to separate yourself from others so you don’t spread the virus without knowing it.

The safest option is to stay home and away from others for 14 days. In certain situations, you may end your quarantine after 10 days, or after seven days with a negative COVID-19 test result.

You cannot end your quarantine before seven days for any reason.

In general, a close contact means being less than 6 feet from someone for 15 minutes or more throughout a 24-hour period. However, even shorter periods of time or longer distances can result in spread of the virus. The longer someone is close to the person who has COVID-19, and the closer they are, the greater the chance the virus can spread.
