From The Desk of The Pastor

Dear Parishioners:

This weekend we go into Ordinary Time. Monday, January 11 was the beginning of the 1st week of Ordinary Time. That is why this weekend is the 2nd Sunday of Ordinary Time. We will stay in Ordinary Time until Ash Wednesday (February 17) and the beginning of Lent. We will resume Ordinary Time after the Easter Season is completed. Then we will remain in Ordinary Time until the First Sunday of Advent (November 28). Remember the Church marks time from the 1st Sunday of Advent to the Feast of Christ the King.

Ordinary Time is the time outside of the Advent/Christmas Seasons and the Lent/Easter Seasons. They are the major seasons of the Liturgical Calendar.

The color of the mass vestments for Ordinary Time is green. The color green reminds us of life! The grass of the lawns and fields are green. The color of the mass vestment reminds us that during Ordinary Time we should still be growing in faith and in love for God and neighbor. Let us ask God to strengthen our faith and to deepen our love! And, just like we ask God to bless our journey through the seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter; let us ask God to bless our journey through Ordinary Time! And let us remember that as we journey through Ordinary Time and all the seasons of the Liturgical Calendar, we journey to the Kingdom of Heaven!




Practicing Catholic Show Debuts

COVID-19 Exposure

If you had close contact with a person with COVID-19 (an exposure), you need to stay home and away from others (quarantine). COVID-19 can take up to 14 days to make you sick, and some people with COVID-19 never feel sick, so you need to separate yourself from others so you don't spread the virus without knowing it.

The safest option is to stay home and away from others for 14 days. In certain situations, you may end your quarantine after 10 days, or after seven days with a negative COVID-19 test result.

You cannot end your quarantine before seven days for any reason.

In general, a close contact means being less than 6 feet from someone for 15 minutes or more throughout a 24-hour period. However, even shorter periods of time or longer distances can result in spread of the virus. The longer someone is close to the person who has COVID-19, and the closer they are, the greater the chance the virus can spread.
